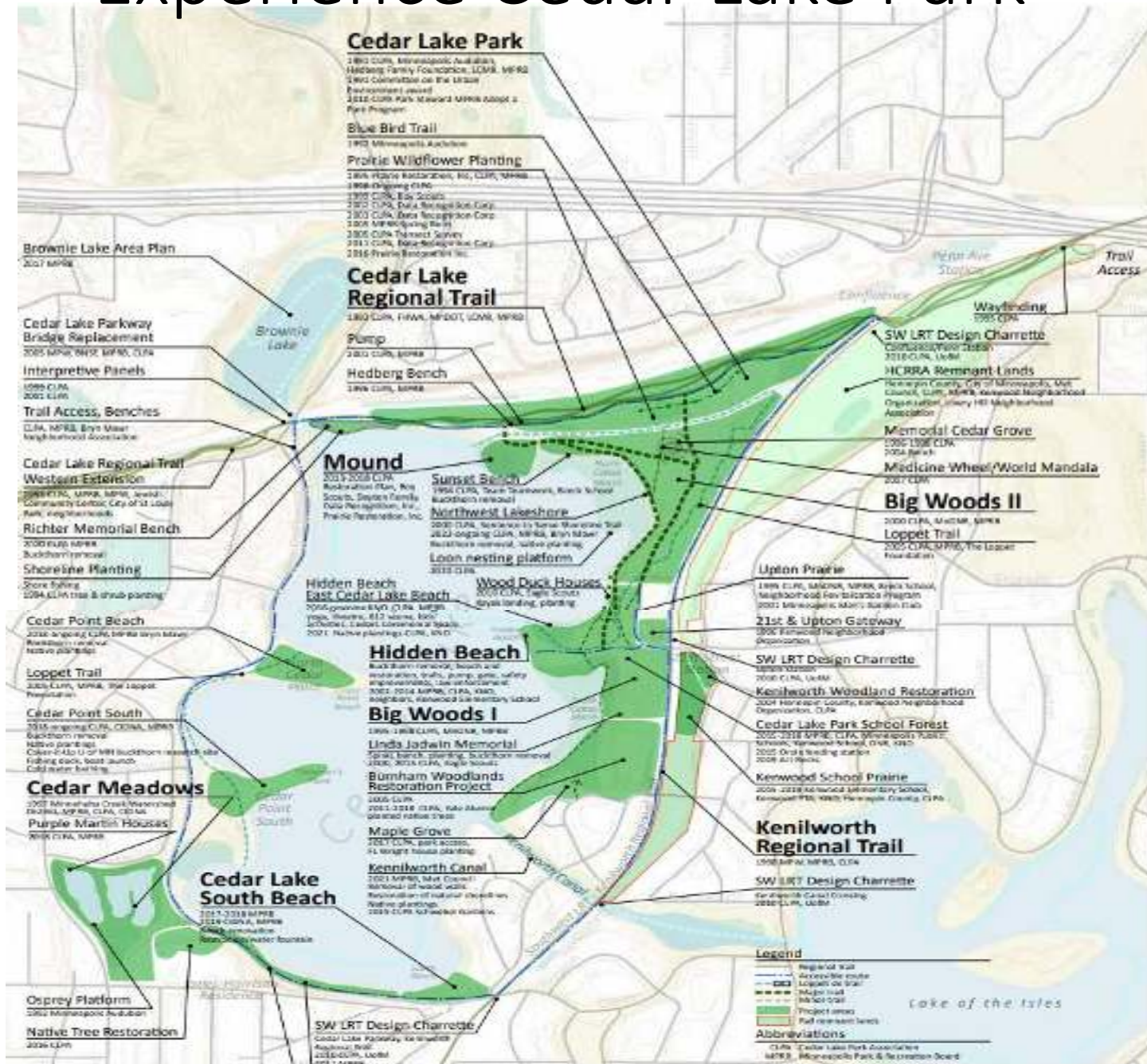

- Kenilworth Trail from West 21st St to Bryn Mawr Station closed until Fall 2024
- Kenilworth Trail from Midtown Greenway to West 21st anticipated to reopen 2025
- (North) Cedar Lake Trail east of Van White Blvd anticipated to reopen in 2025
- Due to efforts of CLPA and others, plans in place to “re-wild” the Kenilworth Corridor

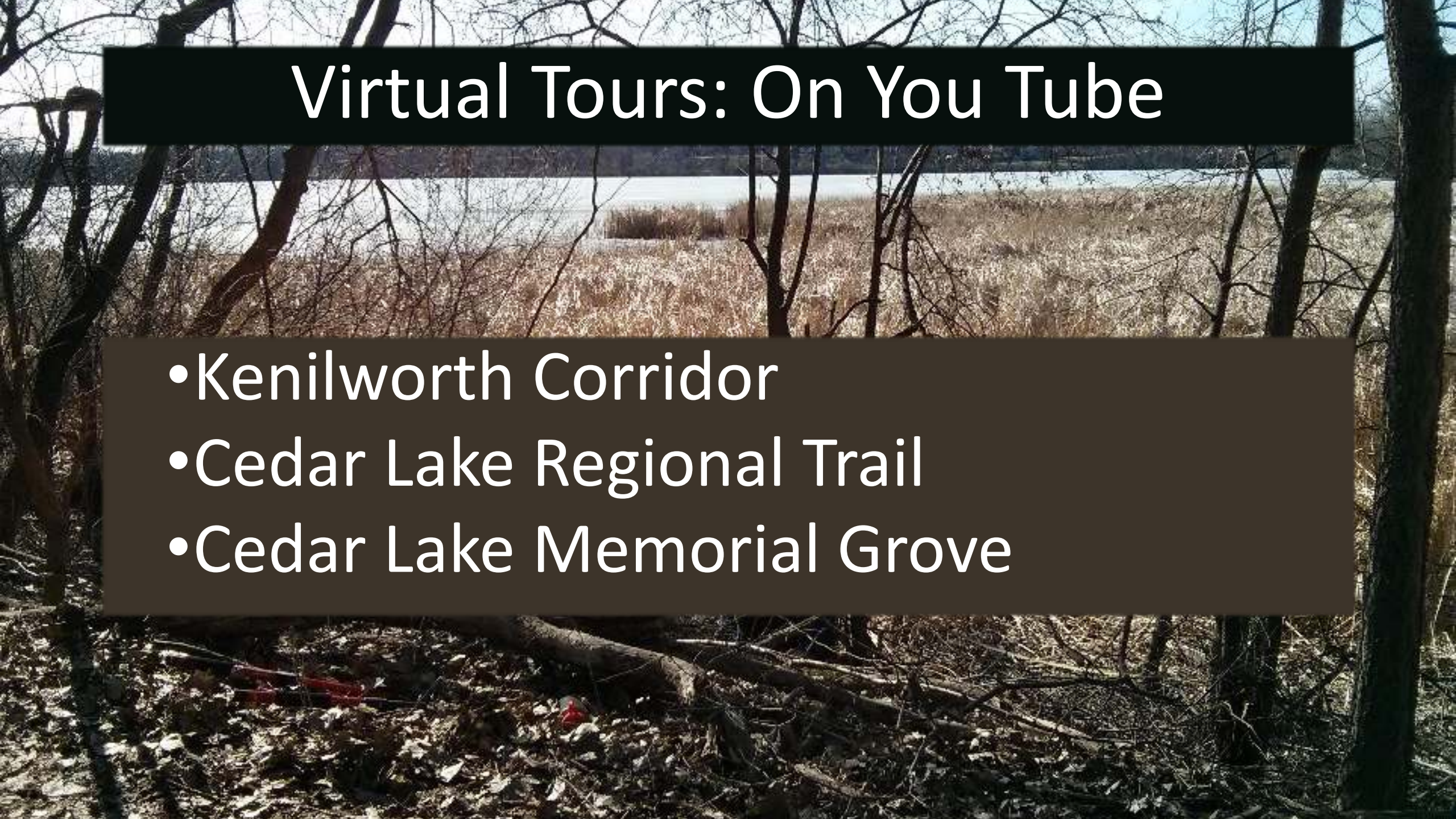

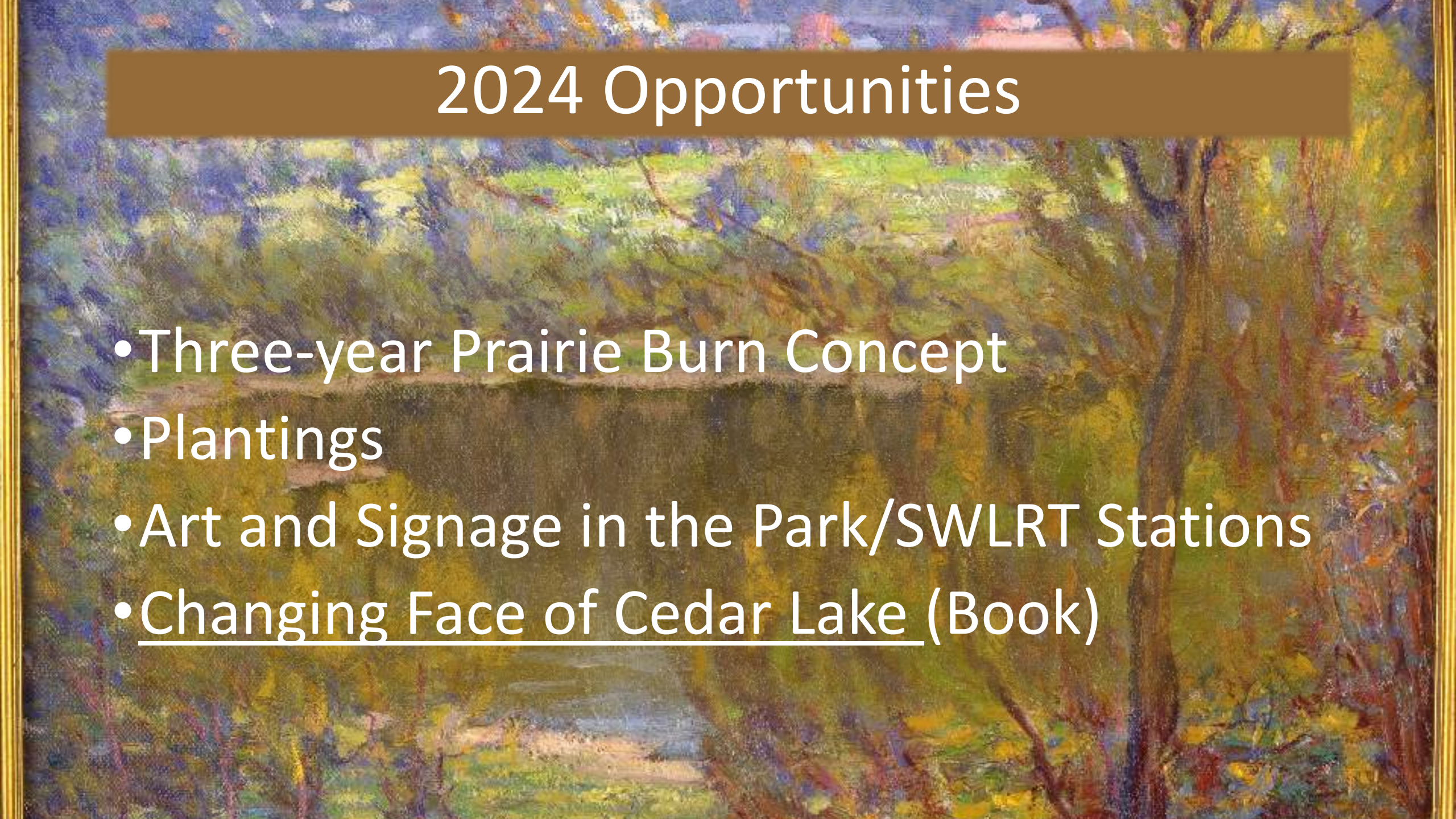
