

CLAUDE MANAGED AGENTS CAN PAUSE WHEN SESSION BUDGETS ARE REACHED

CAPABILITY SHIFT

Anthropic added hard budget caps to Claude Managed Agents sessions. The budget is measured using public list prices. When a session reaches its cap, it pauses with the `budget_reached` stop reason instead of starting new model requests. Changing or removing the budget allows the session to resume.

Deployments can also set a budget that applies to each session they start.

ORGANISATIONAL CONSEQUENCE

Teams can now place an enforceable spending boundary around individual agent sessions, but the control also creates a new continuity condition. A workflow may remain incomplete while a session is paused, so cost controls and operational expectations need to be designed together rather than treated as separate concerns.

WHAT TO WATCH

- Sessions pausing with `budget_reached` or workflows left incomplete
- Repeated manual increases or removals of session budgets
- Differences between configured budgets and internal cost forecasts

WHY THIS MATTERS NOW

Anthropic announced session budgets on 7 August 2026. Managed Agents can now set spending limits before work begins. When a cap is reached, further model requests stop until the budget is changed or removed.

WHAT TO REVIEW

- Which sessions or deployments should have hard budgets
- Who can set, change or remove those budgets
- How paused sessions are detected and resumed
- Whether critical workflows need alerts or exception handling

GOVERNANCE CONTEXT

Budget settings now affect both cost authority and continuity. Leaders should know where limits can stop model requests, who can change them and how unfinished work is identified.
