

CLAUDE FABLE 5 REQUIRES 30-DAY API DATA RETENTION

CAPABILITY SHIFT

Anthropic launched Claude Fable 5 on 9 June 2026. On the Claude API, Fable 5 requires 30-day data retention and is not available under zero data retention. Data retention means how long API inputs and outputs are kept after processing. Many Claude API uses remain eligible for zero retention, but Fable 5 does not.

ORGANISATIONAL CONSEQUENCE

Organisations with zero-retention requirements may be unable to use Claude Fable 5 through the Claude API. This may affect teams with regulatory obligations, client contract requirements or internal data minimisation standards. Model selection now includes a data-handling trade-off: use a zero-retention eligible model, accept 30-day retention, or review alternative deployment channels.

WHAT TO WATCH

- Claude API users blocked by retention settings
- Teams choosing older models to preserve zero retention
- Partner-platform retention terms that differ from the Claude API
- Client or internal rules requiring zero retention

WHY THIS MATTERS NOW

Claude Fable 5 is already available on the Claude API. Claude Opus 4.1 is scheduled for retirement on 5 August 2026. Teams using zero-retention terms may need to weigh capability, retention and migration timing.

WHAT TO REVIEW

- How long Claude API inputs and outputs are retained
- Workflows requiring zero data retention
- Model upgrade and deprecation timelines
- Vendor terms for Claude API and partner platforms
- Whether model approval includes retention requirements

GOVERNANCE CONTEXT

This is a data-handling and model-selection issue. The most capable model may not be right for every workflow if its retention terms conflict with policy, contract or risk appetite. Retention settings should form part of model approval, not sit as a procurement detail.
