Deep Dive: The Five Phases of Cloud Migration

Cloud migration should follow a phased, iterative approach. Below is a detailed breakdown:



Phase 1

ASSESSMENT & DISCOVERY

- › Inventory all applications and infrastructure.
- › Map interdependencies between systems.
- › Evaluate app modernization readiness (e.g., containerization, microservices).
- › Tools: AWS Application Discovery Service, Azure Migrate, Dynatrace, Turbonomic

Phase 2

PLANNING

- › Define your target architecture and network topology.
- › Decide on a landing zone strategy (e.g., Azure Landing Zones, AWS Control Tower).
- › Document SLAs, RTO/RPO requirements, and data residency needs.
- › Create a prioritized migration backlog.

Phase 3

PILOT

- › Test rollback procedures and security postures.
- › Adjust based on feedback and issues before scaling.

Phase 4

MIGRATION & MODERNIZATION

- › Apply the 6R strategy (Rehost, Replatform, Refactor, Repurchase, Retire, Retain).
- › Automate provisioning with Infrastructure as Code (e.g., Terraform, CloudFormation, Bicep).
- › Leverage CI/CD pipelines for redeployments.
- › Use blue-green or canary deployments for critical systems.

Phase 5



POST-MIGRATION OPTIMIZATION

- › Configure autoscaling, backups, and monitoring.
- › Implement FinOps practices for cost control.
- › Modernization of rehosted applications.
- › Continuously reassess security and compliance configurations.
