Wood Supply – General

All pulp delivered to SwedPaper AB is either certified according to the FSC and/or PEFC DDS system. The raw material consists of bleached chemical pulp made from softwood and is produced from 100 % virgin fibres.

SwedPaper AB does not source wood from species listed on the CITES list or from countries covered by UN or EU sanctions or conflict areas defined by UNEP (PEFC Std. 2002:2020)

SwedPaper AB requires that all raw materials are sourced from responsible non-controversial sources. SwedPaper AB has routines to avoid¹:

- Illegally harvested wood, not complying with local, national or international laws.
- Wood harvested in violation of traditional and/or civil rights.
- Wood harvested from forests where high conservation values are threatened.
- Wood harvested in forests which are being converted to plantations, other vegetation or non-forest use.
- Wood from forests in which genetically modified trees are planted.
- Wood from companies not complying with trade and customs laws related to the forestry sector.

Reforestation

The amount of wood (standing stock in the forest) is constantly increasing in Sweden because the growth exceeds the harvest.

The Swedish Forest Act, introduced in 1903, legislates that forested land must be reforested after harvest, and since the first national forestry survey in 1923 the standing stock in Sweden has almost doubled in volume. Our main supplier normally uses replanting as a regeneration method.

Certification

SwedPaper AB applies the FSC and PEFC credit system and certified products are available as "FSC Mix Credit", "FSC Controlled Wood", "100 % PEFC certified" or "PEFC controlled sources".

According to the FSC CoC-standard only FSC CoC-certified customers can purchase FSC Controlled Wood products.

EUTR

SwedPaper AB, as a customer, is categorised as a trader. The only obligation of a trader is to keep records of volumes, suppliers and customers. Traders are not obliged, regarding to the EUTR, to search for any additional information about the origin of wood.

Our main supplier is often categorised as an operator and has therefore a Due Diligence System (DDS) in place to fulfil the EUTR. The Swedish government authority, The Swedish Forest Agency, Skogsstyrelsen, monitors our main suppliers EUTR-DDS system.
