CAPABILITY SHIFT

OpenAI began rolling out GPT-5.5 in ChatGPT on 23 April 2026. It is described as understanding complex goals, using tools, checking its work, and carrying more tasks through to completion. GPT-5.5 is stronger at turning multi-step requests into finished work, including research, data analysis, document creation, coding, and moving across tools. Availability depends on plan and workspace settings.

ORGANISATIONAL CONSEQUENCE

Users may move from directing each step to setting a goal and reviewing a finished output. Intermediate decisions, tool use, or checks may not be individually directed or inspected unless the user asks. This may reduce visibility into how a final work product was produced.

WHAT TO WATCH

- Staff using ChatGPT to complete tasks, not just assist with steps
- Outputs that combine research, analysis, or document creation in one interaction
- Work products where process, tool use, or intermediate decisions are unclear

WHY THIS MATTERS NOW

GPT-5.5 is rolling out from 23 April 2026. Staff with access may already be using it for multi-step professional work. The question shifts from “what did the user ask?” to “how was the work completed?”.

WHAT TO REVIEW

- Whether policies distinguish AI assistance from AI task completion
- Whether QA processes assume a human reviewed each step
- Whether records capture how AI-assisted work was produced
- Whether higher-risk workflows require process visibility, not just final-output review

GOVERNANCE CONTEXT

Authority may shift in practice when the model determines how to carry out a goal, not just how to respond to a prompt. Visibility may also reduce if users receive finished outputs without inspecting intermediate steps, tool selections, or checks. The same interface may now support a more agentic style of work.
