ACTIVITY GOAL

Students listen to a story about sharing and taking turns with friends.

MATERIALS

Provided:

- “Sharing and Turn-Taking” book

Needed:

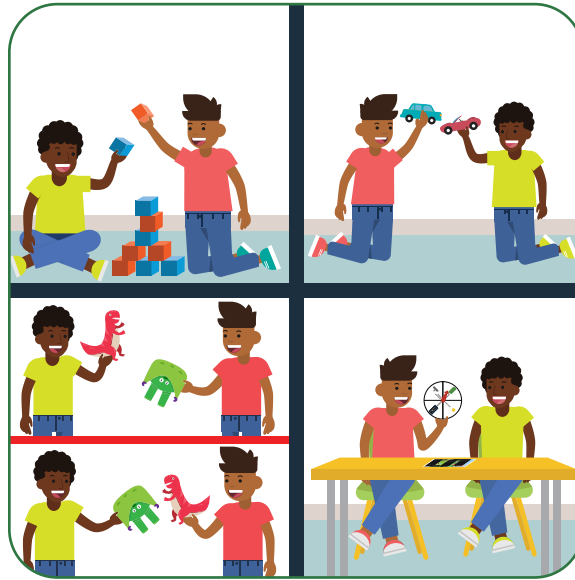
- Scissors
- Tape
- Stapler or hole punch (optional)
- Ring for binding purposes (optional)

PREPARATION

1. Print, laminate, and cut out the book pages.
2. Assemble the book pages in order, and staple them together or hole-punch the top left corner of the pages and secure them with a ring.

INSTRUCTIONS

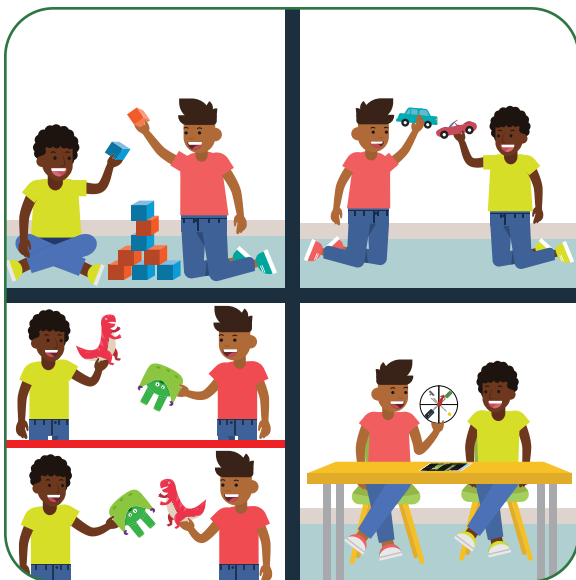
1. Read the “Sharing and Turn-Taking” book to students who are learning to play with peers. Reading the story frequently and before engaging in a play activity will help students engage in more meaningful play activities with peers.
2. Pair the “Sharing and Turn-Taking” book with the Sharing and Turn-Taking Charts provided in the unit.
3. Have the book available and reference it as needed.

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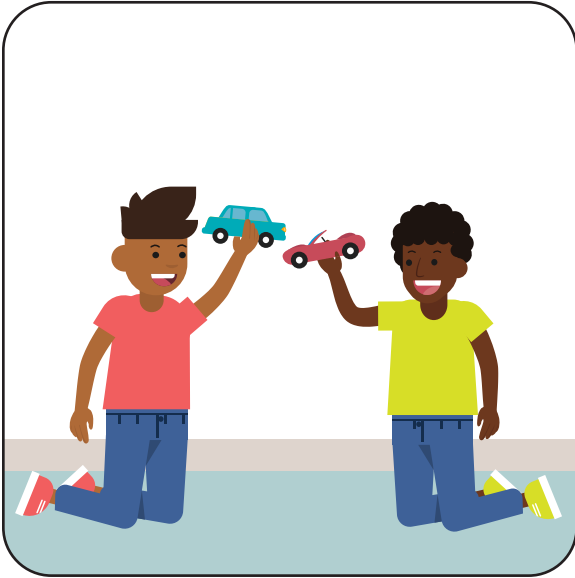
Sometimes my friends and I might want to play with the same toy.

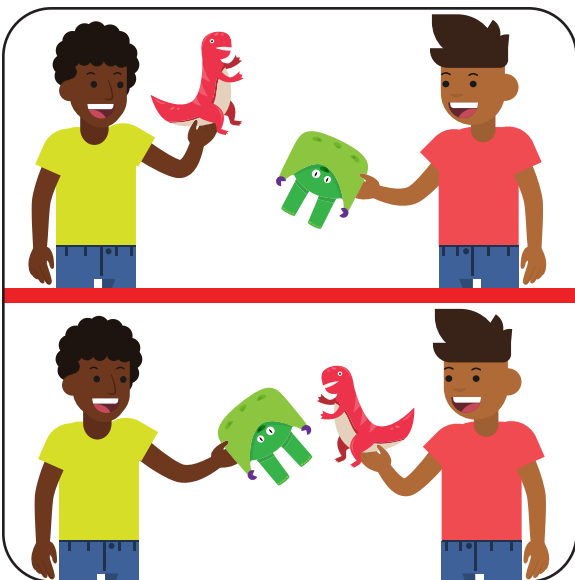
We can share by using the toys together. These friends are building a tower together using blocks!

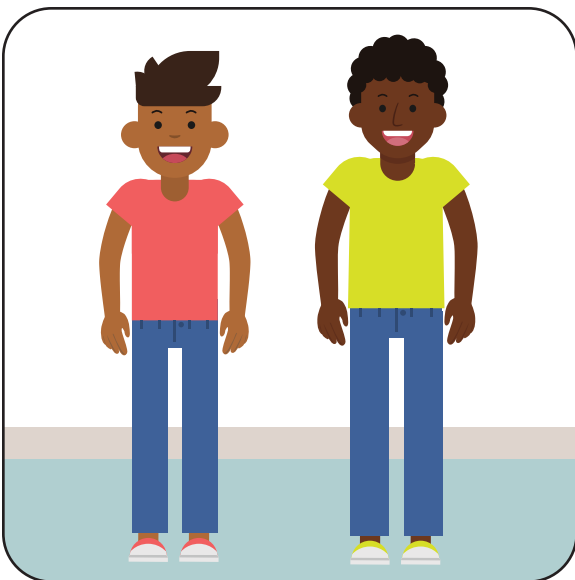
We can share by trading toys and taking turns. These friends each played with one toy and are now playing with the other toy!
