NEW INITIATIVES & PROJECTS

Beyond ABC's core programming and services, FY26 featured new initiatives and projects, including the announcement of ABC's newly adopted FY26-28 Strategic Plan. The plan outlines a three-year vision for how ABC is building on its current momentum while strengthening its impact across Nashville's creative ecosystem.

The **FY26-28 Strategic Plan** sets forth five key goals:

- 1** Drive sustainable revenue and impactful program growth
- 2** Amplify ABC's brand, effectively communicate its story, and increase engagement across audiences
- 3** Expand and enhance board, staff, and operational capacity consistent with ABC's ongoing commitment to equity-centered processes
- 4** Identify and respond to creative community needs by developing accessible creative spaces and coordinating unified advocacy resources
- 5** Design and launch a signature annual fundraising event

In alignment with the Strategic Plan, ABC also announced the launch of two new partnership initiatives: **The Opaline at Artist Hill** in partnership with Holladay Ventures, and the **Artists Thrive Summit** in partnership with the Tremaine Foundation.

NEW INITIATIVES & PROJECTS

The Opaline

AT ARTIST HILL

In November 2025, ABC and Holladay Ventures announced their partnership on The Opaline at Artist Hill.

The Opaline will feature 251 affordable homes, multiple collaborative and private creative workspaces, tailored nonprofit services, an expanded 4,000 sq ft childcare facility, 7,000 sq ft of retail space, and a WeGo transit center, all designed to make it easier for Nashville's artists and families to live, create, and stay connected.



NEW INITIATIVES & PROJECTS

ARTISTS THRIVE SUMMIT

The Artists Thrive Summit is a national gathering designed to energize creative practice and build meaningful connection.

ABC proudly served as the Local Lead Planning Partner along with South Arts and the Tremaine Foundation's Artists Thrive initiative for the 2026 Summit held simultaneously across six cities, including Nashville on March 24–26, 2026.

Over three days, over 120 artists, administrators, educators, funders, and advocates came together to explore the current lay of the land for Nashville's creative ecosystem and imagine what it can become.

In addition to both local and national speaker sessions, attendees spent the evenings taking in Nashville's rich creative scene by joining the Art Crawl at Arcade Arts, attending an exclusive BMI writer's round hosted at the National Museum of African American Music, a guided tour of the Buchanan Arts District, and experiencing "A Showcase of Collaboration with Three Thrive Grantees" at Plaza Mariachi.

Volunteer Lawyers & Professionals for the Arts, a legal and business assistance program that provides free services to income-qualified artists, arts nonprofits, and creative small businesses

Education, seminars and workshops that cover a broad range of vital topics for creative and business professionals

Periscope: Artist Entrepreneur Training, an annual, accelerator program for working artists and creative small businesses

Fiscal Sponsorship, an incubator, administrative management, and fundraising structure for community-based arts projects and documentary & independent films

Creative Advantage, an arts-based training program that helps companies build a more engaged, innovative, and productive workforce

Project Management, a service that helps businesses and organizations engage artists by expertly managing RFQs, RFPs, Calls for Art, and more



PROGRAMS

VOLUNTEER LAWYERS & PROFESSIONALS FOR THE ARTS

ABC recognizes the challenges artists may have in finding affordable legal counsel and professional business guidance as they navigate their creative careers. VLPA addresses that barrier by providing free assistance to income-qualified artists, emerging arts organizations, and creative businesses.

Pro bono support is delivered through attorney referrals and quarterly clinics, including the Black-Owned Small Business and Nonprofit Legal Clinic in partnership with Bradley.

Primary services include drafting and reviewing contracts, protecting intellectual property, resolving arts-related disputes, and nonprofit formation.

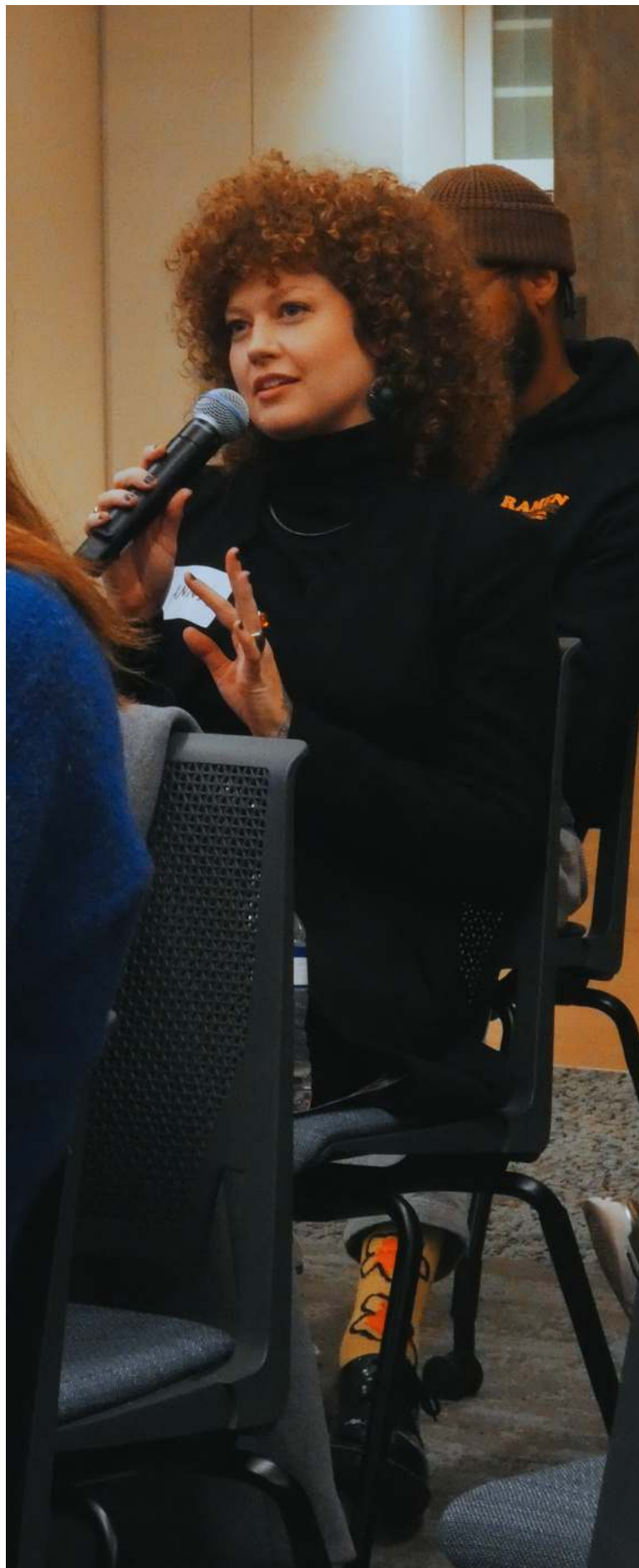

PROGRAMS

PERISCOPE: ARTIST ENTREPRENEUR TRAINING

ABC's nationally-recognized Periscope: Artist Entrepreneur Training is an annual business accelerator for the arts that gives working artists the tools to see their creative practice through an entrepreneurial lens.

Periscope is designed to be a transformative experience for each artist, featuring nine weeks of intensive business development curriculum and small group work with peers, and six months of one-on-one mentoring with business experts.

Periscope is a competitive program, receiving 60-100 applications for only 25 program spots annually.

ABC offers Fiscal Sponsorship to qualified arts projects & organizations as well as independent films and documentary media projects that align with our mission and are in need of administrative and fundraising support.

An incubator for the creative community, Fiscal Sponsorship provides structure for projects (not wanting to apply, or in the process of applying, for nonprofit status) to receive tax-deductible donations and grants in order to foster growth through increased access to funding.

Sponsored projects must be arts-related, fit our mission, and be based in or producing work in Tennessee.

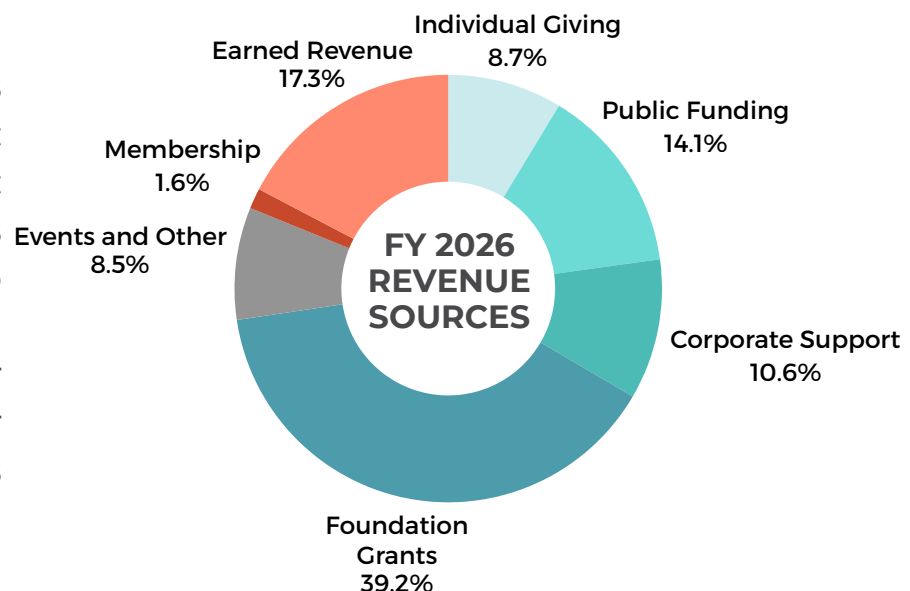
