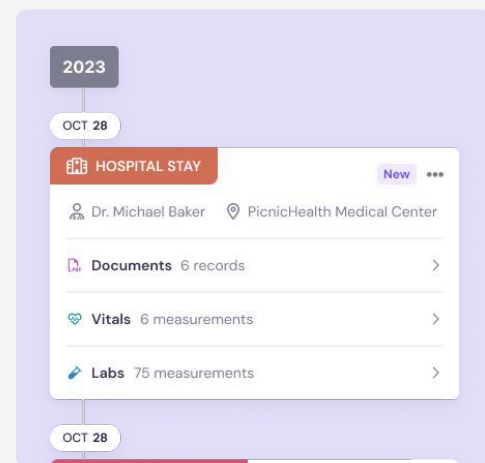

Once you sign up, we’ll collect your or your loved one’s medical records, giving you the tools to take charge of their health journey and confidently manage their care.

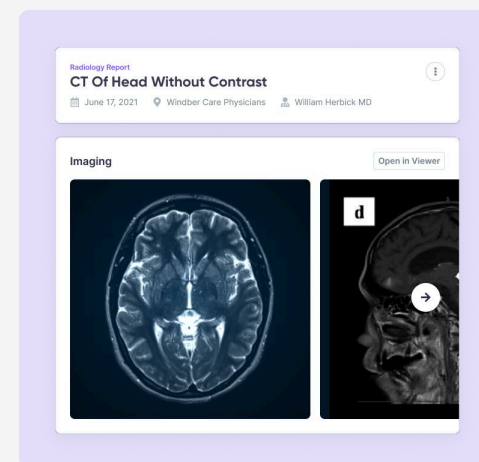


### Records in one place

We’ll start gathering your or your loved one’s records from any U.S. care site and unify them into an organized, intuitive digital format.

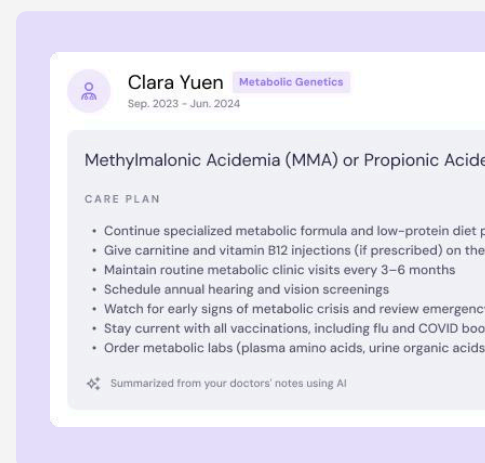
### Empowered health journey

## FAQs

### What are researchers trying to learn from this study?

Researchers want to understand how MMA MUT and PA progress over time, how current treatments are working, and the day-to-day challenges families face. This kind of real-world data helps improve care—not just now, but for future families too.

### How much will I be compensated?

You’ll receive \$250 for your time. You will also receive a PicnicHealth account, which gives you access to all of your or your loved one’s medical records— organized in one secure place—and includes tools to help you manage their care. You may also be invited to take part in occasional compensated surveys.

### How long does the study last?

The study is expected to continue through 2027, but it may end sooner or be extended. During that time, eligible participants will complete short health surveys every four months. You’ll be notified if the study ends earlier or extends beyond that date. You can withdraw from the study at any time.

### Can I contribute records on behalf of my loved one who has passed away?

Yes. Those who have lost a loved one to MMA or PA can join the study by contributing their loved one’s medical records. This helps create a meaningful legacy and supports research to improve care for others.

Our team may need documents like a death certificate or power of attorney to collect records on your behalf—at no cost to you. Requirements vary by state, and we’ll reach out if anything additional is needed.

Your or your loved one's records are de-identified, then analyzed to help researchers better understand MMA and PA.



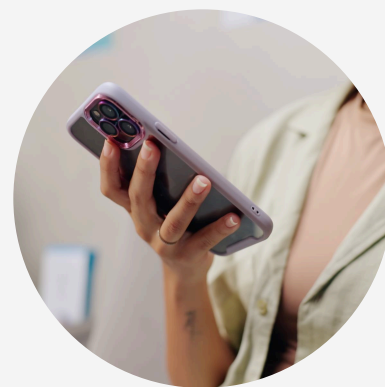
## About the COMPASS Study

This observational study helps researchers understand how methylmalonic acidemia (MMA) due to mutase deficiency (MUT) and propionic acidemia (PA) affect children and adults over time.

Researchers will use your or your loved one's de-identified medical records and survey responses to:

- Track symptoms and health changes over time
- Explore real-world treatment patterns
- Identify care gaps and family support needs

## Keeping information safe

We take privacy seriously—every step of the way

To protect your or your loved one's information, we de-identify the data by removing any details that directly identify you, like your name and contact information.

Instead, we assign a participant ID to the medical records to keep your or your loved one's identity confidential.

MMA and PA researchers use this unique code to connect additional health information while keeping your or your loved one's identity private.

## Study activities at a glance

Here's what to expect when you take part in the study:



### Medical Record Collection

We'll securely collect your or your loved one's de-identified medical records to understand their care and confirm eligibility.



### Short Surveys

If eligible, you'll be asked to complete short surveys every four months to help track your or your loved one's daily activities and overall quality of life.



### Support MMA and PA Research

By joining, you'll help researchers learn how these conditions affect families—and guide future treatments and care strategies.
