Strength in Service

Recognizing excellence, protecting our future, and continuing the work of serving those who serve across Riverside County.

July was an extraordinary month for the Riverside Sheriffs' Association—one that demonstrated the strength of our membership, the growing influence of our organization, and the importance of remaining united in our mission to serve those who serve.

This month, RSA hosted one of our most successful Awards Banquets to date. More than 300 attendees—including RSA members, families, community leaders, elected officials, law enforcement partners, and supporters from throughout Riverside County; joined us as we recognized 50 deserving members for their courage, leadership, sacrifice, and exceptional service.

Each honoree represented the very best of our profession. Their stories reminded everyone in attendance that public safety is not simply a career; it is a calling. It requires courage, compassion, discipline, and a willingness to place the well-being of others ahead of oneself.

Because of the generosity of our sponsors, attendees, and community partners, the banquet also raised over \$20,000 in proceeds for the Riverside County Deputy Sheriff Relief Foundation. These funds will

allow the Foundation to continue supporting public safety employees and their families during serious injuries, illnesses, tragedies, and other unforeseen hardships.

The success of the banquet was not measured only by attendance or the amount raised. It was measured by the recognition our members received, the relationships strengthened throughout our community, and the powerful reminder that the service and sacrifices of our members do not go unnoticed.

Our work in July also extended far beyond the banquet hall.

RSA remained actively engaged in Sacramento and throughout Riverside County, reviewing and challenging proposed language in several state bills and County measures. We successfully fought for language changes intended to protect our members' bargaining rights, employment protections, professional classifications, benefits, pensions, and long-term representation.

Legislation can have consequences that extend far beyond what initially appears in a bill summary. That is why RSA continues to closely examine proposed laws, amendments, ordinances, policies, and County actions before they are finalized. We will continue working with legislators, public safety organizations, labor partners, and legal counsel to ensure the voices of our members are heard before decisions are

made—not after the damage has already occurred.

One of our most important legislative priorities continues to be AB 1383, which is currently scheduled for a hearing on August 3, 2026. This legislation represents an important opportunity to reform inequities within the pension system created under the Public Employees' Pension Reform Act, commonly known as PEPRA.

RSA will continue fighting for meaningful pension reform and for a retirement system that fairly recognizes the demands, risks, and sacrifices associated with a career in public safety. This effort is not only about those serving today; it is about protecting the future of our profession, improving recruitment and retention, and ensuring that the next generation of peace officers can retire with dignity after a career of public service.

We will continue monitoring AB 1383 closely and will provide members with updates as the bill moves through the legislative process. When member involvement is needed, RSA will ensure you have the information and resources necessary to make your voices heard.

During the month, I also had the opportunity to speak directly with Todd Blanche regarding the resources, partnerships, and federal support needed to further the mission of our nation's peacekeepers. Our members are confronting

increasingly complex challenges involving violent crime, narcotics trafficking, organized criminal activity, behavioral health crises, technology, recruitment, retention, and officer wellness.

These challenges cannot be addressed by local agencies alone. Strong coordination between local, state, and federal partners remains essential. RSA will continue seeking opportunities to bring additional resources, training, technology, funding, and meaningful partnerships back to the agencies and communities our members serve.

We also continued expanding the services available through our Crossover Health medical facilities. Among the newest additions is the Men's Performance and Wellness Program, which is designed to provide members with more comprehensive and proactive support for their long-term health and overall well-being.

Our goal is not simply to provide medical coverage after someone becomes ill. We want to create meaningful access to preventive care, early detection, wellness services, and specialized programs that help our members remain healthy throughout their careers and into retirement. We will continue evaluating additional services that address the unique physical and psychological demands placed upon public safety professionals.

At the same time, RSA remains vigilant in protecting the integrity and independence of the RSA Benefits Trust. We will cooperate with lawful and appropriately defined processes

while ensuring that member information, Trust records, medical benefits, and confidential financial materials remain properly protected. Transparency and accountability are important, but so are professional boundaries, confidentiality, and the protection of the assets our members have worked decades to build.



Our labor team also continues advocating for fair contracts, competitive compensation, safe staffing levels, reasonable working conditions, and policies that recognize the realities of public safety work. Recruitment and retention remain significant concerns across our represented agencies. Vacancies, mandatory overtime, increasing workloads, and the loss of experienced employees affect not only our members, but also the quality and reliability of public safety services throughout Riverside County.

RSA will continue demanding that decisions affecting our members be supported by accurate information, legitimate operational analysis, and a full understanding of their long-term consequences. We will not accept rushed decisions, one-sided processes, or proposals that place political convenience ahead of the

safety of our members and the communities they serve.

Everything we accomplished this month was made possible by the participation of our members, directors, trustees, delegates, staff, volunteers, community partners, and families. Whether you assisted with the Awards Banquet, participated in legislative advocacy, supported a fellow member, attended a meeting, volunteered at an event, or simply continued performing your duties with professionalism and integrity—you contributed to the strength of this Association.

RSA continues to move forward with purpose. We are expanding member services, strengthening partnerships, increasing our legislative presence, protecting our benefits, supporting our communities, and ensuring that the men and women represented by this Association have a strong and respected voice.

There will always be challenges before us. But when we remain united, informed, and committed to one another, there is no challenge we cannot confront.

It remains one of the greatest honors of my career to serve as your President. I am proud of what we accomplished in July, and I am even more confident about where we are headed.

Smash Burgers



Cook Time: 10 Minutes



Prep: 15 Minutes



Serves: 6 - 8



Ingredients:

- 1 Lb 80/20 Ground Beef
- Hamburger Buns
- American Cheese
- Pickles
- Onions, Sliced or Chopped
- Condiments / Burger Sauce
- 4 Tbsp Butter
- Salt & Pepper

Instructions:

- Step 1: Roll 3-4 oz of 80/20 ground beef into a loose ball.
- Step 2: Heat a hot cast-iron skillet or griddle.
- Step 3: Place the beef on the hot surface and smash thin with a spatula or smash burger press.
- Step 4: Season with salt & pepper.
- Step 5: Cook for 2-3 minutes, flip once and add American cheese.
- Step 6: Cook for an additional 30-60 seconds more.
- Step 7: Optional, butter and toast buns before serving.
- Step 8: Serve up with condiments and sides. Enjoy!

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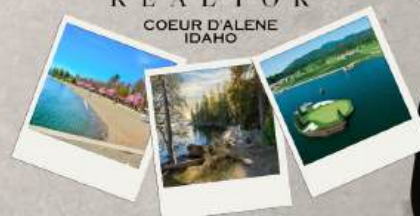
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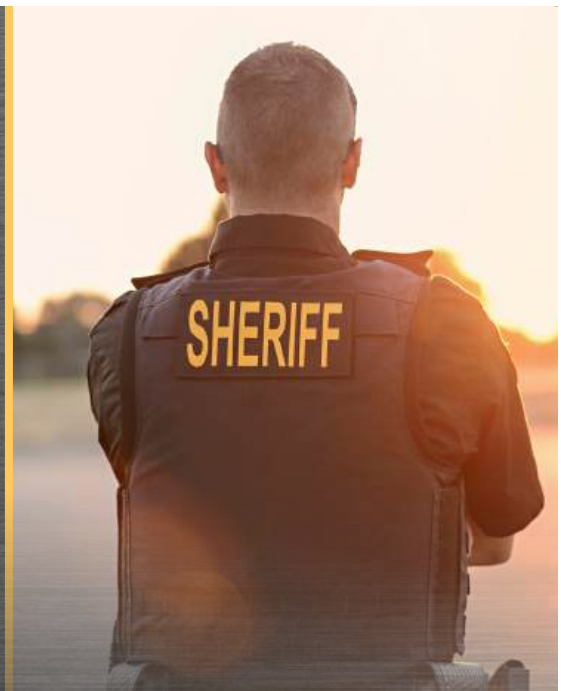

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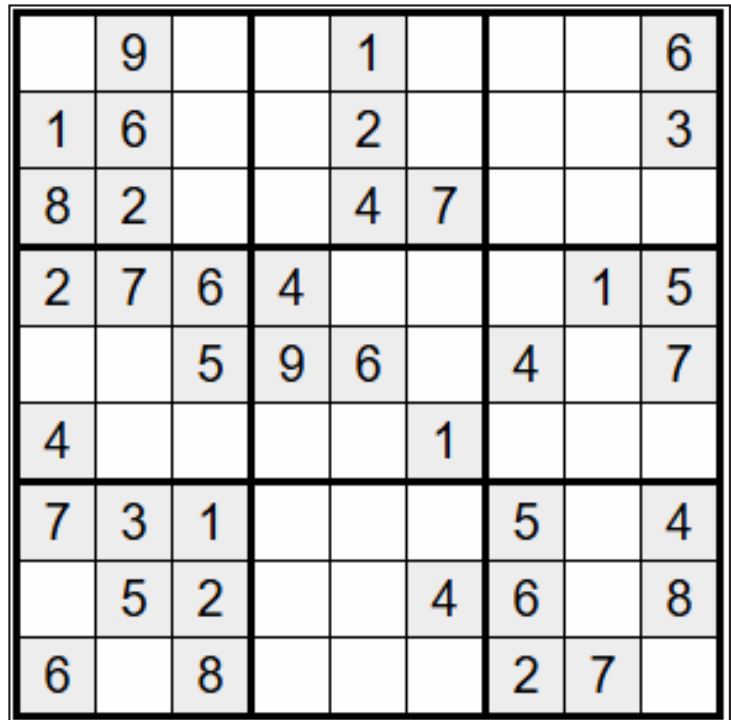
