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From prescription to understanding the work

CoPTTM approach

'Control through a prescribed setup'

- Static stop/go sites
- Repeated setup and pack down
- Evidence that controls are present

NZGTTM approach

'Manage risk in real work conditions'

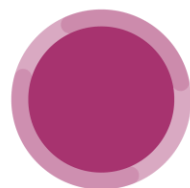
- Site specific risk assessment
- Controls designed for the corridor
- Evidence that controls are effective

Our job is not to eliminate every surprise.

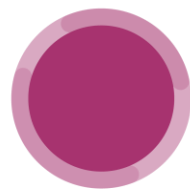
It is to build the capability to respond safely

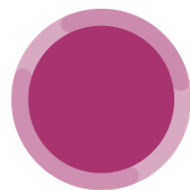
Whatipu Road: Designing for the Corridor



**120 poles on a 6km road only
4m wide in places**



CoPTTM – 6 weeks of disruption

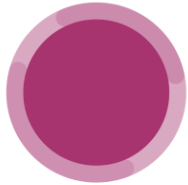


NZGTTM – 3 days of planning

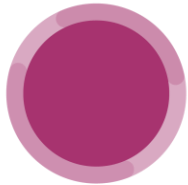


A practical example from the Field

Whatipu Road: Output for the Customers



7 DAYS – 120 Poles removed and reinstated



75% reduction in programme, 4 x productivity



10 DAYS – Full project completed



No safety incidents – happy stakeholders
