"URBI ET ORBI"
MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE LEO XIV
EASTER 2026, Central Loggia of St Peter's Basilica



Brothers and sisters, through his resurrection, the Lord confronts us even more powerfully with the dramatic reality of our freedom. Before the empty tomb, we can be filled with hope and wonder, like the disciples, or with fear like the guards and the Pharisees, forced to resort to lies and subterfuge rather than acknowledge that the one who had been condemned is truly risen (cf. *Mt 28:11–15*)

In the light of Easter, let us allow ourselves to be amazed by Christ! Let us allow our hearts to be transformed by his immense love for us! Let those who have weapons lay them down! Let those who have the power to unleash wars choose peace! Not a peace imposed by force, but through dialogue! Not with the desire to dominate others, but to encounter them!

We are growing accustomed to violence, resigning ourselves to it, and becoming indifferent. Indifferent to the deaths of thousands of people. Indifferent to the repercussions of hatred and division that conflicts sow. Indifferent to the economic and social consequences they produce, which we all feel. There is an ever-increasing “globalization of indifference,” to borrow an expression dear to Pope Francis, who one year ago from this loggia addressed his final words to the world, reminding us: “What a great thirst for death, for killing, we witness each day in the many conflicts raging in different parts of the world!” (*Urbi et Orbi Message*, 20 April 2025).

The cross of Christ always reminds us of the suffering and pain that surround death and the agony it entails. We are all afraid of death, and out of fear we turn away, preferring not to look. We cannot continue to be indifferent! And we cannot resign ourselves to evil! Saint Augustine teaches: “If you fear death, love the resurrection!” (*Sermon 124, 4*). Let us too love the resurrection, which reminds us that evil is not the last word, because it has been defeated by the Risen One.

MENSAJE URBI ET ORBI
DEL SANTO PADRE LEÓN XIV

Hermanos y hermanas, el Señor, con su resurrección nos enfrenta con mayor intensidad aún al drama de nuestra libertad. Frente al sepulcro vacío podemos llenarnos de esperanza y asombro, como los discípulos, o de miedo, como los guardias y los fariseos, obligados a recurrir a la mentira y al engaño para no reconocer que aquel que había sido condenado verdaderamente ha resucitado (cf. *Mt 28,11-15*).

A la luz de la Pascua, ¡dejémonos sorprender por Cristo! ¡Dejemos que su inmenso amor por nosotros nos transforme el corazón! ¡Que quienes tienen armas en sus manos las abandonen! ¡Que quienes tienen el poder de desatar guerras, elijan la paz! No una paz impuesta por la fuerza, sino mediante el diálogo. No con la voluntad de dominar al otro, sino de encontrarlo.

Nos estamos acostumbrando a la violencia, nos resignamos a ella y nos volvemos indiferentes. Indiferentes ante la muerte de miles de personas. Indiferentes ante las secuelas de odio y división que siembran los conflictos. Indiferentes ante las consecuencias económicas y sociales que estos desencadenan y que, sin embargo, todos percibimos. Existe una “globalización de la indiferencia” cada vez más marcada, por retomar una expresión muy querida por el Papa Francisco, quien hace justo un año, desde esta loggia, dirigió al mundo sus últimas palabras, recordándonos: «Cuánta voluntad de muerte vemos cada día en los numerosos conflictos que afectan a diferentes partes del mundo» (*Mensaje Urbi et Orbi*, 20 abril 2025).

La cruz de Cristo nos recuerda siempre el sufrimiento y el dolor que rodean a la muerte, así como la angustia que esta conlleva. Todos tenemos miedo a la muerte y, por miedo, volteamos hacia otro lado, preferimos no mirar. ¡No podemos seguir siendo indiferentes! ¡No podemos resignarnos al mal! San Agustín enseña: «Si el morir te causa espanto, ama la resurrección» (*Sermón 124,4*). Amemos también nosotros la resurrección, que nos recuerda que el mal no tiene la última palabra, porque ha sido vencido por el Resucitado.
