**Subject: Submission of Notarized Complaints Against the U.S. Department of State and Employee;
Request for Forwarding to DOJ OIG and State OIG, Privacy Act Amendment, and Acknowledgment
of Receipt**

Dear Consular Officer,

I am writing as a U.S. citizen currently residing overseas to submit copies of two notarized criminal complaints for your records and assistance. These documents detail serious allegations of systemic misconduct, including conspiracy to commit murder, endangerment, obstruction of justice, and the dissemination of false mental health information by the U.S. Department of State and associated personnel. The complaints are supported by exhibits, including mental health assessments from 2015 and 2021–2025 affirming my competency, which directly contradict any misleading notations in State Department systems suggesting otherwise.

This submission follows my recent visit to your consulate on September 22, 2025, for a scheduled notarization appointment. During that visit, consular staff reviewed my documents but retained them for further review without completing the notarization, leading me to leave without resolution. To avoid further delays or risks associated with in-person interactions—given the history of threats outlined in the complaints—I have since obtained notarization through an authorized Remote Online Notary (RON) service, compliant with U.S. state laws and federal recognition under the E-SIGN Act.

Enclosed are:

1. **Criminal Complaint: Larry Margulies v. United States Department of State** – Alleging violations under 18 U.S.C. §§ 241, 371, 1001, 111, 1505, 1512, 641, and constitutional breaches, including facilitation of threats via the U.S.-Philippines Mutual Legal Assistance Treaty (MLAT) and failures in consular protection.
2. **Criminal Complaint Against State Department Employee** – Detailing specific acts of misconduct by an individual employee contributing to the broader conspiracy.

These complaints build on my prior efforts to seek justice, as documented in my book, *Unmasking Assassins: A Whistleblower's Art of Criminology and Detection* (published 2025), which exposes familial roots of assassination threats, FBI-linked attempts, and CIA-related rumors. The enclosed materials highlight

a multi-year, cross-border conspiracy involving solicitation of murder, stalking, and financial crimes, with strong suggestions of federal agent involvement. They include evidence of past incidents, such as the 2015 Manila Consulate poisoning refusal and the 2019 ignored deposition, underscoring the urgency for impartial investigation.

To strategically address these concerns and leverage the consulate's role in protecting U.S. citizens abroad (per 22 U.S.C. § 4802 and the Foreign Service Act):

- I respectfully request that you forward copies of these complaints to the Department of Justice Office of the Inspector General (DOJ OIG) at 950 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20530-0001 (hotline@usdoj.gov) and the State Department Office of the Inspector General (State OIG) at 1700 North Moore Street, Arlington, VA 22009 (oig.state.gov/hotline). This will ensure coordination under the Inspector General Act of 1978 and promote transparency, especially given the potential conflict of interest in State Department self-investigation.
- Pursuant to the Privacy Act of 1974 (5 U.S.C. § 552a), I request an amendment to any inaccurate records in the Consular Consolidated Database (CCD) or other systems, specifically to incorporate the attached mental health assessments and remove any false notations of mental illness. Please forward this request to the State Department's FOIA/Privacy Office for processing, or provide guidance on next steps. This correction is critical to prevent further harm, such as obstructed consular services or perpetuated threats.
- I invoke whistleblower protections under the Whistleblower Protection Act (5 U.S.C. § 2302) and related statutes, urging the consulate to document this submission and refrain from any actions that could be perceived as retaliatory.

By providing these documents directly to the consulate, I aim to create a formal record that heightens awareness of the risks I face, potentially prompting ethical internal actions to safeguard my rights and correct misinformation. Your assistance in forwarding and acknowledging this matter would demonstrate a commitment to due process and citizen welfare, mitigating the leverage any bad actors may hold through systemic delays or errors.
