### Look Back:

### Look Up:

1. What is your initial reaction to these verses? Why do you think you feel this way?
2. What do these verses say about God? Why do you think Jesus uses strong language?
3. What warning does Jesus give? Who do you think He is warning and why?

#### Read [Matthew 7:24-26](#)

4. What 2 things does Jesus say that wise people do? How does this compare to how the world typically describes “wise” people?
5. How does Jesus say that the actions of foolish people are different from wise people? Why do you think people choose to act this way?

#### Read [Ephesians 5:21](#) and [Matthew 5:43-45](#)

6. What do these verses have in common? What do you think is the relationship between “submitting to” and “loving” others?
7. What does Matthew 5:45 say is the result of loving others? How does this relate to Jesus’ teaching about wise living in Matthew 7:24-25?

### Overall (Discovery Bible Study)

- What do these scriptures say about God?
- What do they say about people?
- How will I apply this to my life?

### Look Ahead:

In what ways is your “foundation” like solid rock or more like shifting sand? What will you do this week to build a solid foundation by listening to Jesus’ teaching and obediently following it?

### Notes

Wise living is about the firm foundation of Jesus’ teaching. We should not think about Christianity as a transactional relationship. Consider what Jesus did for us. He actually died as a man and purchased our salvation with his life. If this was purely an act that required a return from us, then what would He require from you? The truth is that He did this because of His sacrificial love and because He wants a connection with us for all eternity. The wisdom He provides is the foundation in this life that will last beyond all of the storms we face.
