1. What does it mean to be “joined with” or “baptized into” Christ Jesus? What is Paul emphasizing by using words like “with” and “into”?
2. What promises of hope does Paul offer in these verses to those who are joined with Christ Jesus? What hope does being united with Christ give you?

Read [Romans 6:6-7](#) and [Ephesians 4:22-24](#)

3. What do these verses say about our sinful desires? How easy is it for you to give up aspects of your old self to take hold of a new self? What helps or hinders you?
4. Why is being “crucified with Christ” required for people to become truly righteous and holy before God? Why is it important for people to accept this truth?

Read [Romans 12:1-2](#)

5. What does it mean to offer your bodies as living sacrifices? Why does Paul refer to this as an act of “worship”? How does this compare with what people often consider as worship?
6. What does Romans 12:2 say is the result of offering our bodies as living sacrifices? How have you experienced life change after making a personal sacrifice?

- How will I apply this to my life?
