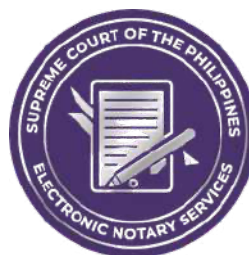

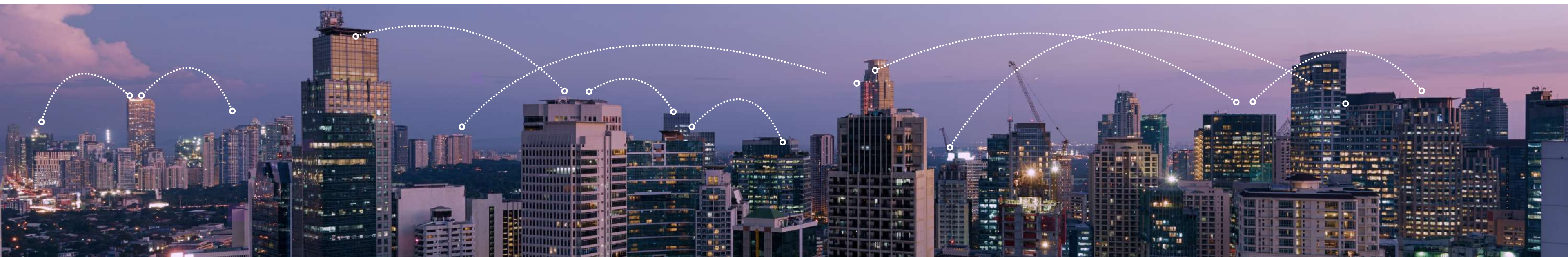

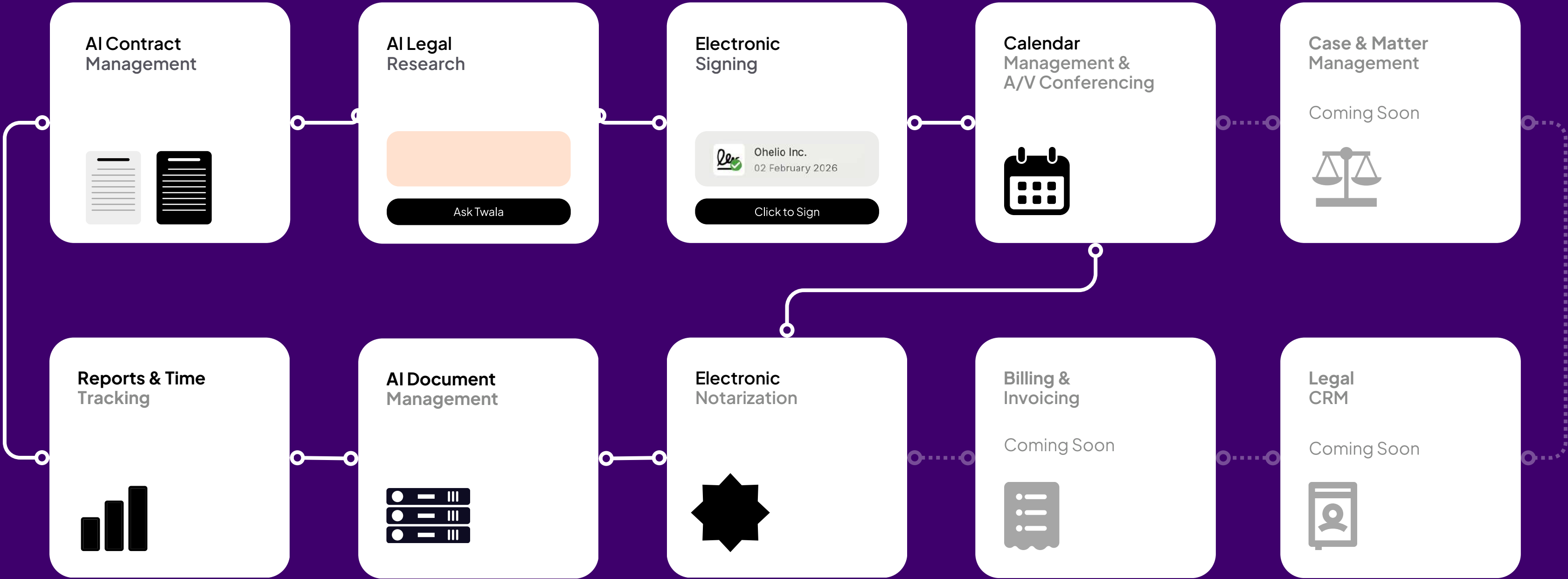

From Academy training to your first electronic notarial act.

Your Electronic Notarial Commission is issued by the Supreme Court's Electronic Notary Administrator. Twala provides the accredited training and the platform you notarize on.

- 01 Complete the Twala Academy training
- 02 Apply for your ENP Commission with the Supreme Court
- 03 Create your Twala account and verify your identity
- 04 Apply as an ENP within Twala
- 05 Set up your e-signature and payout details
- 06 Start conducting eNotarization

Training, then the Supreme Court commission

01

Complete the Twala Academy training

Take the free online course at academy.twala.ai.

The Supreme Court requires proof that you've completed training on an accredited ENF before it will commission you.

Download your certificate of completion — you submit it to the Supreme Court in Step 2, and again when applying for your Twala ENP account.

02

Apply for your ENP Commission with the Supreme Court

- A. Pay the Php 3,000 application fee through the JePS Payment Portal.
- B. Register an account on the Philippine Judiciary Platform (PJP).
- C. Submit your application together with the required documents.
- D. Wait for the initial assessment to complete.
- E. Attend a virtual summary hearing conducted by the ENA.
- F. Wait for a second evaluation of your qualifications.
- G. If approved, the Court issues your commission — valid for a two-year term.**

03

Create your Twala account and verify your identity

Once your SC Electronic Notarial Commission has been granted, create your Twala account and complete identity verification.

04

Apply as an ENP within Twala

Upload your SC commission document, IBP ID / OR, MCLE Certificate of Compliance and proof of ULAS compliance. The Twala team reviews it to confirm your commission is valid and current.

05

Set up your e-signature and payout details

Configure the e-signature you'll use to sign and seal documents, and the account where Twala deposits your enotarization fees — account name and number, bank or e-wallet, and payout frequency.

06

Start conducting eNotarization

Perform electronic notarial acts through Twala Notary: acknowledgments, oaths and affirmations, jurats, and signature witnessing.

If you have applied, attended the virtual summary hearing and received your electronic notary commission, verify your Twala account to begin the ENP application process.

After confirmation of payment, within 24 hours your account will be upgraded to a Business plan and you will have access to all Twala features while waiting for the start of eNotarization by October 19.

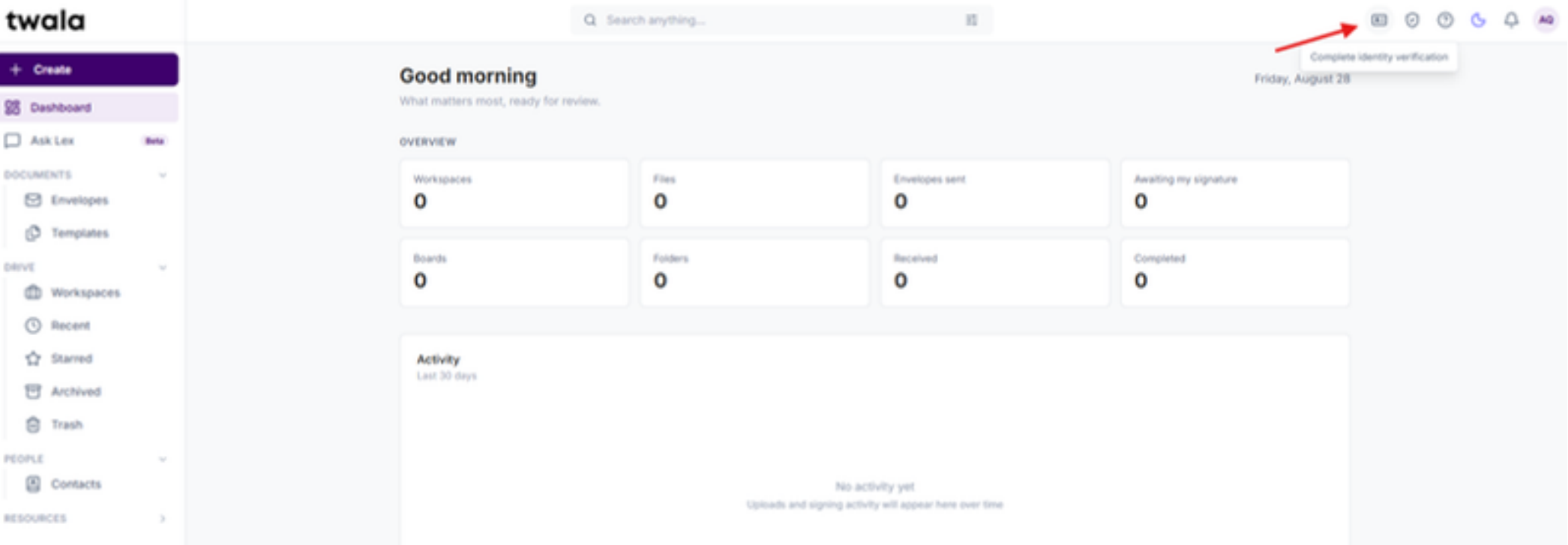

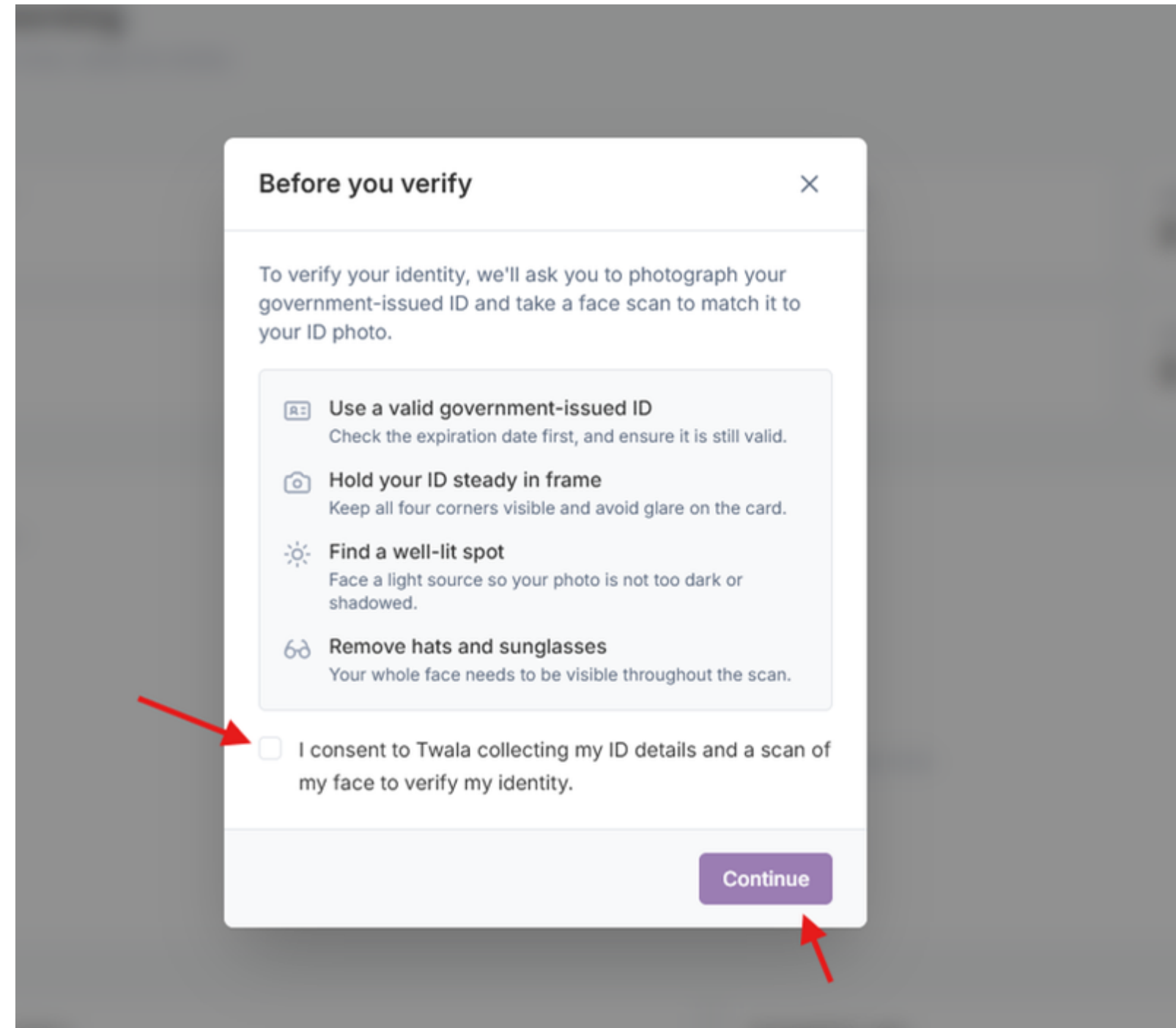

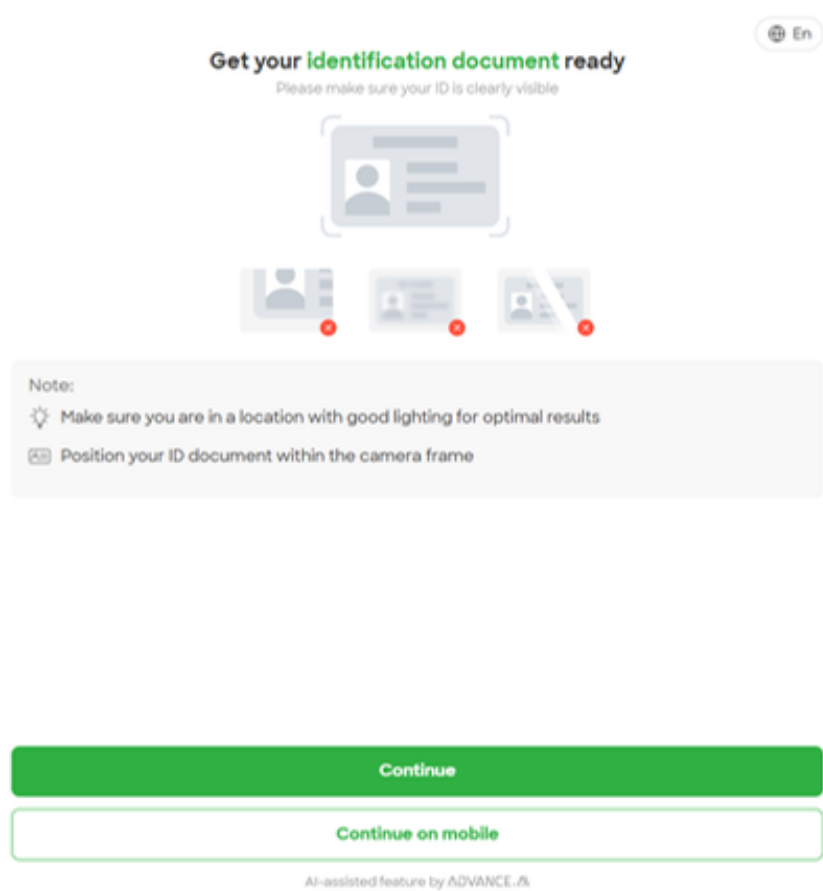
To verify your identity, we'll ask you to photograph your government-issued ID and take a face scan to match it to your ID photo.

-  **Use a valid government-issued ID**
Check the expiration date first, and ensure it is still valid.
-  **Hold your ID steady in frame**
Keep all four corners visible and avoid glare on the card.
-  **Find a well-lit spot**
Face a light source so your photo is not too dark or shadowed.
-  **Remove hats and sunglasses**
Your whole face needs to be visible throughout the scan.

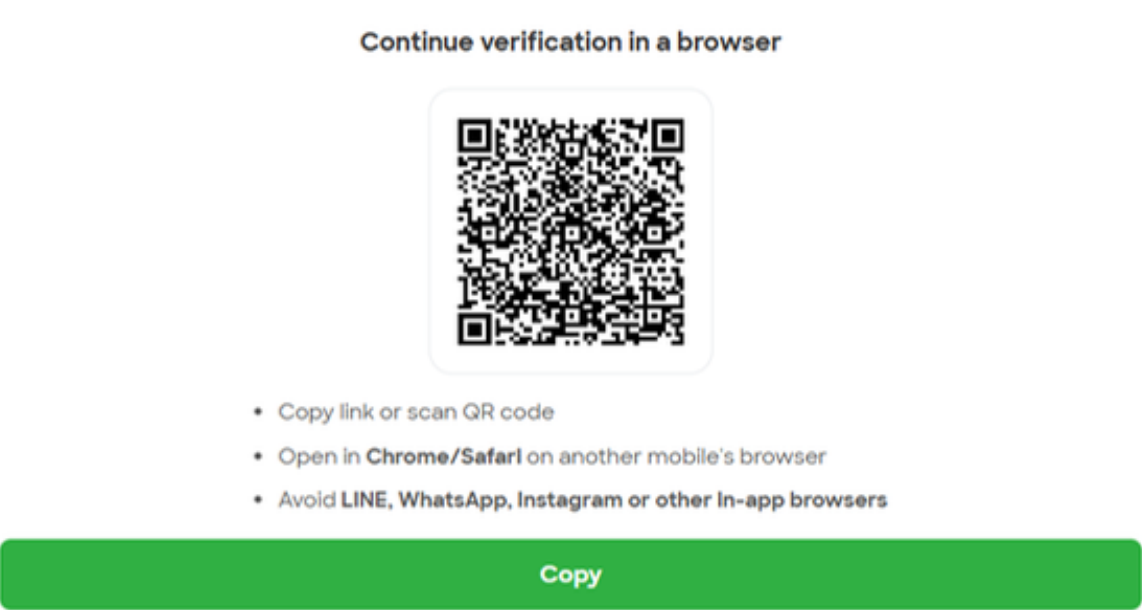

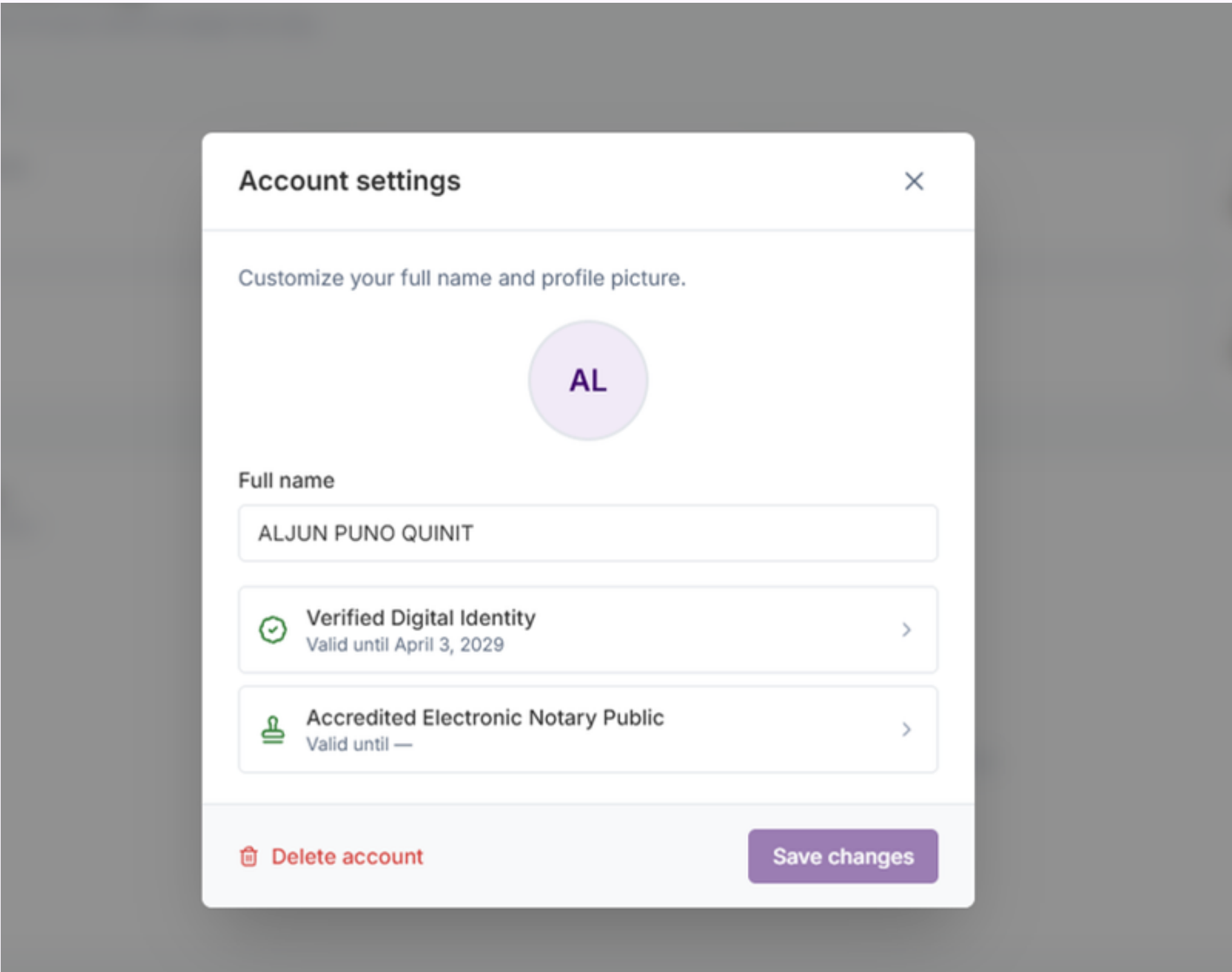
Approval arrives as a notification: you now have Electronic Notary Public privileges on Twala.

FREQUENTLY ASKED

Fees, timing and the term of your commission

How much does the ENP application cost?

The application fee is Php 3,000.00. The Supreme Court sets and periodically updates the fee, payable through the Judiciary ePayment System (JePS). Check the current fee schedule on the Supreme Court's eNotary Services page before you file.

How long is the ENP commission valid?

An Electronic Notarial Commission is valid for a two-year term.

How long does the process take?

The Supreme Court has not published a fixed processing time, since it depends on the volume of applications and the scheduling of virtual summary hearings.

Budget for several weeks between filing your SC application and receiving your commission, and plan your Twala account application after that.

Do I need to renew it?

Yes. You must file for renewal at least 30 days before your commission expires, through an electronic application to the ENA.

FREQUENTLY ASKED

What renewal requires

File at least 30 days before your commission expires, by electronic application to the ENA.

IF YOU MISS THE DEADLINE

Failure to renew on time results in automatic removal from the Directory of ENPs, which will block your access to Twala and other accredited ENFs.

Your current contact details and address

Proof of payment of the renewal fee and current professional tax

A written undertaking to comply with the Rules and the Electronic Notarization Data Sharing requirements

A copy of your existing Electronic Notarial Commission

Proof that you remain a member of the Bar in good standing, with current OBC/IBP clearances and MCLE/ULAS compliance

FREQUENTLY ASKED

Newly admitted lawyers without MCLE or ULAS details

Can I apply without an MCLE Certificate of Compliance?

Yes. Lawyers admitted in February 2025 or anytime in 2026 may apply as an ENP without an MCLE Certificate of Compliance for the 8th and 9th compliance periods. Indicate “N/A” in the MCLE Compliance fields of your BARISTA Membership.

In lieu of the certificate, submit either:

1. A signed letter to the Interim Electronic Notary Services acknowledging the applicable MCLE compliance period and undertaking to complete the requirement within the prescribed period; or
2. A Certification from the MCLE Office confirming the same, if one was already issued for your traditional notarial commission application.

And for ULAS compliance?

Enter “N/A” in the membership compliance field. No supporting document needs to be uploaded for ULAS compliance.

FREQUENTLY ASKED

Credits, subscriptions and Early Access

Do I need a subscription to notarize on Twala?

No. Notary credits are all you need to start notarizing. A subscription — Professional, Business, or Premium Business/Enterprise — is only for capabilities beyond notarization: the Document Management System, Contract Lifecycle Management, AI tools, and team seats.

What happens after my free year with Early Access ends?

The Business plan upgrade runs for 1 year. Without a paid plan afterward, your account reverts to ENP Starter: the bundled Business features drop off, but you can keep notarizing for as long as you hold credits, and you can buy more at any time.

What's the difference between credits and a subscription plan?

Credits are what you spend to notarize: 1 credit = 1 notarized document, bought as needed. A subscription is optional and unlocks the wider set of Twala features beyond notarization.

What if I've consumed the 150 credits?

Purchase more credits to continue notarizing. There is no cap on how many you can buy.

What is the Twala Notary Early Access Program?

A one-time ₦5,000 offer that already includes 150 notary credits (₦10,000 value) and upgrades you to the Business plan (₦43,000/year value): an extra user seat, 12M AI tokens, unlimited envelope signing, and enrollment in the Twala Partners Network Program.

Do I need to be commissioned as an ENP first to avail of Early Access?

No. You can avail of the program anytime to reserve your slot. Availing now also opens Twala's Business plan to you early, so you can begin AI-powered document processing right away, including AI features like the Legal AI research tool.

How much can I earn from referring a customer?

Your commission is a percentage of your referred customer's annual subscription fee, net of taxes, for as long as they keep renewing — up to 5 years.
