THE PROJECT

In 2025, the New Generation Foundation decided to invest in a new project for 12 young singers from Florence and the surrounding area, selected to form the official Choir of the Basilica di Santo Spirito.

The initiative, led by Vox Medicea, the Foundation's sacred-music branch, offers young singers a unique development experience combining musical growth, ensemble practice and work in a professional setting.

Successful applicants will receive an annual stipend of €1,000, as well as a professional contract setting out their commitments and the activities included in the project.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants must be between 18 and 26 years old.
- No specific qualifications are required: selection is based entirely on vocal and artistic ability.
- Applicants must live in Florence or be able to travel easily to rehearsal and concert venues.
- All required application materials must be submitted in full and on time.

Previous choir members may reapply, but priority will be given to new applicants.



WHAT TO EXPECT FROM THE PROGRAMME

As part of the project, you will have the opportunity to:

- Perform regularly in one of Florence's most evocative and historic settings.
- Develop as a professional, strengthening discipline, listening skills and responsibility.
- Discover and interpret unique repertoires of polyphony and sacred music.
- Turn theory into lived experience, giving voice to what you have learned in your studies.
- Share the stage with professionals and receive high-level coaching.





YOUR COMMITMENT TO THE BASILICA DI SANTO SPIRITO

Choir members will sing at Sunday Mass once a month, beginning with a rehearsal at 9:00 before the service.

They will also be required to attend a monthly rehearsal on the Friday evening before the Sunday sung Mass.



ALONGSIDE MASCARADE OPERA

As part of Vox Medicea's educational programme, supported by the New Generation Foundation, the Coro di Santo Spirito will have the opportunity to work alongside Mascarade Opera, the Foundation's programme dedicated to launching the careers of emerging opera artists.

Members of the Coro di Santo Spirito will be invited, as part of their artistic development, to Mascarade Opera events throughout the year. They will also work alongside the Mascarade Opera Emerging Artists in preparing the Christmas concert in December 2027.



PROJECT DIRECTOR

MARK SPYROPOULOS

Mark Spyropoulos studied Music at Trinity College Dublin and trained as a singer in London at the Guildhall School of Music & Drama under Laura Sarti, and subsequently at English National Opera. He has worked with several ensembles in the UK and France, including William Christie at the Opéra Royal de Versailles, Opera Holland Park, the Philharmonia Chorus and the Chapel Royal at Hampton Court.

In 2015, he became the first British singer to join the Pontifical Sistine Chapel Choir. With the Sistine Choir, he recorded four albums for Deutsche Grammophon, including world-premiere recordings, and received the Echo Klassik Prize for Cantate Domino. He has toured Europe, South Korea, the United States and Canada, performing as both a chorister and soloist.

He has appeared in broadcasts on BBC, RAI, Sky Arts, CBS and other networks, and has written for The Guardian, The Tablet and other publications. In 2018, he founded the Sacred Music Programme and Vox Medicea, dedicated to rediscovering Florentine Renaissance music. In 2022, he established the Florence Choral Course, an advanced development programme in Renaissance repertoire.





HOW TO APPLY

Applications may be submitted year-round by email to ms@newgenerationfoundation.com and must include:

- Personal details and a curriculum vitae specifying voice type and artistic experience.
- A video recording (with a direct-access link) of one substantial work performed in full.

Shortlisted applicants will be invited to auditions held periodically at the New Generation Foundation (via Il Prato 56, Florence).

THE NEW GENERATION FOUNDATION

Based at Palazzo Corsini al Prato in Florence, the New Generation Foundation is a non-profit foundation dedicated to advancing artistic excellence through three main programmes: the New Generation Festival, Mascarade Opera and Vox Medicea. Founded in 2017 by Frankie Parham, Roger Granville and Maximilian Fane, it supports outstanding emerging international talent in opera and the performing arts, offering opportunities for artistic development, production and professional growth. The New Generation Festival showcases some of the finest talent in opera, ballet, theatre and the performing arts in places of extraordinary beauty, from the mountains of Switzerland to its flagship summer festival in Florence. In 2020, it also launched the ReGeneration Festival in collaboration with the Uffizi Galleries, reaffirming the importance of culture during the pandemic. Today, the Foundation runs a year-round programme encompassing Mascarade Opera, its advanced programme for outstanding opera artists, led by General Director Dr Ralph Strehle and Artistic Director Julia Lynch, and Vox Medicea, directed by Mark Spyropoulos and dedicated to rediscovering the sacred musical heritage of Medici Florence. Inspired by the values of the Italian Renaissance, the Foundation celebrates creativity through dialogue between artistic disciplines, cultures and generations.

VOX MEDICEA

Vox Medicea is a professional ensemble of male voices dedicated to performing, recording and rediscovering rare and forgotten works of sacred music from Medici Florence.

Bringing together leading specialists from Italy and across Europe, the ensemble combines historical and musicological research with the highest artistic standards, bringing masterpieces of the Florentine Renaissance back to life. Performing on international stages, Vox Medicea presents programmes ranging from intimate a cappella concerts to grand polychoral works accompanied by period instruments, offering audiences a unique opportunity to rediscover this extraordinary musical heritage.

The Coro di Santo Spirito is an educational initiative within the Vox Medicea programme, supported by the New Generation Foundation. It gives young singers the opportunity to deepen their knowledge of sacred repertoire and historically informed performance practice through hands-on artistic experience.
