Ten years ago, a group of educators at Cohen College Prep came together to confront a challenge facing countless Louisiana students: staggering college dropout rates. The previous year, Cohen had celebrated a milestone achievement, having 100% of its senior class admitted to college. Yet within months, many of those same students began to drop out at alarming rates.

For most, it wasn't a lack of talent or motivation that stopped them. It was the obstacles that no one had fully prepared them for: a \$300 book bill, an unexpected transportation cost, a struggle to balance full-time coursework with full-time work. Their success depended not only on academic preparation but on navigating the complex, often unforgiving realities of the college transition.

From this realization, College Beyond was born, with a simple but powerful mission: to close the gap between college access and college success.

Today, our work stands at the intersection of equity, persistence, and economic mobility. In Louisiana, only 12 percent of low-income students earn a college degree, yet the data is clear: a college education remains one of the most effective drivers of long-term economic opportunity. Over the past decade, we've learned that the value of higher education extends far beyond earnings; it's also about exposure, understanding, and shared humanity.

In an era marked by polarization and isolation, college remains one of the few places where young people encounter perspectives vastly different from their own. Where a city kid befriends a classmate from a rural parish. Where students from different racial, cultural, and economic backgrounds learn together, debate ideas, and begin to see the world through each other's eyes. These experiences shape not only our workforce but our democracy.

At College Beyond, we believe universities hold profound power, not only to uplift communities through economic opportunity, but also to shape an informed, empathetic, and engaged citizenry.

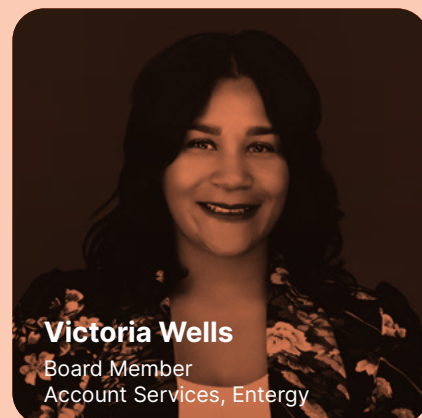
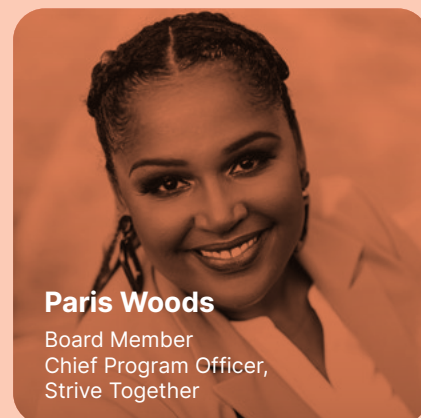
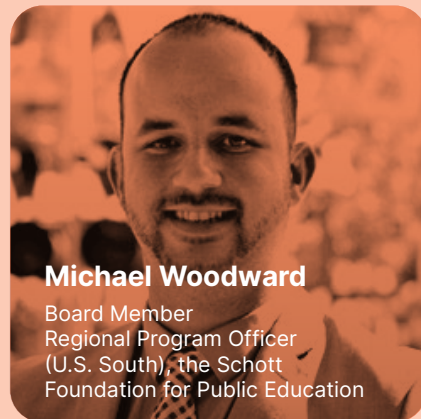
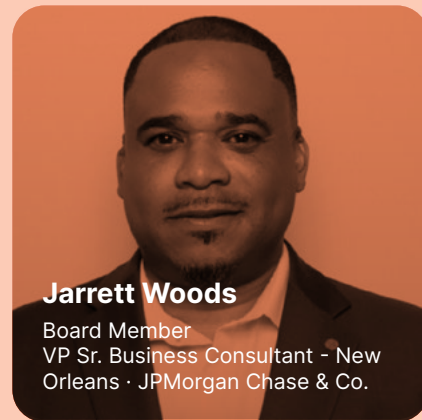
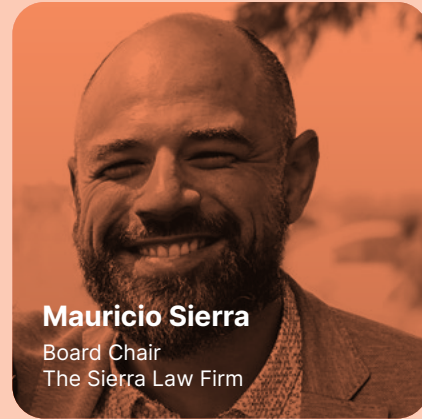
Over the past decade, we've supported thousands of students on their journey through higher education, partnering with institutions such as the University of New Orleans, Southeastern Louisiana University, Loyola University, and Northshore Technical Community College. This past year, we expanded our reach to include high school and community partners like InspireNOLA, Benjamin Franklin High School, and Son of a Saint, and launched innovative scholarship programs such as the McCollum Scholars Program, the Tolmas Scholars, and our Persistence Scholarship. Together, these initiatives strengthen the pipeline of prepared, confident, and well-supported students across the region.

In 2024, we launched an ambitious strategic plan that will triple the number of students we serve over the next three years. As we enter our second decade, our vision is clear: to expand access, deepen impact, and ensure that every student in southeastern Louisiana, regardless of income or background, has the opportunity not just to attend college, but to graduate and thrive.

College Beyond's first ten years have proven what is possible when we invest in both access and belonging. The next ten will be about scaling that impact, transforming systems, strengthening partnerships, and ensuring that every student's potential becomes Louisiana's future.

student survey outcomes

Our Student Success Survey provides coaches with data-driven, predictive insights into the challenges students may face as they transition into college. The survey captures information across three key areas: academic and soft skills preparation, financial readiness and responsibilities, and students' socio-emotional wellbeing.

Together, these insights give our team a more complete understanding of each student's circumstances, allowing coaches to deliver more targeted, proactive support that addresses potential barriers before they become obstacles to persistence.

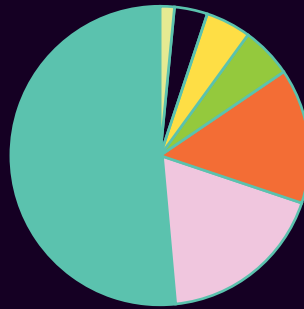

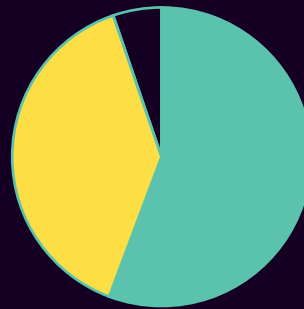

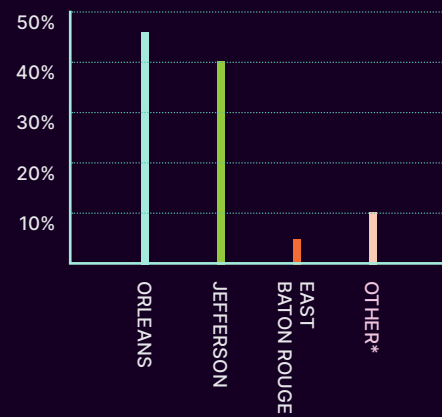

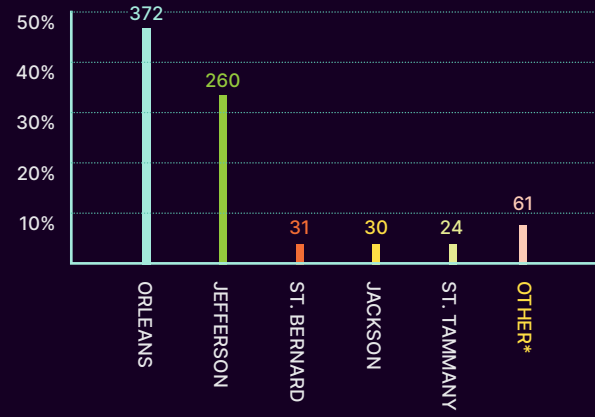

Sanaya McNeil

For Sanaya, psychology with a pre-medical concentration was never just an academic choice—it was a reflection of who she is. With a natural curiosity about people and a deep desire to understand both herself and those around her, she found her calling in the pursuit of knowledge. “I love learning, and I know the money will follow,” she says confidently. As a first-generation college student with roots in Metairie and New Orleans, Sanaya has embraced every opportunity to grow academically and personally.

Navigating college as a first-gen student came with its challenges—chief among them, simply knowing what steps to take. Learning to take initiative, seek out resources, and build a support system became essential. “You really have to make it happen for yourself,” she reflects. Balancing adulthood with academic life is an ongoing process, but giving herself grace and putting her best self forward in all aspects has been key.

A chance hallway encounter with College Beyond’s Coach Cam became a turning point in Sanaya’s college journey. She doesn’t believe in coincidences, and finding College Beyond proved to be a crucial support system. From helping her organize her schedule to building her confidence, the program has been a steady presence. “Coach Cam taught me how to double dutch, and Coach Carolyn is holding the ropes,” she shares, illustrating the invaluable guidance she has received. As she prepares for the next step—applying to graduate programs—she wishes for even more time with her coach.

As president of her Delta Sigma Theta chapter, Sanaya has taken on leadership roles that allow her to serve others. Organizing events, volunteering, and shadowing professionals have given her a deeper understanding of social issues and strengthened her ability to lead. She’s proud to create opportunities for her peers while giving back to the community. For students considering College Beyond, her advice is simple: “Do it! There’s nothing to lose and everything to gain. The earlier you get involved, the better foundation you build for yourself.”

With her ambition, heart for service, and dedication to learning, Sanaya is creating a future where she can make a meaningful difference—both in the psychology field and beyond.

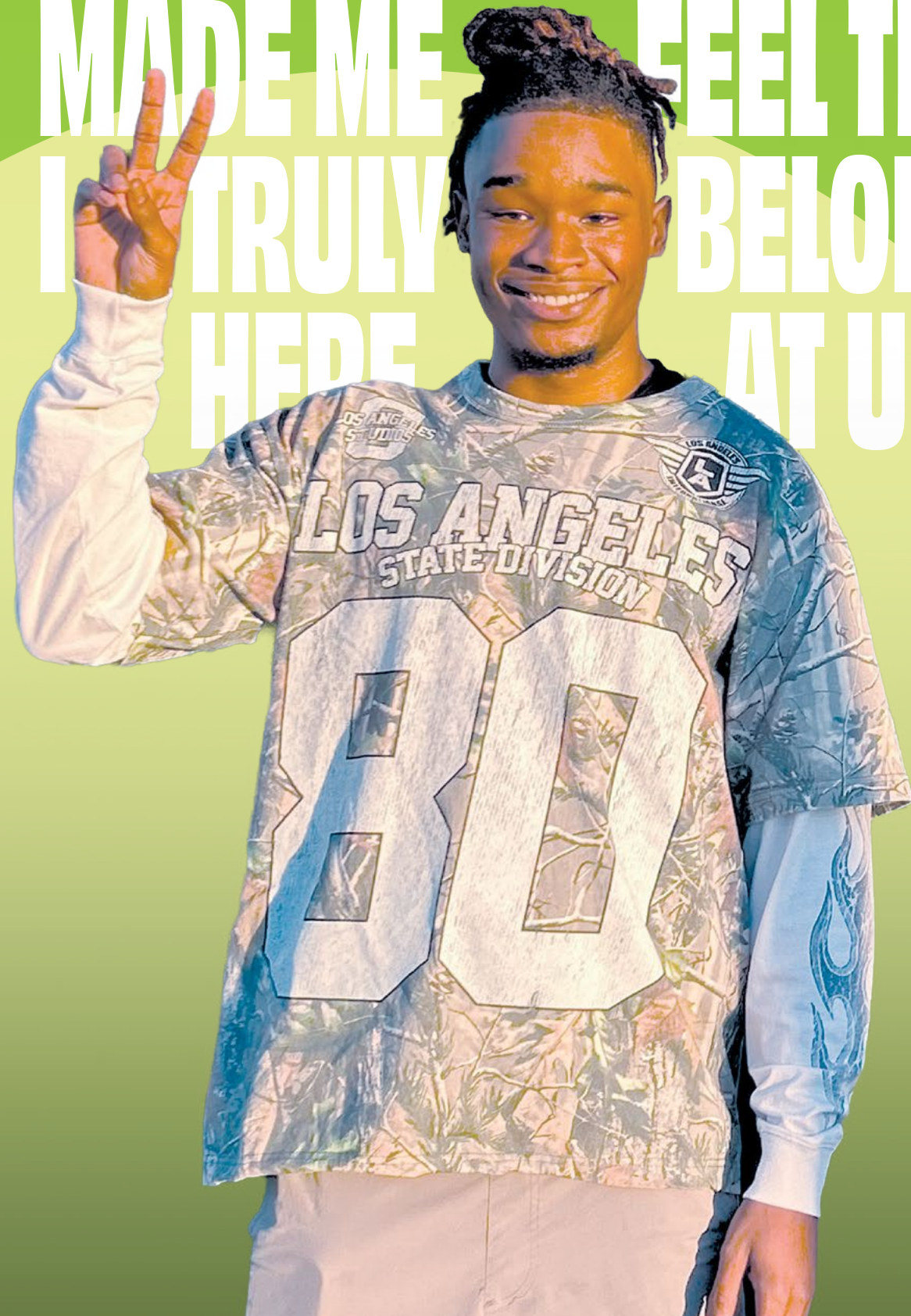

THE AFFORDABILITY CRISIS

The College Beyond Persistence Scholarship provides up to \$3,000 to active College Beyond students facing enrollment holds due to outstanding balances. The loss of a part-time job, an unexpected car repair or a mistake in paperwork can present an insurmountable financial hurdle for some students. The Persistence Scholarship provides both financial support as well as intensive coaching and budgeting sessions to ensure recipients have a clear and actionable plan in place to fund their education moving forward. During our first year, College Beyond was able to provide \$30,248 in Persistence Scholarships, enabling 13 students, who would have otherwise been unable to enroll, to continue their educational journey.

How has receiving the scholarship impacted your ability to pursue your academic goals?

Receiving this scholarship has 100% helped me continue this semester without issue. My original plan was to take out student loans but with this scholarship I was able to save a lot of money.

How has College Beyond helped shape your college experience and personal growth?

Since the day I signed up College Beyond has helped me grow so much in so many ways as an individual. **My coach Ms. Destiny specifically walked me through my financial situation time after time.** She and the other coaches also give great feedback and encouragement. **College Beyond has made me feel that I truly belong here at UNO.** I think the coaches are great when it comes to asking for advice or guidance in any way. College Beyond is great in helping their students navigate their academic journey. **The Coaches are all really great. For students who are lost and looking for where they belong - they offer a space to be vulnerable and be open - they offer that.**

What have you learned or accomplished so far that you feel proud of, thanks in part to receiving this scholarship?

I am really trying to be more open. I realized that **experience is what's gonna bring me closer to my career and myself and I can't run from it.** [...] feeling a lot of different emotions and gaining the self-awareness to explore why [...] **but I still push forward to challenge myself.**

McCollum scholars program

summary of impact

The McCollum Scholars Program represents College Beyond's most comprehensive investment in college access and long-term success for high-achieving, low-income students in New Orleans. Launched in partnership with CJ McCollum, the program pairs up to \$80,000 in need-based scholarship support with sustained, trauma-informed advising to ensure students not only enroll in college, but persist through graduation and into meaningful careers.

What sets the McCollum Scholars Program apart is its long-term design. Rather than limiting support to tuition alone, scholars receive flexible funding and four years of wraparound coaching that responds to the real barriers students face once they arrive on campus. This combination of last-dollar financial support and consistent relational guidance reflects College Beyond's belief that talent is universal, but opportunity is not.

Juan Gomez

Juan Gomez's journey from Colombia to earning his Ph.D. acceptance at UC Riverside is a powerful testament to his resilience, ambition, and a passion for scientific discovery. A first-generation college student, Juan moved to the U.S. in ninth grade, graduated from high school in Metairie, LA and became a U.S. citizen during his sophomore year of college. His path has been defined by a deep commitment to using science to improve humanity's relationship with the environment.

Driven by a desire to create sustainable solutions, Juan pursued Chemistry, seeing it as a tool to analyze and innovate in ways that could lead to greener technologies. While financial challenges often meant sacrificing aspects of the traditional college experience, Juan's determination never wavered. Balancing coursework with flexible jobs, he stayed focused on his long-term goal of contributing to scientific advancements that promote sustainability.

College Beyond played a pivotal role in Juan's journey, offering guidance and accountability at key moments. His coach encouraged him to attend career fairs, explore Research Experiences for Undergraduates (REUs), and stay on track with his Ph.D. application process. Through an REU at Colorado State University, Juan gained hands-on experience in materials synthesis and electrochemistry, solidifying his interest in research and higher education.

Juan's advice to future students is simple yet profound: "There are no dumb questions—well, maybe there are—but just ask. You won't get anywhere if you stay quiet. And don't be fake—if you don't feel welcome where you are, try something new." As he begins his Ph.D. journey at UC Riverside, Juan continues to inspire others with his curiosity, authenticity, and commitment to making a meaningful impact on the world.

How has receiving the scholarship impacted your ability to pursue your academic goals?

It lifts a huge pressure off of me and my mom. It is really calming to know that **combined with this and FAFSA makes paying for college affordable for us.**

How has College Beyond helped shape your college experience and personal growth?

I have made so many new friends and a lot of them I still talk to. **I love talking to y'all.** Coach Destiny is a great listener and at the end **she always asks me "Ok, so what are you gonna do now?"** The way that College Beyond communicates in email, **the way y'all talk, has helped me communicate to people in my life in and out of school.**

What would you say to other students considering applying for this scholarship about its impact on your journey?

Just tell the truth and put your truth out there and take risks. It's also ok if you don't get it, because there are always more opportunities and you can see it as an opportunity to apply for other opportunities. **The interview process itself was an experience that taught me a lot about advocating for myself.**

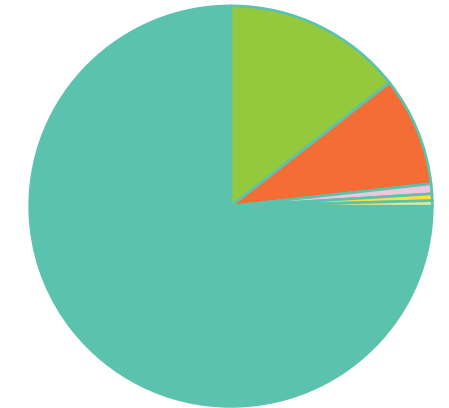

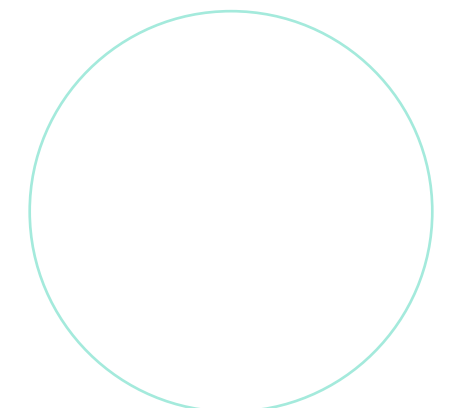
