



**Dr. Guang Tian** is the Director of CETOC. He is responsible for ensuring compliance with all UTC Program requirements and represents CETOC at external meetings, including two annual meetings convened by the U.S. DOT with directors of all UTCs. Dr. Tian has direct oversight of the center including its funding, and all center staff. Dr. Tian, Ph.D., is an Assistant Professor of Transportation Studies, Associate Director of UNO Transportation Institute, and Coordinator of Graduate Certificate in Geographic Information Systems (GIS) at University of New Orleans. Dr. Tian conducts data-driven research on transportation and its social, environmental and economic impacts by using quantitative methods and advanced technologies.

Dr. Tian has published three book chapters and 27 peer-reviewed journal articles. According to Google Scholar, his work has been cited over 1,000 times, which is in the 58<sup>th</sup> percentile ranking compared to faculty at all levels and 86<sup>th</sup> percentile ranking compared to other faculty at the same level (Assistant Professor) (among U.S. and Canadian urban planning faculty, by Scholarly Reputation and Metrics, <http://scholarmetrics.com/metrics/GuangTian>). His research has been funded by National Institute for Transportation and Communities, Land Economics Foundation, Louisiana Department of Transportation, Utah Department of Transportation, Utah Transit Authority, etc. Dr. Tian also serves as committee member for TRB's AMS50: Standing Committee on Economic Development and Land Use and Paper Coordinator for AR040: Freight Rail Transportation Committee. He recently joined the Opportunity Project Team of Federal Transit Administration as a user advocate on a project of Building Climate Change Resilience Through Public Transit.
