Miracle Season Week 1

It'll Be There In The Morning

Main Idea

Throughout this series, we're exploring moments when heaven touched earth—miracles that weren't just for back then but can still happen today. Some were dramatic, like seas parting and the dead rising. Others were quiet, consistent, and almost ordinary—like the miracle we're looking at today. It showed up every single morning for 40 years: daily bread from heaven. Because the truth is, God isn't just the God of once-in-a-while breakthroughs—He's the God who shows up every day with exactly what we need.

Anchor Passage

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven"
(Ecclesiastes 3:1 (ESV))

Read Exodus 16:4–15

1. Don't Let Tomorrow's Worries Rob You Of Today's Miracles

God's provision is for today, so don't let fear about tomorrow blind you to the miracle in front of you. When you trust Him for daily bread, you can release tomorrow's worries and rest in His faithfulness right now.

Read Matthew 6:11, 34

Discussion: What's one area of your life where you tend to worry about the future instead of trusting God for today? How have you seen God provide for you in small, daily ways that you may have overlooked before?

Faith isn't about hoarding miracles. It's about trusting that God will do it again tomorrow.

2. God Gives You Exactly What You Need, For Exactly Where You Are

God's provision is perfectly portioned—never too much, never too little—just enough for where you are and what you're walking through. When we stop comparing and start trusting, we begin to see that what feels small is often exactly what we need.

Read Exodus 16:18

Discussion: Where in your life have you been tempted to compare your portion to someone else's? Can you think of a time when what felt like "not enough" turned out to be exactly what you needed?

3. Daily Trust Brings Daily Provision

God shows up fresh every morning with the mercy, grace, and strength you need. Just like your spirit needs more than a Sunday boost, your soul thrives when you stay connected to Him daily.

Read Lamentations 3:22–23

Discussion: What's one way you can stay more consistently "plugged in" to God's presence each day? Have you ever tried to live off of a Sunday experience all week? How did that impact your spiritual strength?

God knows exactly how much you need for exactly where you are right now.

SUMMARY

Even in the wilderness seasons—when life feels fragile and resources feel scarce—God's provision has never failed. He shows up daily, faithfully, and personally. The miracle isn't just the manna, it's the trust we place in the One who provides it. We don't trust in the provision—we trust in the Provider. And His name is Jesus.

CALL TO ACTION

Trust God with today—don't let tomorrow's worries steal today's miracles. Take time this week to recognize how God is providing for you right now. Instead of focusing on future fears, lean into His daily faithfulness.

Stop comparing your portion and start believing it's enough. God gives you exactly what you need for where you are. Reflect on any areas where comparison has crept in, and choose to be grateful for His perfect provision in this season.

Stay plugged into God's presence every day. Don't try to run the week on a Sunday charge. Commit to a daily rhythm of prayer, Scripture, and worship—because daily trust leads to daily strength.

GROUP LEADER RESOURCE

Starburst Exchange

Description: Buy a large bag of Starburst (or some other candy) and give each person the same amount (try 10). Start by stating something you've never done that you think everyone else has done.

For example, you might say, "I've never had a birthday party," or some other true statement about yourself that you think everyone else has surely done. Then, everyone who has had a birthday party pays you one Starburst. You pay everyone who has not had a party.

Keep playing by asking additional questions until everyone has a turn or until someone runs out of Starburst. Obviously, the idea is to end up with the most.
