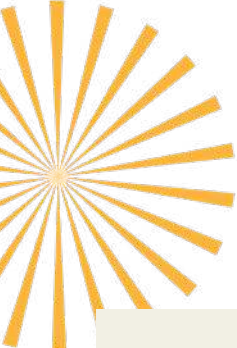

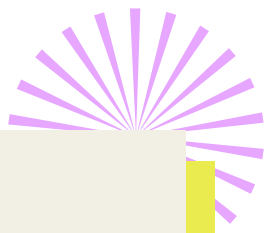

- 3 Create a buddy tutoring program matching younger students with older students who are proficient in a subject or content area.

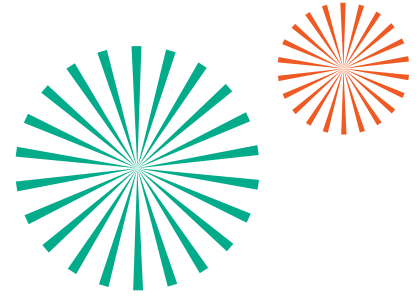


BLENDDED EDUCATION IDEA:

Community Service doesn't mean you physically need to complete a task in-person, there are many ways to volunteer your time online like supporting organizations with your social media skills, creating digital art or editing content.

GRADES 4-6	GRADES 7-8	GRADES 9-12
- Learn about important issues that are affecting your community by doing research, and then discuss what you can do to help. Commit to one of the strategies discussed as a class and set realistic goals for taking action. - Visit a senior home to learn from and engage with the people in your community. Share your experiences with your family to get them excited about donating some of their time to people who are in need.	- Research soup kitchens and other resources in your community that provide prepared food to those in need. Offer your skills as cooks or servers for a day or on a regular basis. - Organize a clothing and personal hygiene drive for those in need. Create posters for your school and community, requesting donations of gently used clothing and personal hygiene products such as deodorant, mouthwash, tissue, etc. Create packages to be distributed in your community or dropped off at a shelter.	- Investigate different community service opportunities and put together a game plan to become involved. Journal about your community service experiences and share these experiences with your peers to get them excited about getting involved in a cause they care about. - Organize an online tutoring program at your school pairing student volunteers with students seeking support in a subject area. Or, offer tutoring to a neighborhood school seeking support. This can help break down barriers by targeting the communities and students that need support trying to catch up!
