Please note that only official school-approved Spirit Wear may be worn on Spirit Tuesdays.

Clear Backpack Policy

All students in Pre-K3 through 8th Grade are required to use a clear backpack. This policy helps maintain a safe and secure learning environment and is outlined in the 2026–2027 Family Handbook. Please purchase a clear backpack before the first day of school on Tuesday, August 11, 2026.



Grooming & Appearance

Students are expected to arrive at school neatly groomed and in accordance with the 2026–2027 Family Handbook. Hair should be clean, neatly maintained, a natural color, and free of distracting styles or designs. Makeup, nail polish, artificial nails, tattoos, and unauthorized body piercings are not permitted. Modest jewelry may be worn in accordance with the handbook guidelines.

Children in Texas may be able to get low-cost health care from the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) or no-cost health care from Children's Medicaid.

We can help you fill out the application and answer all your questions.

WHAT DO CHIP AND MEDICAID COVER?

- Office visits
- Prescription drugs
- Dental care
- Eye and auditory exams
- Glasses
- Hospital care and services
- X-rays and lab tests
- Access to medical specialists and mental health care
- Treatment for special health needs and preexisting conditions

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR CHIP AND MEDICAID:

- Children up to age 18 or children with disabilities up to age 20
- Texas resident
- U.S. citizen or qualified immigrant
- Family income must meet eligibility thresholds

IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS NEEDED:

- Child's social security number
- Proof of each family member's income (pay stubs, employer letter, child support papers)
- Proof of childcare, disabled adult care or child support expenses

Asthma Management Program: The nationally certified Asthma Management Program at Children's Health has proven to reduce asthma-related Emergency Room visits, as well as school and work absences. This three- to six-month program helps children aged 18 and younger better manage their condition for more symptom-free sleep, learning and play.

Children's Health Andrews Institute for Orthopaedics & Sports Medicine: As the only institute of its kind in the region, Children's Health Andrews Institute is here to get athletes back on the field. Developed under the direction of nationally renowned orthopedic surgeon James Andrews, M.D., this state-of-the-art facility offers a full spectrum of services from orthopedic surgery, a same-day fracture clinic and spinal care to rehabilitation, performance training, nutrition plans, advanced imaging and diagnostics.

Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) & Children's Medicaid Outreach: Children in Texas without health insurance now have a way to either get low-cost health care through CHIP or no-cost health care with Children's Medicaid. Both programs cover office visits, prescription drugs, dental care, eye exams and glasses. Outreach representatives help families apply for assistance virtually or in person throughout the community, whether at a child's school, library or other community-based location.

Get Up & Go: Designed by physicians and registered dietitians, Get Up & Go by Children's Health addresses the needs of children with high weight or obesity by creating awareness and understanding of how lifestyle choices impact health. It offers a wide range of FREE programs and services at several local YMCA/community locations in Dallas, Denton and Collin counties to empower families in making lasting healthy lifestyle changes.

Injury Prevention: Injury is the number one cause of death for kids, and the good news is injuries are preventable. With evidence-based education tools, both in the hospital and community, the Injury Prevention Service at Children's Health helps keep children safe from traumatic injuries. From car seat

safety to water safety and firearm safety, our program provides educational materials and interactive events in both English and Spanish.

School-Based Telehealth: School nurses can now connect students with health care providers right from school using School-Based Telehealth by Children's Health Virtual Care. As one of the fastest-growing telemedicine programs in the country, our School-Based Telehealth program has expanded to 200+ schools throughout 28 school districts in Texas and has conducted more than 15,000 visits since 2014. A recent survey also showed the program has resulted in decreased absenteeism and a perceived 84% cost savings for families. In fact, out of the 465 survey respondents, more than 75% of them reported their child would have missed at least a half day of school without the program.

School-Based Telebehavioral Health and Texas Child Health Access Through Telemedicine: Our Behavioral Health team has two exciting programs available to over 400 public school districts and charter schools in North Texas. Both programs provide mental health services to students during the school day using a tablet that is provided by Children's Health. Our Legacy School-Based Telebehavioral Health program, started in 2017, provides up to eight counseling sessions to students with behavioral health concerns, including, but not limited to, depression, anxiety and attentional concerns. Our state-funded Texas Child Health Access Through Telemedicine (TCHAT) program partners with UT Southwestern and is fully funded by the Texas Child Mental Health Care Consortium. TCHAT offers short-term therapy as well as psychiatric consultation. Both programs include case management, psychoeducation and referrals to community resources. Both programs are no cost to families. Families can reach out to their school counselor to see if our Legacy or TCHAT program is available at their student's school.

- Employment search assistance
- Job readiness assistance
- Child care assistance while in training
- Career exploration and assessments
- Individualized career management

How do I know if I'm eligible?

The WIOA program is available to low-income adult, youth and dislocated Texas workers living in Dallas County.

Basic eligibility* for the program includes:

- Must be a United States citizen or eligible to work in the United States;
- If male and born after January 1, 1960, must be registered with the Selective Service
