

CONTACT	These offences typically require direct contact caused by the Reported Person to the Affected Person, resulting from reckless, careless, or deliberate actions. However, no contact is required when the actions of the Reported Person are attempted.
Attempt to Elbow	The Reported Person attempted to cause direct contact in the manner specified below (see Elbowing).
Attempt to Kick	The Reported Person attempted to cause direct contact in the manner specified below (see Kicking).
Attempt to Strike	The Reported Person attempted to cause direct contact in the manner specified below (see Striking).
Attempt to Trip	The Reported Person attempted to cause direct contact in the manner specified below (see Tripping).
Elbowing	The Reported Person caused direct contact with their elbow to the Affected Person. Typically, this may be a swinging or leading motion with the elbow, which may be considered excessive.
Kicking	The Reported Person caused direct contact with their leg or foot to the Affected Person. Typically, this may be a premeditated action, which may be considered unsporting.
Striking	The Reported Person caused direct contact with their arms or hands to the Affected Person. Typically, this may be a punch, slap, or an open-handed motion which may be considered unsporting.
Tripping	The Reported Person caused direct contact to the leg or foot of the Affected Person. Typically, this may be an extension of a limb or any other action which may be considered to cause the Affected Person to lose balance, stumble, or fall.
Spitting	The Reported Person caused or attempted to cause direct contact with saliva or other fluid in or from the body to the Affected Person. Typically, this may be a behaviour following other conduct in an unsporting confrontation.
Fighting	The Reported Person caused direct contact to the Affected Person whilst participating in a fighting situation. Typically, this may be any grappling, pushing, or other restrictive motions, which may be considered excessive or unsporting.
Tunnelling	The Reported Person caused direct contact to the foot, legs, or hips of an airborne and vulnerable Affected Person. Typically, this may be a premeditated action, which causes the Affected Person to tip forwards, backwards, or sideways, and prevents them from landing in a safe manner.
Assault	The Reported Person caused direct contact to the Affected Person, generally, or with an object. Typically, this may be any conduct that does not categorically satisfy the definition of any offence listed above, or throwing objects at the Affected Person.
Endanger With Blood	The Reported Person caused or attempted to cause direct contact with blood to the Affected Person. Typically, this may involve the Reported Person's own blood or another's, transferred skin-to-skin, or on an object such as their uniforms or a basketball.
Avoidable Contact with Official	The Reported Person caused direct contact to the Affected Person, who is acting in the capacity as an Official. Typically, this may involve contact that is unreasonable, and not accidental or incidental.

NON-CONTACT	These offences typically require verbal or non-verbal communication by the Reported Person to the Affected Person. However, there is no requirement that the conduct is received negatively by the Affected Person when the actions of the Reported Person are unsporting.
Disputing Decisions	The Reported Person made known their objections of an Official's decision or order beyond what is reasonable. Typically, this may involve behaviour punishable beyond the powers of the referees.
Offensive Language	The Reported Person used language inappropriate for the circumstances and/or in an inappropriate manner. Typically, this may include swearing, insults, accusations of bias, or other anti-social language.
Obscene Gesture	The Reported Person made hand signals or other motions to mimic an inappropriate act. Typically, this may include rude, lewd, offensive, or suggestive actions.
Threatening or Putting in Fear	The Reported Person behaved in a manner that causes or is likely to cause another to feel unsafe. Typically, this may include verbal or non-verbal threats or conduct or attempts to intimidate.

OTHER	These offences typically require behaviour that is unsporting, generally. There is no requirement that the conduct directly or indirectly affects another person, but otherwise interferes with or is detrimental to the image of basketball.
Cause Damage or Injury	The Reported Person is directly responsible for damage to facilities or equipment, or injury to the Affected Person. Typically, this is a result of actions considered unsporting and not in the course of general play.
Unsportsmanlike Behaviour	The Reported Person behaved in an unsporting manner, generally. Typically, this may involve showing dissent or poor conduct beyond what is reasonably acceptable.
Gross Breach of Code	The Reported Person explicitly breached the relevant Code of Conduct in a manner that is without basketball justification. Typically, this is relevant when other offences are alleged.
Bring Basketball into Disrepute	The Reported Person behaved in a manner that attracts negative attention to themselves and to basketball. Typically, this reflects poorly on basketball as a sport and would deter others from participating or spectating.

ADMINISTRATIVE	These offences typically concern the participation of the Reported Person, or behaviour or interference with basketball procedures or operations.
Participate Whilst Suspended	The Reported Person participated in any registered or volunteer capacity whilst currently serving a suspension for prior Reportable Conduct. Typically, this may involve playing, coaching, or performing the duties of a technical official, on gameday or maintaining active involvement in training environments.
Contempt	The Reported Person behaved or communicated inappropriately or disorderly prior to, during, or following tribunal proceedings. Typically, this may involve directly ignoring directions of a tribunal, blatant violations of expectations and procedure, or other negative or anti-social conduct.
Cheating	The Reported Person manipulated or attempted to manipulate the result of a game or to compromise the integrity of the competition. Typically, this may involve inaccurate recording of statistics, deliberate improper execution of timing duties, falsifying participation of players or coaches, or tampering with equipment.
