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DISCUSS & DISCOVER

Our lesson was all about compassion, which means noticing when someone is hurting, caring about them, and taking action to help! We started our lesson by watching a clip from Big Hero 6 where Baymax notices Hiro is hurting and goes out of his way to comfort and help him instead of ignoring him. We connected this to the famous Bible story of The Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37). We talked about how several people walked right past a hurt man on the road, but a Samaritan stopped to help, even though they were from different groups who didn't usually get along.

1. In the movie clip, Baymax noticed Hiro was sad and did everything he could to comfort him. Who is someone in your life (at school, church, or in our neighborhood) who might be feeling a little sad, lonely, or left out right now? How can you tell?
2. The first two men in Jesus' story saw the hurt man but walked right past him. Why do you think it's sometimes hard or scary to stop and help someone who is having a tough time? What gives us the courage to be like the Samaritan instead?
3. We put bandages on a paper heart today to show how kindness helps people heal. What is one specific thing we can say or do this week to put a "bandage" on someone's hurting heart? (Parents: Share a time someone showed you unexpected compassion!)

Pray: Dear God, Thank you for showing us the ultimate compassion by sending Jesus to love and care for us. Help our eyes to be like Baymax's and the Samaritan's this week always noticing when someone around us is hurting, lonely, or left out. Give us kind hearts and helpful hands so we can share Your love and help heal hearts wherever we go. Amen.
