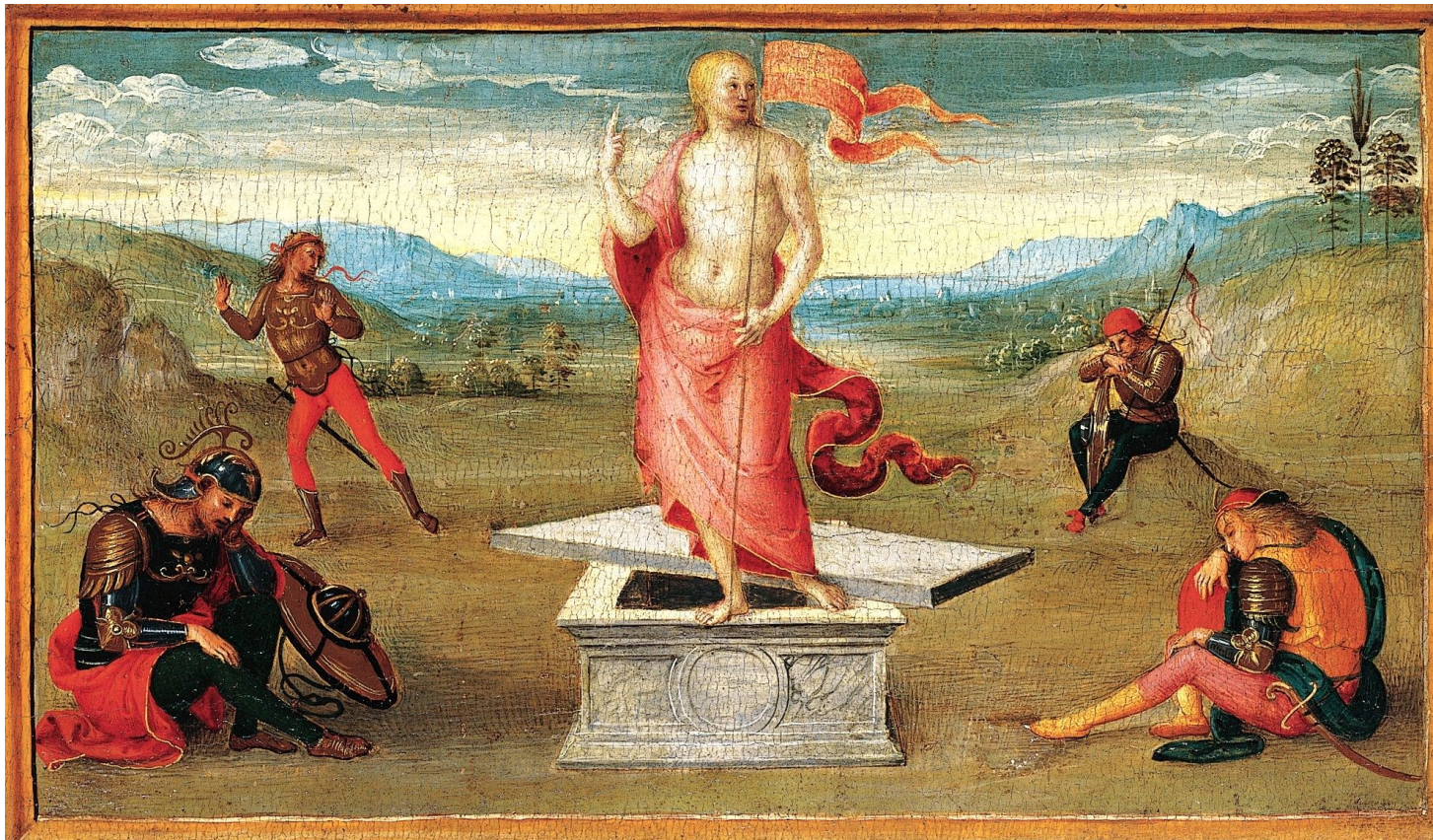

excerpt from the HOMILY OF HIS HOLINESS JOHN PAUL II
Vatican Basilica - Holy Saturday, 14 April 1979

"Do not be amazed; you seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen, he is not here" (Mk 16:5-6).

That great Moment does not allow us to remain outside ourselves; it compels us to enter our own humanity. Christ not only revealed to us the victory of life over death, but brought us, with his Resurrection, the New Life. He gave us this new life.

Here is how St Paul puts it: "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life" (Rom 6: 3-4).

The words: "(we) were baptized into his death" say a great deal. Death is the water in which Life is won back: the water "welling up to eternal life" (Jn 4:14). It is necessary to "immerse oneself" in this water, in this Death, *in order then to emerge from it as a New Man*, as a New Creature, as a new being, that is, *vivified by the Power of the Resurrection of Christ!*

This is the mystery of the Water, which we bless tonight, which we cause to be penetrated with the "light of Christ, with the New Life; it is the symbol of the power of the Resurrection!

This Water becomes, in the Sacrament of Baptism, the sign of the victory over Satan, over sin; the sign of *the victory* that Christ won by means of the cross, by means of Death and which he then brings to each of us: "Our old self was crucified with him so that the sinful body might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin" (Rom 6:6).

This is the night of the Great Awaiting. Let us wait in Faith, let us wait with all our human being for him who at dawn broke the tyranny of death and revealed the Divine Power of Life: He is our Hope.

fragmento de la HOMILÍA DE SU SANTIDAD JUAN PABLO II
Basílica Vaticana - Sábado Santo, 14 de abril de 1979

"No os asustéis. Buscáis a Jesús Nazareno, el crucificado; ha resucitado, no está aquí" (Mc 16, 5-6).

Ese gran momento no nos consiente permanecer fuera de nosotros mismos; nos obliga a entrar en nuestra propia humanidad. Cristo no sólo nos ha revelado la victoria de la vida sobre la muerte, sino que nos ha traído con su resurrección la nueva vida. Nos ha dado esta nueva vida.

He aquí cómo se expresa San Pablo: "¿O ignoráis que cuantos hemos sido bautizados en Cristo Jesús fuimos bautizados para participar en su muerte? Con El hemos sido sepultados por el bautismo para participar en su muerte, para que como El resucitó de entre los muertos por la gloria del Padre, así también nosotros vivamos una nueva vida" (Rom 6, 3-4).

Las palabras "hemos sido bautizados en su muerte" dicen mucho. La muerte es el agua en la que se reconquista la vida: el agua "que salta hasta la vida eterna" (Jn 4, 14). ¡Es necesario "sumergirse" en este agua; en esta muerte, *para surgir después de ella como hombre nuevo*, como nueva criatura, como ser nuevo, esto es, *vivificado por la potencia de la resurrección de Cristo!*

Este es el misterio del agua que esta noche bendecimos, que hacemos penetrar con la "luz de Cristo", que hacemos penetrar con la nueva vida: ¡es el símbolo de la potencia de la resurrección!

Este agua, en el sacramento del bautismo, se convierte en el signo *de la victoria* sobre Satanás, sobre el pecado; el signo de la victoria que Cristo ha traído mediante la cruz, mediante la muerte y *que nos trae después a cada uno*: "Nuestro hombre viejo ha sido crucificado para que fuera destruido el cuerpo del pecado y ya no sirvamos al pecado" (Rom 6, 6).

Es pues la noche de la gran espera. Esperemos en la fe, esperemos con todo nuestro ser humano a Aquel que al despuntar el alba ha roto la tiranía de la muerte, y ha revelado la potencia divina de la Vida: El es nuestra esperanza.
