Notes

God is a creator, and science works to understand His creation. The Bible is not a science book, but it is the book of truth. As we consider science with a theological perspective, we will have a greater reverence for Him. As we look at creation, science exposes God's fingerprints. Creation speaks to who God is, but He gives you the free will to choose—chaos versus order, creation versus destruction. Creation testifies. Science reveals. But only faith in Jesus saves.
