Taught by expert tutors, many holding Oxford or Cambridge academic backgrounds, each class welcomes fewer than eight students — ensuring space for tailored, one-to-one learning and meaningful discussion.

Beyond the classroom, the experience unfolds through cultural activities and excursions — from punting along the River Cam to exploring local landmarks, castles, and museums.



## FEATURED SUBJECT AREAS

### English Literature and Creative Writing

Students explore literature while developing their own writing style, crafting compelling characters and plots, and learning to communicate ideas clearly and creatively.

### Biotechnology and Genetics

A foundation in biotechnology and genetics, exploring how these fields are shaping medicine, pharmacology, and agriculture through genetic engineering, cell biology, and ethical questions.

### Medicine

Students explore cell biology through theory and hands-on study, examining how normal bodily function connects to disease and how research is advancing new approaches to treatment.

## GET TO KNOW OUR STUDENTS

Our Cambridge programmes are designed for students aged 13–24, across a wide range of academic interests and career goals. Students are split by age group to ensure the right learning approach at every stage. For Advanced Courses, applicants must be aged 18–24 and have completed at least two years of undergraduate study, or equivalent, by the course start date.

### Ages 13–15

Staying in the city of Cambridge offers a wide range of experiences. Guided city tours and orientations led by our staff help students settle in, while daily activities and excursions provide fun, learning, and the chance to explore local culture. Group projects, free time with peers, and evening events like Bop and formal dinners foster connection and confidence.

### Ages 16–17

The experience is enriched with activities designed to support both academic and personal growth. Students enjoy full-day excursions and free time to explore Cambridge independently or with new friends. Evenings are filled with socials and cultural outings, while structured sessions encourage discussion and collaboration. Formal dinners add a memorable touch.

### Ages 18–24

A mature and independent summer that balances academic depth with social engagement. Activities include evening socials, college visits, and industry insight talks that inspire ambition and networking. With built-in free time, students explore Cambridge and connect with peers, concluding with formal dinners and a graduation ceremony.

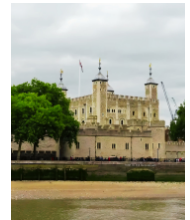
### Canterbury
