RSA Legal Defense Alert!!

Always consult with an association representative/lawyer before responding to any report, letter, memo and/or questions concerning an investigation that could possibly lead to punitive action. If ordered to do so, ask to have it recorded and read the following: Non-waiver statement:

"I have been refused the right to have a representative of my choice. I understand that I am being ordered to make a report or answer questions and that, if I do not comply with the order, I may be disciplined for insubordination.

Therefore, I have no alternative but to abide by the order. However, by so doing, I do not waive my constitutional rights to remain silent under the 5th and 14th amendments to the United States Constitution and under the protections afforded me under state law."

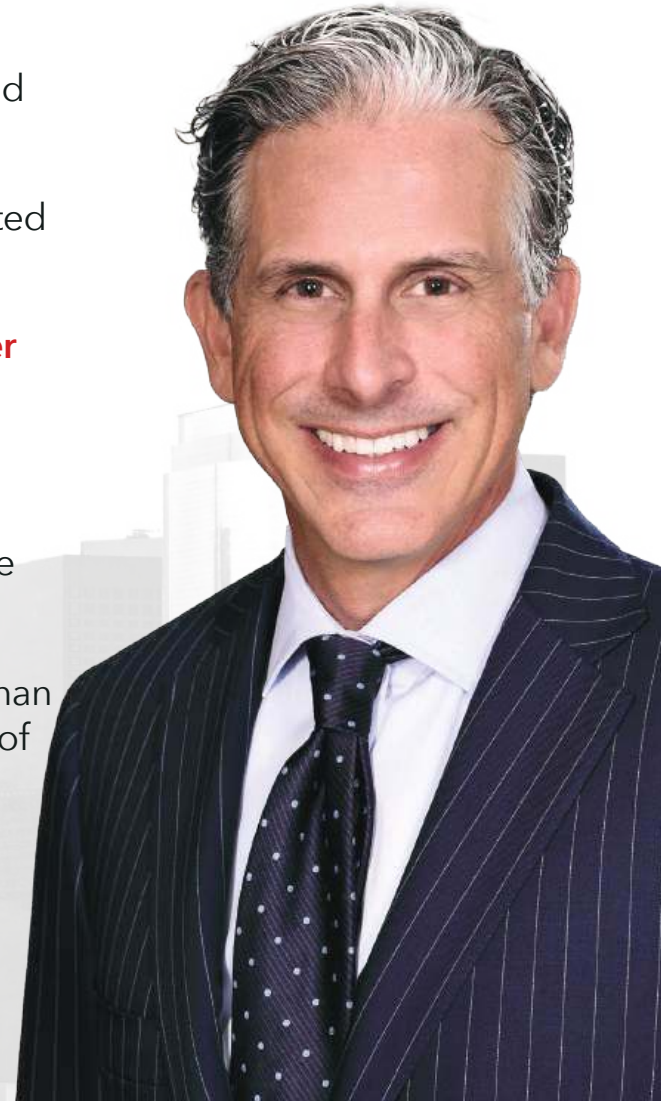

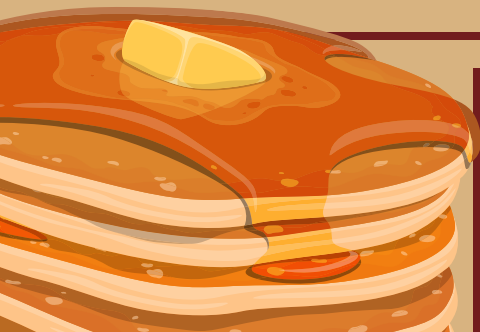

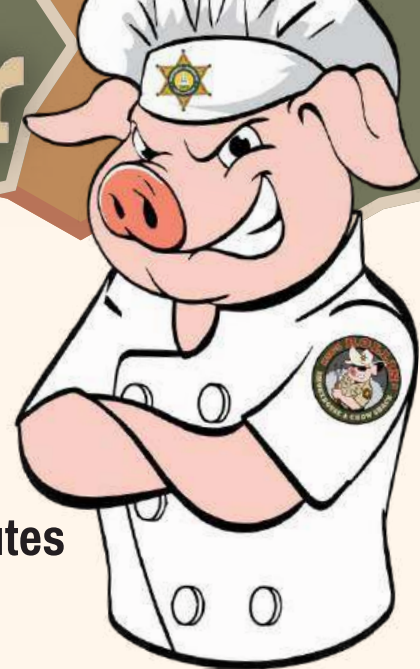

Cassidy's Butterscotch Cookie Bars



Cook Time: 30 Min



Prep: 10 Minutes



Serves: 6-12

Ingredients:

- 1/2 Cup Butter (Softened)
- 1/2 Cup Light Brown Sugar
- 1/2 Cup Granulated Sugar
- 1 Egg
- 1 Teaspoon Pure Vanilla Extract
- 1 1/2 Cups All Purpose Flour
- 1/2 Teaspoon Baking Soda
- 1/4 Teaspoon Baking Powder
- 1/2 Teaspoon Salt
- 1 - 1 1/4 Cups Butterscotch Chips

Instructions:

- Pre-heat oven to 350. While oven is warming up to bake these incredible cookies we will;
- Get ourselves a baking dish (9x9, 8x8 or even a 9x11) Either is okay, this recipe is friendly! Line that pan with parchment paper the best you can, give it a tiny spray with baking spray once lined. Now set that beauty aside, this is where the fun begins
- Grab your flour, baking soda, baking powder and salt. Throw that in a bowl and combine. Once combine set that aside, I know but I promise it's worth the extra step
- Grab our softened butter, light brown sugar and granulated sugar and mix either with a hand held mixer, or by hand with some strong muscles.
- Next add that egg and vanilla extract and mix in with a spatula
- Now we will combine the dry ingredients that we set aside with the wet mixture. And mix well.
- This is my favorite part. Let's add our special ingredient, butterscotch chips! Combine those with our now mixed cookie dough.
- We are now going to add our dough to our pan and press firmly into the dish. Once it's in the dish it's time to bake these babies.
- Bake for 19--26 minutes. Bakers tip, once the edges start to brown you know you're heading to the finish line. take the Butterschotch bars our and let them coo fror 10-16 minutes. Serve and enjoy!

The nomination period is currently open for Riverside Sheriffs' Association Executive Officer positions. These elected offices include: **President** and **Secretary**. The nomination period will conclude at 5 P.M. on Friday, August 30, 2024.

NOMINATION PROCEDURE:

Candidates seeking a nomination to one of the Executive Officer positions must be a Regular member in good standing with the Association for a minimum of five years at the time of the nomination and must have served for at least one year as a Director on the Board.

In order to be nominated, candidates must complete and submit a "Petition in Support of Candidate Nomination form" to the Association, no later than 5pm on Friday August 30, 2024. **Petition in Support of Candidate Nomination Forms** must contain complete information at time of submission to include a minimum of fifty (50) signatures of Association members in good standing (*Bylaws: Article VII, Section 7.02 et al*).

All candidates are also encouraged to submit a one-page candidate statement, which will be posted along with the official notice of electronic balloting during the election period.

IMPORTANT ELECTION DATES:

- o **August 30th 2024:** Nomination period concludes, nomination petitions due in the RSA office no later than 5pm (*or post marked no later than August 30th 2024*)
- o **October 28th 2024:** Election period opens. Notice of electronic balloting will be **emailed** to members' **HOME EMAIL** addresses on file with RSA. Notices will not be sent using County email addresses.
- o **November 15th 2024: Election period** closes, ballots must be electronically cast by this date.
- o **November 20th 2024:** Ballots tabulated; preliminary election results posted.
- o **January 2025:** Officers installed at annual meeting.

Remember: Petitions in Support of Candidate Nomination Forms must be returned to RSA no later than 5pm on Friday August 30, 2024.

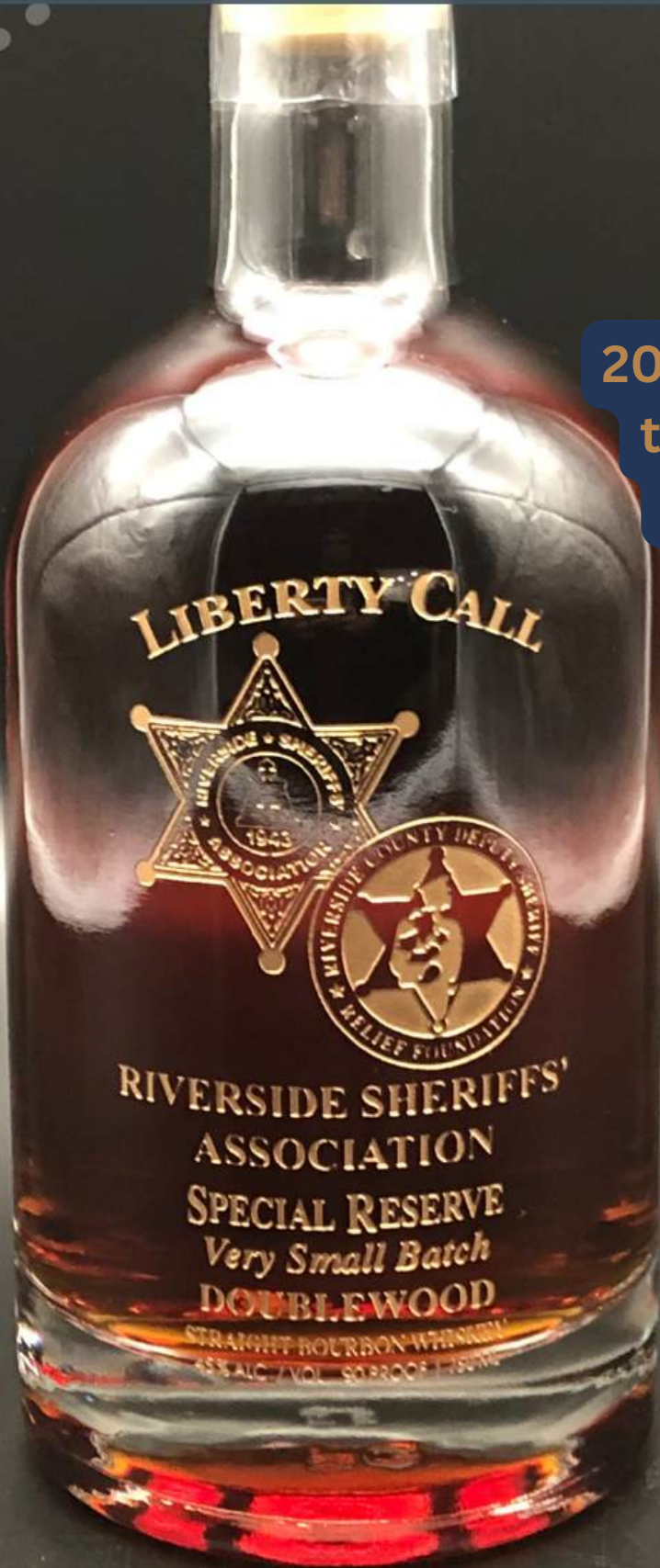

Workers' Compensation: Understanding 'Injury'

It is not uncommon for a member to discuss a workers' compensation issue and immediately jump into what symptoms they are experiencing and how it is affecting their time at work or life at home. What usually follows this discussion is a member's eagerness to get to the root source of their symptom by pinpointing a recollection of how the "injury" occurred. Often times, a member's recollection of "injury" is a sincere attempt to identify a cause of their problems; however, there is inevitably a lack of understanding of how the workers' compensation system identifies "injury" and why such identification is vital to properly securing financial and medical benefits.

"WHAT DOES "INJURY" ACTUALLY MEAN IN WORKERS' COMP?"

The Labor Code recognizes two (2) types of injuries under the workers' compensation system: (1) "*Specific*" injury and a (2) "*Cumulative Trauma*" injury. A workers' comp claim for injury is initially classified by which "type" of injury the member believes occurred.

A "*Specific*" injury is the typical injury that comes to mind for a member. It is an injury that happened on at a certain day and time, one that is memorable and distinct. The examples of this type of injury would be an injury to a hand as a result of a K9 bite or an injury to a neck as a result of a traffic collision. A "specific" injury is usually followed by immediate medical treatment (or treatment very shortly thereafter.)

A "*Cumulative Trauma*" injury is the injury that takes time (in many cases, years) to develop. This injury is also commonly referred to as a "wear and tear" injury. It is an injury that did not happen on a certain day; rather, it is an injury that develops over time and then becomes symptomatic. This injury manifests over a time due to the repetitive injurious nature of the job. The examples of this injury would be an injury to a low back from wearing of a duty-belt or an internal medicine injury (i.e. hypertension, GERD or

cancer) due to the chronic exposures (chemical or physical) of a job. A cumulative trauma injury might have ongoing conservative care (i.e. chiropractic) or medical treatment might occur only once the injury has become symptomatic.

"WHY IS UNDERSTANDING THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A SPECIFIC INJURY OR A CUMULATIVE TRAUMA INJURY IMPORTANT?"

Once a claim for workers' compensation benefits is filed, the County has a legal obligation to investigate the claim and ultimately make a determination of "accepting" or "denying" the claim. Part of this investigation includes whether the injury occurred as stated; therefore, incorrectly categorizing an injury could lead to a needless denial of financial and medical benefits.

In addition, misclassifying the injury could impact entitlement to future workers' compensation benefits should a member need additional treatment due to the worsening of their condition. In short, a member is able to "re-open" their claim for injury within five (5) years from their date of injury, so if an injury date is incorrect, a member could run the risk of mistakenly cutting off financial and medical benefits that would otherwise be rightfully owed.

Navigating the workers' compensation system can be complex. Understanding how workers' compensation laws apply to medical conditions and workplace injury is important to maintaining health and longevity in a public safety member's career. ★

Reforming Criminal Justice Reforms

Fix Prop 47 with Prop 36

“How to NOT make sausage”

As images and stories of fentanyl deaths, violent crime, smash-and-grabs and mass retail thefts flooded our news feeds and evening news throughout 2023, it appeared that California voters might have finally had enough. In fact, even the state legislature began to pass legislation to crack down (a little) on certain organized retail theft acts and began to consider some laws to blunt the thousands of deaths resulting from the fentanyl crisis. However, most of the laws that could have made a real impact on crime and fentanyl poisonings were dismissed out of hand in the legislature’s “Public Safety” committees.

After the legislature adjourned for the year without taking serious steps to combat these ills, some District Attorneys got together to craft a proposed ballot measure to do just that. Titled “The Homeless, Drug Addiction and Theft Reduction Act,” the measure, if approved by voters, does the following:

A. Provide drug and mental health treatment for people who are addicted to hard drugs such as fentanyl, cocaine, heroin, and methamphetamine.



After the legislature adjourned for the year without taking serious steps to combat these ills, some District Attorneys got together to craft a proposed ballot measure to do just that.



- B. Add fentanyl to existing laws that prohibit the possession of hard drugs while armed with a loaded firearm.
- C. Add fentanyl to existing laws that prohibit the trafficking of large quantities of hard drugs.
- D. Permit judges to use their discretion to sentence drug dealers to state prison instead of county jail when they are convicted of trafficking hard drugs in large quantities or are armed with a firearm while engaging in drug trafficking.
- E. Warn convicted hard drug dealers and manufacturers that they can be charged with murder if they continue to traffic in hard drugs and someone dies as a result.
- F. Reinstate penalties for hard drug dealers whose trafficking kills or seriously injures a drug user.
- G. Increase penalties for people who repeatedly engage in theft.
- H. Add new laws to address the increasing problem of “smash-and-grab” thefts that result in significant losses and damage, or that are committed by multiple thieves working together.

Public safety groups throughout the state endorsed the initiative, as did many of California’s biggest retailers. Signatures started rolling in and the legislature began to take notice.

In February, Senate Democrats introduced a package of bills they called “Working Together for a Safer California”. Similarly, the Assembly Democrats introduced their package of bills in April and complementing the Senate’s, with the combined package now titled “Safer California.”

The package consisted of 14 commendable, public safety-oriented bills that we and many other law enforcement organizations supported. The bills passed their committees and the initiative continued to gather more and more signatures. Good legislation passing at the Capitol before legislative deadlines in late May and a ballot measure to fix many of the problems caused by Prop. 47 heading to the voters for approval. It looked to be the best of both worlds. Then came June.

June 7- legislative leaders announce that “poison pill” amendments (urgency clauses and “inoperability” language) will be loaded into the “Safer CA” bills. Supporters of the DA’s efforts accuse democrats of using this drafting gimmick to allow CA Attorney General Rob Bonta to re-write the “title and summary” of the measure, warning voters that if they vote for the proposition, all of the good laws on the “Safer CA” package would be repealed.

June 11- CAC Secretary of State announces that the DA’s ballot measure has officially qualified for the November election.

June 17 - leaked emails reveal the Gov’s chief of staff refused to negotiate with the DAs on strengthening the “Safer CA” legislative package unless the DAs agree to postpone their initiative to 2026.

Republicans and many Democrats are so enraged at the political gamesmanship with the poison pills over such a serious topic, questions arise as to whether the 2/3 votes necessary for passage with each house will materialize.

June 27 - Secretary of State scheduled to certify the November ballot and whatever propositions would appear on it. Instead, the legislature granted itself an extra week in order to implement their next effort to derail the DA’s measure.

June 29 - After being blasted by the press throughout the state for their shady antics, legislative leaders remove the poison pill language from the “Safer CA” bill package and begin working on a new way to defeat the DAs measure.

June 30 - Gov announces he’s introducing his own initiative to amend Prop 47 to compete with the DA’s ballot measure. Critics noted that the governor and legislative leaders were now proposing to amend Prop 47 after months of declarations that there was no need and that legislative fixes could sufficiently address the issues. These same critics also

pointed out that when there are two propositions addressing the same topic with conflicting messages, voters generally tend to reject both of them. A bill was gutted-and-amended with the governor’s own ballot measure language.

July 2 - The bill was heard and approved by the Assembly Public Safety Committee, but just hours after passage, the supporters learned that they didn’t have the votes to pass it off of the floor and Gov Newsom announced that he

was withdrawing his measure.

Legislative “tricks” have long been part of the colorful history at the Capitol and twisting arms to get lawmakers to flip their votes has roots dating back to both the Greek and Roman Republics. True mastery of the procedural rules, policies, constitution, applicable laws and calendars is a craft with relatively few experts. Those who know the rules know how to get around them.

In this case, from a procedural perspective, on paper, what was attempted was brilliant. That is not to say that their actions should be condoned, but the approach that was crafted here was quite ingenious. The execution of the plan? Not so great. They didn’t account for a public able to understand what they were doing and to become so vocally opposed - and - they ignored the most basic rule of all legislative action: make sure you have the votes.
