HERO



Oksana, Germany

On February 24, 2022, a text from Kyiv changed Oksana Mandryka's life. Safe in Munich, she felt shock and guilt. Within days, she turned purpose into action, raising funds for friends on the frontlines. Four years later, through Volia Fund and partner networks, her volunteer team has delivered \$2.1 million in aid: 96 vehicles, 112 drones, 209 radios, 29 Starlinks, and 56 generators. Every number means a mission made possible and a life protected. Oksana's transparency keeps donors close and trust strong. "\$25 can warm a soldier's feet," she says. "\$500 can keep a truck rolling toward safety." Each gift moves hope forward—one act at a time.

Behind every successful delivery there is documentation that list purchases, costs, and invoices. “Transparency keeps trust strong,” she explained. “Even though most donors know me personally, reporting is what sustains that trust over the years.” That personal connection, she says, “helps donors understand that their gifts go exactly where they should.” Across the diaspora, supporters respond not just to headlines but to humanity: real names, real needs, and clear results.

Tung, Portugal

Born in Ukraine to a Vietnamese family, Tung Fam has always called Ukraine home. When Russia's invasion began, he found a new way to serve—from abroad. Since 2022, Tung has mobilized donations through hundreds of micro-campaigns to supply Ukrainian defenders. He leads a Europe-based volunteer network that, with partners like the Blagula Bilen Foundation, sources, equips, and delivers lifesaving vehicles, drones, radios, antidrone devices, and more. For Tung, every delivery honors unseen heroes. "It's not a sprint—it's a marathon," he says, turning endurance into hope.

Once inside the country, Tung's team, including Rita Sazonova and Anton Sazonov, takes over. They deliver vehicles directly to units when possible, performing repairs as needed, and coordinating delivery by other team members to ensure the vehicles reach the intended military units.

Today, after hundreds of hours refining their methods, Volia Fund's vehicle pipeline runs smoothly and transparently. Still, resources are always tight. "The challenge now," Tung says, "is not how to work, it's how to keep going fast enough to provide vehicles and supplies with limited funds."

Yuliia, USA

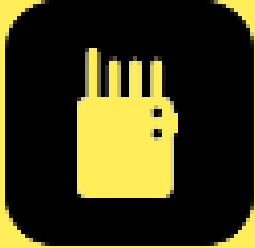
A young veteran grips the parallel bars, testing a new prosthetic leg—his first steps shaky but determined. In that quiet, hard moment of recovery, UAble’s work begins. Founded by Yuliia Matvieieva, a clinician and mental health expert, UAble helps Ukrainian veterans heal body and mind together. Since 2024, it has provided prosthetics, rehabilitation, and psychological support for Ukrainian Defenders, including care for those with vision loss. Through partnerships with international clinicians, Ukrainian professionals gain lasting expertise. Yuliia’s guiding question—“If not me, then who?”—drives a mission that restores more than limbs. With your support, pain becomes purpose, and independence returns—one step at a time.

In 2025, the UAble initiative provided 111 months of rehabilitation for limb loss survivors, coordinated 3 humanitarian missions with US medical specialist teams and provided customized prosthetics for 7 Ukrainian Defenders with complex limb loss.

2026 STRATEGIC PRIORITIES



Ukraine based programs:

- Operationalize a fleet of 22 emergency evacuation vehicles
- Distribute 20 high-capacity power generation units
- Deliver at least 2,000 critical anti-drone components
- Support 100 mental health therapy sessions for defenders with vision loss
- Fund prosthetic fittings for 10 individuals to restore mobility and enhance quality of life
- Support 60 months of comprehensive, specialized physical rehabilitation
- Coordinate three medical missions of medical experts to work with Ukraine providers

US based programs:

- Partner with the Toloka Center to deliver three community-building initiatives
- Facilitate eight peer support group sessions for adolescents navigating transition to the U.S.
- Deliver four Ukrainian cultural heritage events to foster community engagement
- Design and implement six Ukrainian-language storytelling and literacy sessions for youth
