## Why Your Support Matters

Climate SMEs are building practical solutions for mitigation, resilience, and sustainable livelihoods, delivering ~80% of locally developed climate solutions in emerging markets.

Yet most climate finance still flows to large, lower-risk projects, leaving local innovators underfunded and invisible.

- Less than 2% of global climate finance reaches SMEs in the Global South.
- Climate SMEs face high costs of capital, currency volatility, rigid investor requirements, and ineffective public policies.

**Sponsorship and philanthropic support will help GCFF move from convening to implementation - building tools, partnerships, market intelligence, and policy pathways that make climate SMEs easier to find, finance, and scale.**

## GCFF's role

GCFF is an action-oriented, multi-stakeholder platform hosted by the Emerging Markets Investors Alliance ([EMIA](#))\*. It brings together 40+ investors, SMEs, policymakers, and ecosystem enablers to co-create strategies that localize capital, de-risk investment, and dismantle barriers to scalable finance.

- Launched in Jamaica in May 2025.
- A bridge between policy, capital, and SMEs.
- A global community focused on implementation and real outcomes, not just dialogue.
- Focused on locally led solutions and cross-sector partnerships.
- Guided by an Advisory Council of senior leaders from Asia, Africa, the Americas, and Europe.

## Three Bold Aims

### Drive policy change

Engage policymakers to unlock private capital, reduce investment barriers, and promote SME-friendly climate finance policies and incentives.

### Rewire climate finance

Bridge capital, policy, and local ecosystems to enable more equitable cross-border investment, develop innovative financial vehicles with local institutions, and advance de-risking solutions that improve scale.

### Elevate climate innovation

Showcase scalable Global South climate SMEs, connect them with investors, and strengthen investor-readiness - unlocking capital for the communities driving climate action on the ground.

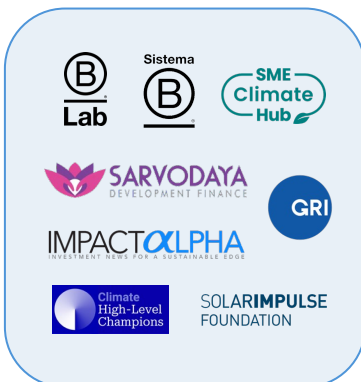

Strengthen investor-readiness for climate SMEs</b></p> <p>Deliver boot camps, technical assistance and peer-learning programs; promote ESG best practices; develop practical impact assessment framework/tool; support SMEs in building the skills and structures to become credible, visible, and investable.</p>

Engage policymakers</b></p> <p>Promote SME-friendly policies, tax incentives and regulatory allowances; facilitate policy dialogues with key stakeholders and strengthen role of local asset managers; support institutionalizing mandates for sovereign wealth and pension funds.</p>	<p><b>4. Enable local financial systems</b></p> <p>Engage local financial institutions; catalyze peer learning; co-create and pilot SME-aligned blended finance vehicles that aggregate investable climate SMEs and reflect local market realities.</p>
