CAPABILITY SHIFT

Microsoft 365 Copilot now includes admin controls for enabling Anthropic model access for specific users and groups. Microsoft describes this as granular control over which AI models are available to different users and groups. The same release note also references xAI model provider settings for Copilot Studio, currently limited to US customers via admin opt-in.

ORGANISATIONAL CONSEQUENCE

Organisations may no longer be governing Copilot as one consistent model-provider environment. Different users or groups may have access to different AI providers through Microsoft-controlled settings. Governance records, vendor assessments, and acceptable use guidance that assume one provider may not reflect the current configuration.

WHAT TO WATCH

- Anthropic model provider settings enabled for selected users
- Copilot behaviour varying across user groups
- Staff using models not covered by internal guidance
- Admin changes made before risk or governance review

WHY THIS MATTERS NOW

Microsoft has added provider-level controls to the Copilot admin environment. The issue is not only model choice. It is that provider selection may become an admin configuration decision before governance records catch up.

WHAT TO REVIEW

- AI provider settings in the Microsoft 365 admin centre
- Users or groups with Anthropic access enabled
- Vendor risk records for each enabled provider
- Guidance assuming one Copilot model provider
- Approval authority for provider changes

GOVERNANCE CONTEXT

This is an authority and visibility issue. Copilot may remain one interface, while the enabled model provider differs by user or group. Governance review may need to track not just Copilot access, but which AI providers are enabled behind it.
