Because playing Peraleja now also means enjoying something that only happens once: **being part of the birth and evolution of a golf course**.

HOW DOES ONE PLAY PERALEJA?

9 HOLES. TWO LOOPS. DIFFERENT WAYS TO EXPERIENCE THEM.

Peraleja Golf currently operates as a 9-hole course, which can be played twice to complete an 18-hole experience.

To allow every player to adapt the course to their game — and to introduce variety between the two loops — we have prepared four tee options:

GOLD (5534m)

The longest course setup.

The teeing positions remain the same during the first and second loops.

The most demanding tees.

SILVER (5231m)

An intermediate option offering two different playing experiences.

Certain teeing positions change between the first and second loops, offering different distances, angles and shots when playing the course again.

BLUE (4598m)

Our second intermediate option.

As with the Silver tees, certain teeing positions vary between the two loops to provide a different experience during the second nine holes.

PINK (4328m)

The shortest course setup.

The teeing positions remain the same during the first and second loops.

The most forgiving tees.

CHOOSE YOUR PERALEJA

We do not believe that a tee should be chosen solely according to age, gender or handicap.

The best tee is the one from which you will enjoy the course the most.

Your usual hitting distance, your level of play and the type of experience you are looking for should help you decide.

Before you begin, check the total distances for each option and speak to our team.

We will be delighted to help you.

It is not about playing Peraleja from as far back as possible; it is about playing the right Peraleja for you.

LOCAL RULES

A YOUNG COURSE. LET'S PLAY IN THE SPIRIT OF GOLF.

The Rules of Golf as established by The R&A apply at Peraleja Golf, supplemented by the following Local Rules during this initial stage of course consolidation

01 — DARK STONE AND GRAVEL

All landscaped areas consisting of dark stone or gravel are considered ground under repair and no play zones.

If your ball lies in one of these areas, or there is interference under the Rules of Golf, do not play the ball from there.

Take free relief under Rule 16.1, using the nearest point of complete relief and the corresponding relief area, no nearer the hole.

These areas form part of Peraleja's landscape design.
Thank you for helping us protect them.

02 — PREFERRED LIES ON THE FAIRWAY

During this initial stage of the course, preferred lies are in operation.

When your ball lies in a part of the general area cut to fairway height or less, you may lift it, clean it and place it once within a maximum distance equivalent to the length of a scorecard, no nearer the hole.

This measure is temporary and forms part of the consolidation process of our playing surfaces.

03 — WASTE AREAS

All sandy areas located between the teeing areas and the beginning of the fairway, as well as those extending laterally along the course, are considered Waste Areas (natural sandy areas) and are expressly distinguished from the bunkers on the course.

For the purposes of the Rules of Golf, these areas form part of the general area. The ball must therefore be played as it lies and may not be placed under the Local Rule for preferred lies on the fairway.

As they are not considered bunkers, the player may ground the club, make practice swings touching the surface and remove loose impediments, provided that doing so does not cause the ball to move or improperly improve the conditions affecting the stroke.

04 — COURSE BOUNDARIES AND INTERNAL OUT OF BOUNDS

The external boundaries of Peraleja Golf are defined by the fences, enclosures or walls of the homes and properties bordering the golf course. In addition, there are internal out of bounds applicable exclusively to certain holes.

On hole 4/13, an out of bounds is established along the entire left-hand side, defined by the outer left edge of the stream, with the purpose of preventing the tee shot from being played using hole 1/10 as a playing area.

Likewise, on hole 1/10, there is an internal out of bounds along the right-hand side, defined by the outer right edge of the Waste Area or dark gravel area, thereby preventing the player from using hole 6/15 as an alternative line of play.

These internal out of bounds apply only when playing the hole for which they have been established; when the player is playing any other hole on the course, those same areas are not considered out of bounds under this Local Rule.

05 — AREAS UNDER DEVELOPMENT OR REPAIR

A newly opened golf course is alive.

During these first few months, you will find certain areas that are still growing, recovering or undergoing agronomic consolidation.

Areas marked by the Club as ground under repair allow free relief in accordance with Rule 16.1.

But we would like to ask something more of you.

Not every small area undergoing development can be individually marked.

Therefore, during this initial stage, we invite our players to use common sense, honesty, consistency and sportsmanship.

If your ball lies in an area showing clear and unequivocal evidence of being under repair, recovery or agronomic development, even if it is not expressly marked, and with the knowledge and agreement of your playing partners, you may treat it as ground under repair and take free relief.

Always from the nearest point that allows play to continue under normal conditions and without gaining any additional advantage.

This consideration must never be used to avoid a bad lie, a difficult position or a natural challenge of the course.

It is simply intended to ensure that an obvious circumstance arising from the course establishment process does not unfairly affect your round.

We trust your judgement.

We trust your honesty.

We trust in the spirit of golf.
