### Look Back:

### Look Up:

#### Read [Psalm 71:1-6](#)

1. What do these verses tell you about the author's story? How easy is it for you to relate to what he experienced?
2. What do these verses tell you about God and the relationship between the author and God? What impact did the author's past experiences with God have on how he viewed God?
3. What role has God played in your life? Who have you shared this with?

#### Read [Psalm 71:7-13](#)

4. What impact do you think the author's story had on others?
5. Why do you think the author focuses on his enemies? How does this relate to people today?

#### Read [Psalm 71:14-18](#)

6. How does the author conclude this chapter of his story? What is he primarily focused on in these verses?
7. How easy is it for you to always have hope and praise God more and more? Do you know anyone who is able to do this - what impact does this have on the people around him or her?
8. Have you ever considered that your story will impact future generations? What changes can you make to maximize your impact on people today and in the future?

- What do these scriptures say about God?
