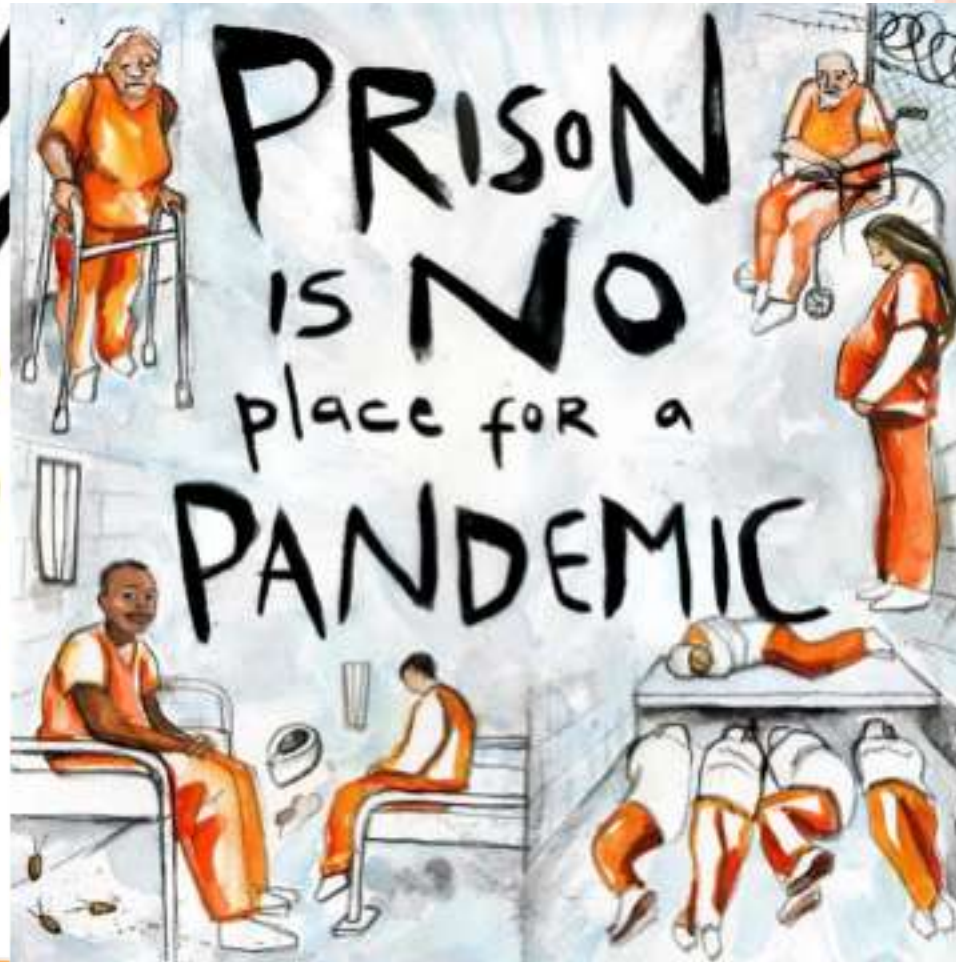

- Strengthening connections within our network and with mutual aid networks

Why defund BPD?

The Boston Police Department's budget is much larger than other departments in our city that are meant to help support our communities.



4x larger than the Public Health Commission



10x larger than the Library Department



15x larger than the Neighborhood Development Department



182x larger than the Office of Arts & Culture

... and 473x larger than the budget for the City's Office of Immigrant Advancement!

- Organizing Community Action Circles to mobilize in alignment with BIPOC-led grassroots campaigns and coalitions

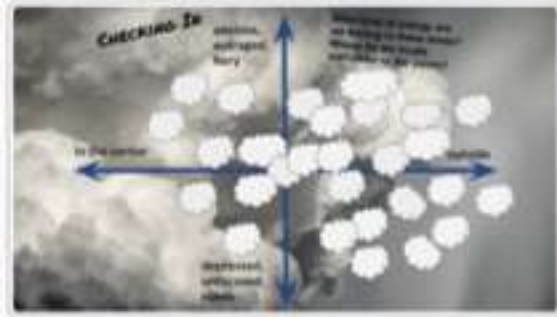

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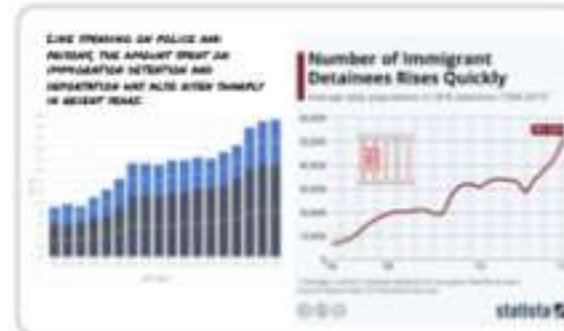

Legal Representation

30

- ❖ **Over 60%** of children have no one to represent them in their deportation proceedings
- ❖ **9 out of 10** children without attorneys are ordered deported
- ❖ A child with an attorney is **five times more likely** to be granted protection



Legal Representation and Social Services Support in 2020

- ❖ KIND represents 5,378 clients in a total of 6,496 open and active case matters
- ❖ **The Social Services Team has served 780 clients**
- ❖ Social Service coordination areas include Education, Mental Health, Medical Care, Food and Housing

New York United

NEW YORK UNITED is our new comprehensive COVID-19 response campaign.

Our mission is to make sure that New York's immigrants who are on the front lines of the COVID-19 response don't get left behind as we respond to this crisis.

This campaign includes free testing and treatment for all New Yorkers, multilingual COVID-19 hotlines and resources to make sure everyone knows the latest updates; the suspension of all ICE immigration enforcement activities; and emergency economic support for all workers.



Strategies for COVID-19 Response

- Rapid response information sharing
- Activating member organizations
- Fundraising
- Grassroots advocacy
- Direct advocacy (legislative)
- Administrative advocacy
- Legal



New York United **WINS!**



Free COVID-19 testing, evaluation, and treatment for all low-income people in New York States, regardless of immigration status.



Direct grants to small businesses under 500 employees (including non-profits) to allow them to meet payroll and cover other business expenses for the duration of the crisis



Direct aid to small nonprofits whose donations are declining during the pandemic and assurance that non-profits receive the same economic relief as businesses.



Public charge: identify health care, nutrition and other programs responding to COVID-19 as disaster relief to ensure they will NOT count toward a future public charge determination by USCIS



Suspension of Summer Regents exams, All students on track to get a diploma- those that pass the class connected with the Regents exam there due to take- will still be able to graduate.

New York United **WINS!**

Emergency Cash Grant Program (ECAP)

The NYIC has raised and distributed **\$2,700,000** to over 5,000 New Yorkers through our NYIC member organizations, with more to come.

These funds will provide undocumented folks that have lost income due to COVID-19 with real money in their pockets to pay for groceries and rent, at a desperate time.

Education Policy & Advocacy

COVID-19's arrival has profoundly compounded all of the challenges immigrant youth and parents have long faced. As a result, our K-12 and our adult education systems are facing an existential crisis pushing us to the brink of leaving generations of immigrants behind. Remote learning has not worked for so many immigrant families because parents haven't been able to access the English, technology and systems navigation skills that are absolutely necessary for meaningfully engaging in online learning.

- Supported members through daily education updates during the massive shift of over 1.1 million students to remote learning
- Host weekly calls with the NYC Department of Education to provide timely feedback and troubleshooting for members
- Pivoted existing projects like our Linking Immigrant Families to Early Childhood Education (LIFE) to remote outreach and support
- Protected adult literacy funding in the city and state budgets

NYIC WINS!

The New York Immigration Coalition and other advocates secured...

The passage of Resolution 1016 which expands the Language Access Law in Long Island. The bill will expand multilingual resources at all Suffolk County correctional facilities allowing individuals to understand their full legal rights-including their right to refuse an interview by U.S.

New York's Automatic Voter Registration (AVR) bill passed in both houses and is heading to the Gov's desk.

A win against the Trump administration in 2019 which blocked the attempt to add in a citizenship question to the 2020 census.

Protect our courts which makes it unlawful for any law enforcement officer, including Immigration and Customs Enforcement, to arrest a person for attending a court.



NYIC Census 2020 Updates

Last week, the Trump administration released a memo that stated that only citizens should be considered in population figures used for both apportionment and redistricting. The memo serves as a clear attempt to manipulate the census for political gain by stoking fear, hatred, xenophobia while fanning the flames of divisiveness.

NYIC Response:

- NYIC filed a lawsuit seeking declaratory, injunctive, and/or mandamus relief to prohibit the this Administration from excluding undocumented immigrants from the population count used to apportion the House of Representatives.
- We continue our Census 2020 outreach, including participating in this week's NYC Census Week of Action

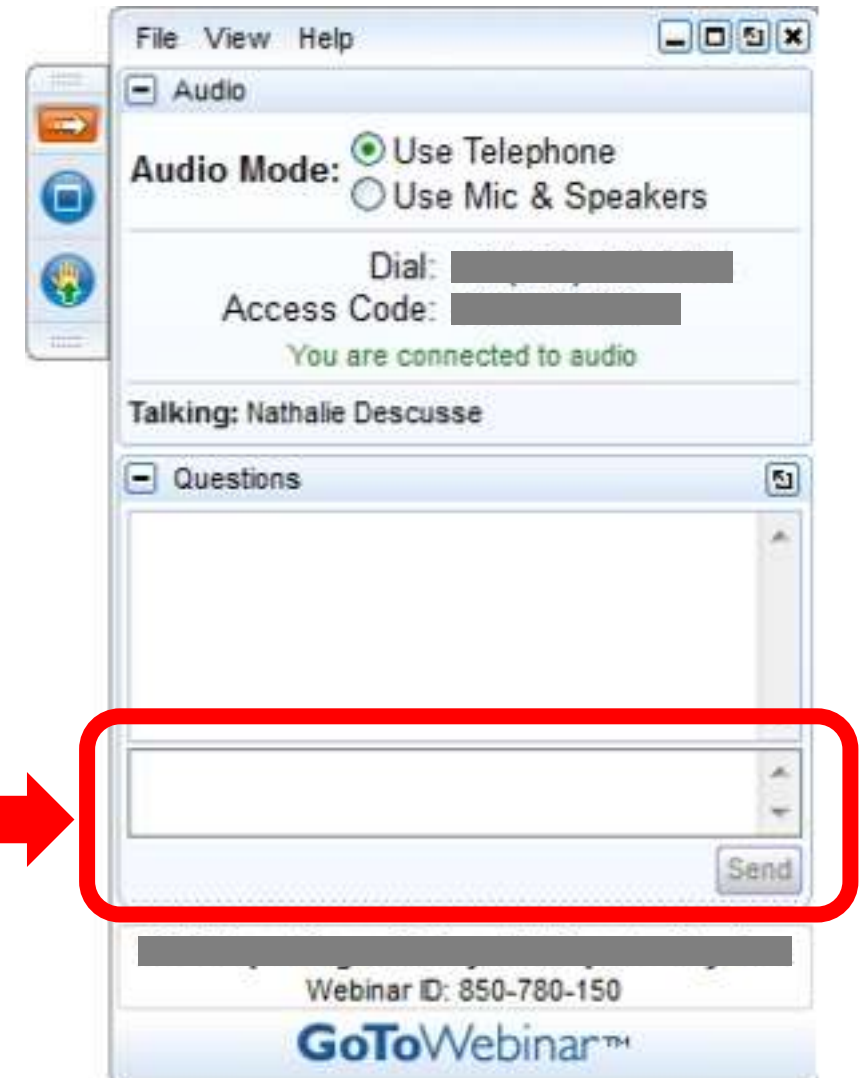
