3. How is Solomon’s view of his life similar to how you may view your life at times?

Read [John 3:16-18](#), [1 John 3:1](#), and [Psalms 139:13-16](#)

4. Many people use these verses as a foundation for their faith. What do these verses communicate about how we should view our lives?
5. Why do we struggle with what these verses tell us about God’s love for us?

Read [Proverbs 3:5-8](#)

6. When are you most likely to struggle with the truth that God loves you?
7. Do you have examples from your own life when you trusted God when you weren’t sure of the outcome?

Overall (Discovery Bible Study)

- What do these scriptures say about God?
- What do they say about people?
- How will I apply this to my life?
