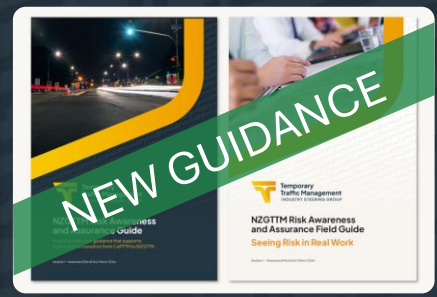
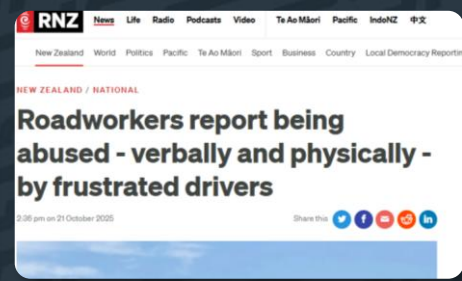

## Our workstreams

The ISG has five workstreams: Training and Competency; Procurement; Good Practice; Assurance; and Communications & Engagement. Each has a key role to play in supporting the transition to a more risk-based approach to TTM.



### Training and Competency

New training and qualifications are being developed to reflect a risk-based approach to TTM, empowering people to manage risk on site and formally recognising skills development.



### Procurement

Risk-based TTM will require a fresh look at how TTM services are procured. The Procurement workstream is developing shared principles to support the sector through this evolution.



### Good Practice

The Good Practice workstream has built a process and data repository to capture and share best practice across the industry, maximising safety and value for communities as TTM evolves.



### Communications and Engagement

The Communications and Engagement workstream underpins our objectives to advocate, connect and share with the sector, managing the channels, content and connections that keep everyone informed and involved.



### Assurance

The Assurance workstream is working with sector stakeholders to advance how TTM quality is measured, ensuring assessment keeps pace with new risk-based skills and ways of working.

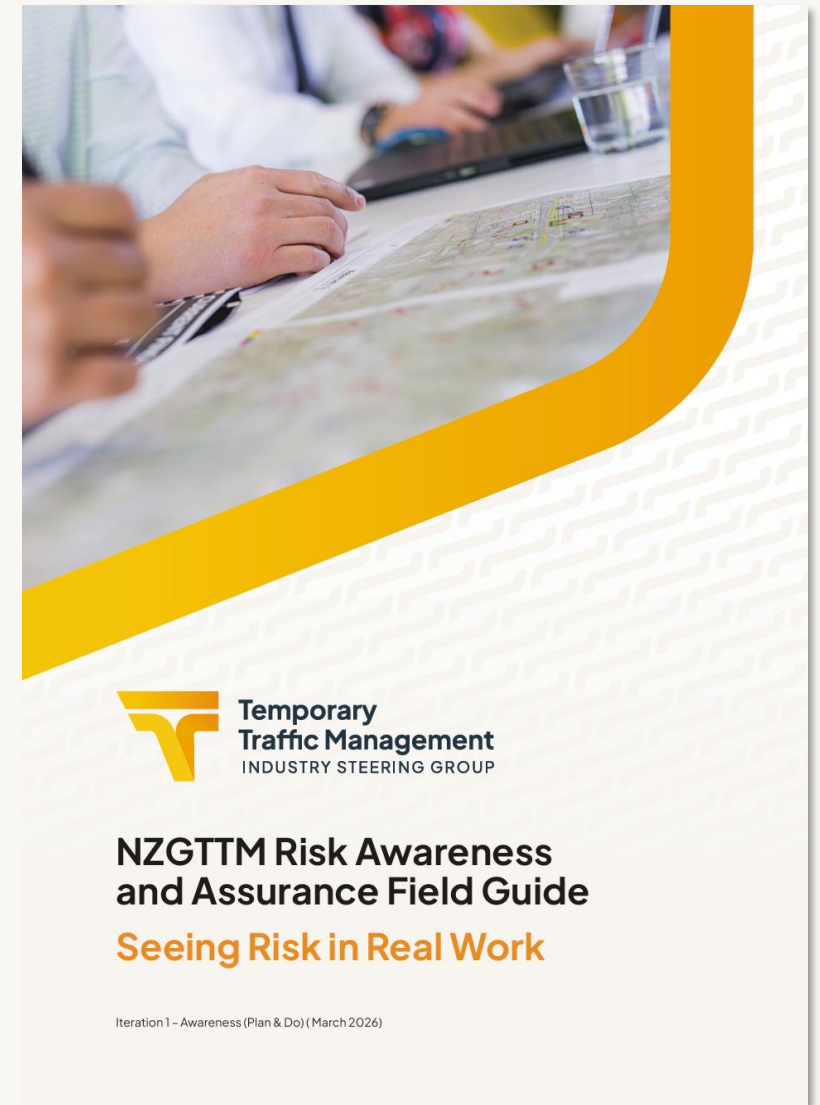
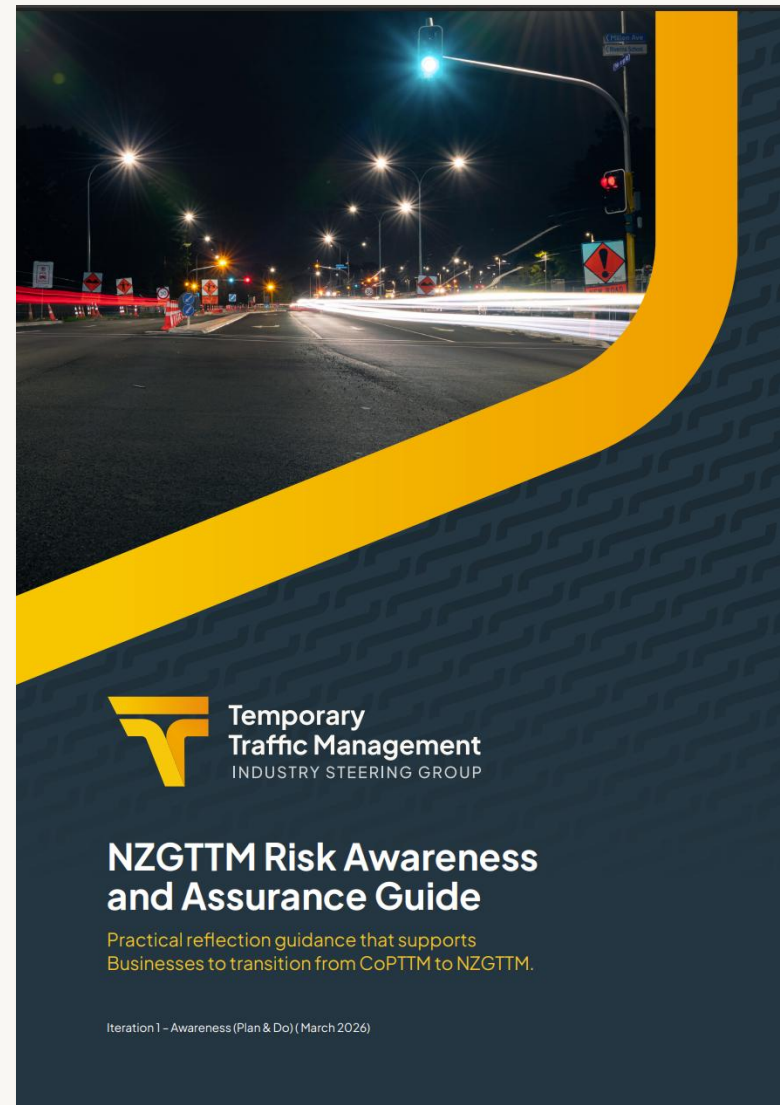

# NZGTTM Self- assessment Risk Awareness and Assurance Guide



The NZGTTM Self-assessment Risk Awareness and Assurance Guide and Field Guide are the practical tools developed to help the sector transition from CoPTTM to a risk-based approach.

Designed for use on the ground, they support crews, STMS, supervisors and planners to see and manage risk in real work conditions, not just on paper.



The Guide provides the framework, context and reflection guidance.

The Field Guide puts it into practice on site, with structured questions across the Plan and Do stages of the PDSA cycle.

Both are Iteration 1, focused on building risk awareness as the foundation of risk-capable TTM.

## How this guide helps New Zealand's Guide to Temporary Traffic Management (NZGTTM)

This TTM Supplier Self-Assurance Guide helps you transition from CoPTM to a risk-based approach as required by NZGTTM. It supports the three key principles of risk-capable TTM: Awareness, Understanding and Improvement.



### The Guide

-  **See the real work (Awareness)**  
Helps you see worksite risks beyond the TMP.
-  **Understand Risk**  
Helps you understand risks in real work conditions.
-  **Improve the System**  
Helps you share learnings and improve controls.

Helps you answer: "Did the controls work in real conditions?"

-  **Enhance Awareness**  
See actual risks at the worksite
-  **Build Understanding**  
Understand how risks change in the work.
-  **Drive Improvement**  
Discuss and improve controls across the contracting chain.

## TOOL 1

### TTM Risk Awareness and Assurance: Field Guide – Seeing Risk in Real Work

Iteration 1 – Awareness (Plan & Do) (31 March 2026)

#### TTM Risk Awareness Guide

This guide helps teams notice risk in real work conditions.

It supports the NZGTTM risk-based approach and should be used alongside the full guide for context and explanation.

#### Purpose:

These questions support the Plan and Do stages of the improvement cycle described in the Risk Awareness and Assurance Guide. They help teams to:

- understand the work and risks before starting and during the work
- recognise when work conditions differ from the plan
- notice whether controls work in real conditions
- support discussion with workers and other businesses

#### How to Use This Guide

This guide helps crews talk about how the work is actually happening on site.

Each question follows the same simple structure to support the risk awareness conversation.

Risk includes both what could go wrong and what helps the job go well.

##### 1. Yes / No

Confirm whether this is happening in the job right now (Yes or No).

##### 2. Describing the real work

- If you ticked "yes" – describe how this is helping work go well
- If you tick "no" – describe what is happening with work risk and its management

The answer should provide a description of how the work is actually being managed on site.

This helps uncover what is really being asked of the crew for this specific job.

##### 3. Plan and Job match slider

##### 4. Plan and Job match slider

Indicate on slider whether the work delivered:

- aligned with written Traffic Management Plan (TMP)
- required minor adjustments
- needed significant adaptation from written TMP

The slider helps show how the TMP lines up with the job on the day. If a gap is noted, then ask questions to learn how this happened.

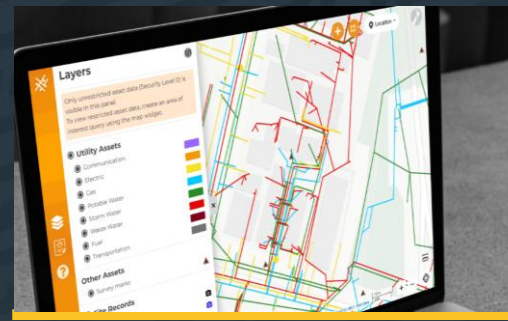
