

Privacy Notice on Video Surveillance

We use video surveillance. Under Articles 13 and 14 of the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), there are information obligations when personal data is collected. For this reason, you are provided with the following information:

Type of Data Collected

Video surveillance records moving images, i.e., features that allow us to identify you. In the underground parking garage, vehicle license plates may also be recorded.

Purpose of Data Processing

Video surveillance is carried out to safeguard property rights, prevent criminal acts (in particular burglary and vandalism) and related disruptions to operations, as well as to preserve evidence in the event of criminal acts.

Legal Basis of Data Processing

The legal basis for video surveillance is Article 6(1)(f) GDPR, with our legitimate interests arising from the purposes stated above.

Recipients / Disclosure of Data

Within our administration, those departments that require access to stored video recordings to fulfill their duties will receive it. Data will only be disclosed to third parties if there is a serious suspicion, based on a recording, that the stored data reveals that one or more persons have committed or attempted to commit a criminal offense against us. In such cases, we forward the data to the competent authorities (police, public prosecutor).

Data Processing Outside the European Union

No processing of personal data outside the European Union takes place in connection with video surveillance.

Storage Period

Video surveillance data is generally deleted after 48 hours. In cases of staff absence or illness, video recordings may be retained for up to 10 days. If there are indications that the videos contain information about potential criminal offenses, we reserve the right to store the videos until the matter is clarified.

Rights of Data Subjects

If your personal data is processed, you have the right to obtain information about the data stored about you (Art. 15 GDPR). If incorrect personal data is processed, you have the right to rectification (Art. 16 GDPR). If the legal requirements are met, you may request the erasure or restriction of processing and object to the processing (Art. 17, 18, or 21 GDPR). If you have consented to data processing, you may also have the right to data portability (Art. 20 GDPR). In addition, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the competent supervisory authority.
