Support survivors of human trafficking and individuals at high risk of exploitation by providing trauma-informed, survivor-centered services that promote safety, healing, empowerment, and long-term independence.

Who We Serve

Survivors of human trafficking, at-risk youth and adults, and those facing vulnerabilities of homelessness, foster care, the justice system, disability, poverty, and lack of access to stable employment or supportive services.

Project: Safe Haven Initiative

A comprehensive security transformation will strengthen the physical safety, privacy, and operational readiness of The Table, a survivor empowerment and drop-in center in downtown Sacramento, so survivors, youth, volunteers, and staff can receive and provide services in an environment designed for protection and healing.

How Grant Funds Will Be Used

- Privacy protection, including specialized window coverings to control visibility from outside the building.
- Secure entry improvements.
- Safety alert tools so staff can respond quickly during a threat.
- Facility improvements that reduce security vulnerabilities and create a safer environment for services, youth programming, and survivor support.

How the Project Is Transformational

These security enhancements shift safety from a daily concern to a built-in foundation of 3Strands' work. Privacy, controlled access, and a sense of physical safety are not optional comforts; they are essential conditions for healing and long-term recovery. By securing The Table, the project allows survivors to participate without fear of being seen, followed, or threatened.

Sustainability

Because The Table has a permanent facility, these upgrades become long-term assets that strengthen 3Strands' ability to serve survivors safely and consistently while reducing future emergency security costs.

What Is Unique About This Project

Addresses the safety realities of serving trafficking survivors. Services are only effective when the environment supports safety, dignity, autonomy, and trauma-informed care. The Safe Haven Initiative combines practical security upgrades with survivor-centered design, making the building itself part of the healing process.
