

COPILOT CHAT IN OUTLOOK CAN REASON ACROSS INBOX AND CALENDAR WITHOUT A COPILOT LICENCE

CAPABILITY SHIFT

Microsoft 365 Copilot Chat in Outlook is expanding from single-thread assistance to reasoning across a user's inbox, calendar, meetings and accessible Microsoft 365 enterprise data. Microsoft says affected users can ask Copilot Chat to find and summarise mailbox information, uncover action items from email and meetings, and help manage calendar commitments. The feature is listed across Android, Windows, iOS, Mac and Web, and does not require a Microsoft 365 Copilot licence.

ORGANISATIONAL CONSEQUENCE

Outlook AI assistance may now use broader mailbox and calendar context than users or organisations expected. This may expand the governed population beyond licensed Copilot users, because affected Outlook users can access the capability without a Copilot licence.

WHAT TO WATCH

- Answers referencing messages outside the visible thread
- Action items surfaced from email and meetings
- Unlicensed users accessing Copilot Chat in Outlook
- Staff surprise about Outlook context Copilot can use

WHY THIS MATTERS NOW

Organisations that scoped Copilot governance around licensed users may now have a broader Outlook population to consider. Policies written for thread-level assistance may not cover mailbox, calendar and meeting-level reasoning.

WHAT TO REVIEW

- Whether unlicensed users can access Copilot Chat in Outlook
- Admin settings for Outlook Copilot Chat
- User guidance on expanded Outlook context
- Whether data protection rules apply to AI summaries across multiple Outlook sources
- Whether Copilot governance still relies on licence status

GOVERNANCE CONTEXT

This is primarily a data handling issue, with visibility and authority implications. Licence-based governance may not capture all users with AI assistance across Outlook and Microsoft 365 data.
