EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends,

I hope this letter finds you and your family in good health. The previous two letters that I have penned have been in the context of the pandemic and a major hurricane. While we are back to meeting in person without masks or mandates, I hesitate to say we are back to normal. In every facet of our lives, we are all navigating the changes, impacts, and challenges of this epic time in history. How we move forward as a society will be the hallmark of this time. Will we fight against the tide to restore old norms? Or will we embrace the opportunity to create something new? College Beyond has a keen eye on the effect the pandemic has had and will continue to have on systemic inequity in education. Our team has chosen to use this time when the pandemic has laid bare the gross inequities in higher education to challenge the status quo and create a new normal, one in which all students have a path to economic mobility through post-secondary education. Our new normal must start now.

While we await the studies of the long-term impact of the pandemic on education, our team is seeing the cumulative effects now. Our students are exhausted from the financial, mental, and emotional gymnastics necessary to cope with the lack of resources and loss of family to covid and friends to violence. Imagine doing all of this while trying to successfully matriculate and navigate the college experience, particularly for the Greater New Orleans region, doing this while trying to rebuild after Hurricane Ida. This is the reality

for our students. And, the data will show that students wanted to pursue an education even through the pandemic. However, this recent year proved to be too much. College enrollment is down city-wide which mirrors a national decline in enrollment.

However, we find hope that College Beyond continues to be a guard against the attrition of students from disadvantaged backgrounds. While our 2021-2022 retention rate is below our three-year average, it is five points greater than campus-wide rates at local universities for the same year. For context: the College Beyond rate includes Pell-eligible students only, while campus-wide rates reflect the entire campus population. This reinforces the idea that financial and social-emotional support is necessary to help students persist, especially in difficult times.

As 2022 comes to a close, we would be remiss not to celebrate our wins. We are so happy to welcome two fantastic people, Destiny Brown and Carolyn Le, as new success coaches on our team. You can read more about them on page 20. We also entered a new phase of growth for College Beyond as we have opened registration for our first Masterclass in Coaching in 2023. We cannot wait to share our model with passionate professionals across the country. You can learn more about this endeavor on page 22.

We are also beaming with pride at the amazing accomplishments our students are making.

Jamyre Patrick, a senior International Studies Major, participated in the Junior United Nations Summit this spring in New York City with students from around the world. And, Mahogany Keen, a senior Marketing major, accepted a marketing internship with our new corporate partner, Cytiva. Imad Abdelmajeed, a senior Electrical Engineering major, completed a summer internship as a utility intern with our long-time corporate supporter, Entergy. These are just a few of the examples of our students making their mark and carving out their futures.

OUR THEORY OF CHANGE

College Beyond is built around the insight that the college completion gap stems not just from inequalities in economic capital (money), but from inequalities in social and cultural capital as well.

Among affluent students, it is not only wealth itself that enhances a student's chances of college success. The social and cultural capital associated with wealth also makes a difference.

Through traditions, policies, and processes, higher education explicitly and implicitly values the cultural and social know-how associated with higher socioeconomic strata. This can leave students from marginalized groups feeling unsupported, disconnected, and undervalued.

We are committed to bringing excellent, holistic resources to students who face the longest odds of college graduation.

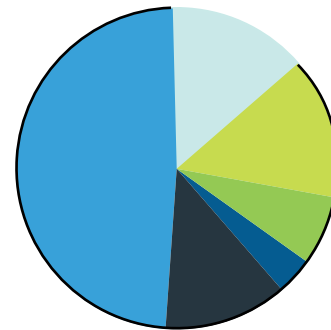

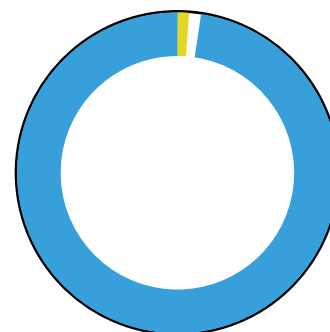

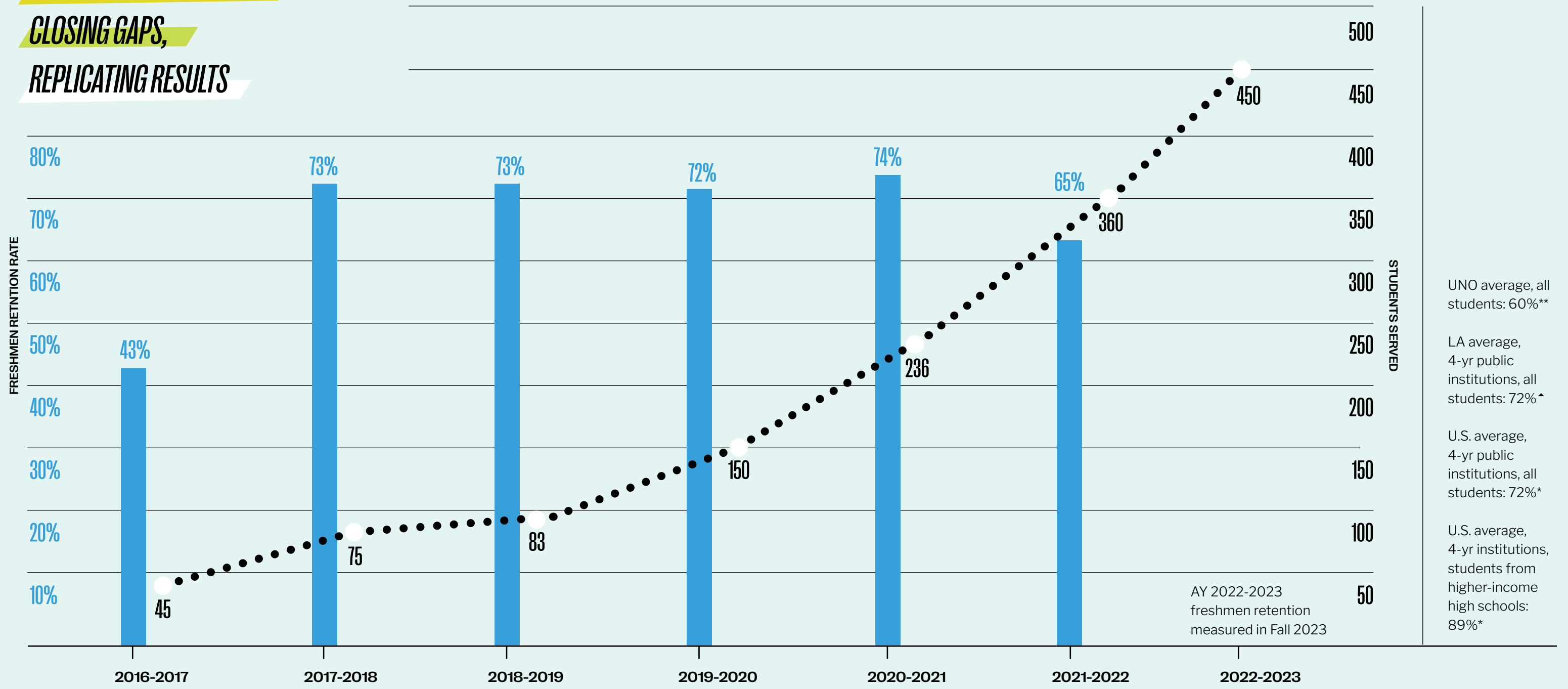

Tell us about yourself and where you're from.

I made some negative choices in my youth that had a long-lasting impact on my adult life. I was determined to turn my struggles into lessons and improve my life day by day.

What's your major? What are your future plans after graduation?

I am currently a senior Interdisciplinary Studies Major with a concentration in Behavioral Studies. I am scheduled for graduation in the Spring of 2023. After graduation, I plan to enroll in a Master of Social Work program, while continuing to work as a case manager at a behavioral health facility. My short-term goal is to become a clinical social worker. In the future, I hope to open my own professional counseling practice.

Talk about what you do as Lead Ambassador/ Program Associate. Why did you decide to take on this role?

In this role, I plan and manage events for College Beyond students and support the coaches when needed. I also assist students with connecting them to resources and completing important tasks such as filling out the FAFSA or SNAP Benefits. I decided to take this role so that I could actively participate in all of the amazing things College Beyond provides for us.

STRATEGIC PLAN

College Beyond has identified a holistic, high-impact model with strong potential for scaling and replication. While our early success has taught us a great deal about college persistence, we are excited to grow and explore in our quest to contribute an effective and efficient solution to improve college completion rates for underserved students.

In an effort to codify, validate, and scale our solution, we must expand the number of students we serve and reach a critical mass for robust data outcomes and analysis. As a result, we are devoting the next two years to strategic growth and in-depth evaluation in order to create a data-informed plan to effectively scale our model and grow our impact by 2024.

TO MEET THESE GOALS, WE SEEK \$2 MILLION IN INVESTMENTS OVER THE NEXT TWO YEARS.

This year we made significant strides toward accomplishing our goals:

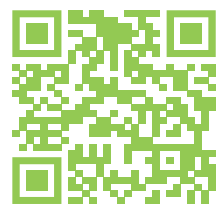
We have commissioned an external evaluation. With the support of the Kresge Foundation, we have secured an external evaluator to assist us in measuring our impact over the last six years. The final report will be published in early 2023. Here are the five major questions we are exploring:

- 1 How does College Beyond compare to other college access and persistence programs?
- 2 How do persistence and retention for College Beyond students compare to state and federal rates? How do College Beyond students compare to peers who are similar and to those from higher-income backgrounds?
- 3 How effective are College Beyond supports in terms of social-emotional health and college success? Which support makes the biggest difference?
- 4 What is the return on investment (ROI) for university partners investing in College Beyond?
- 5 What's the return on investment (ROI) on coaching compared to financial support?

WE'RE HOSTING A

COACHING MASTERCLASS

This Masterclass is our first step toward building a train-the-trainer program. The five-hour virtual course will focus on the essentials of coaching with a trauma-informed approach. Additionally, this professional development opportunity will feature six months of coaching to help participants apply principles in their daily interactions with students and learn additional coaching techniques. This opportunity is designed for any college access and success professional, educator, or mentor. Our team is excited to support passionate professionals from across the country and expand our impact outside of the Greater New Orleans Region.
