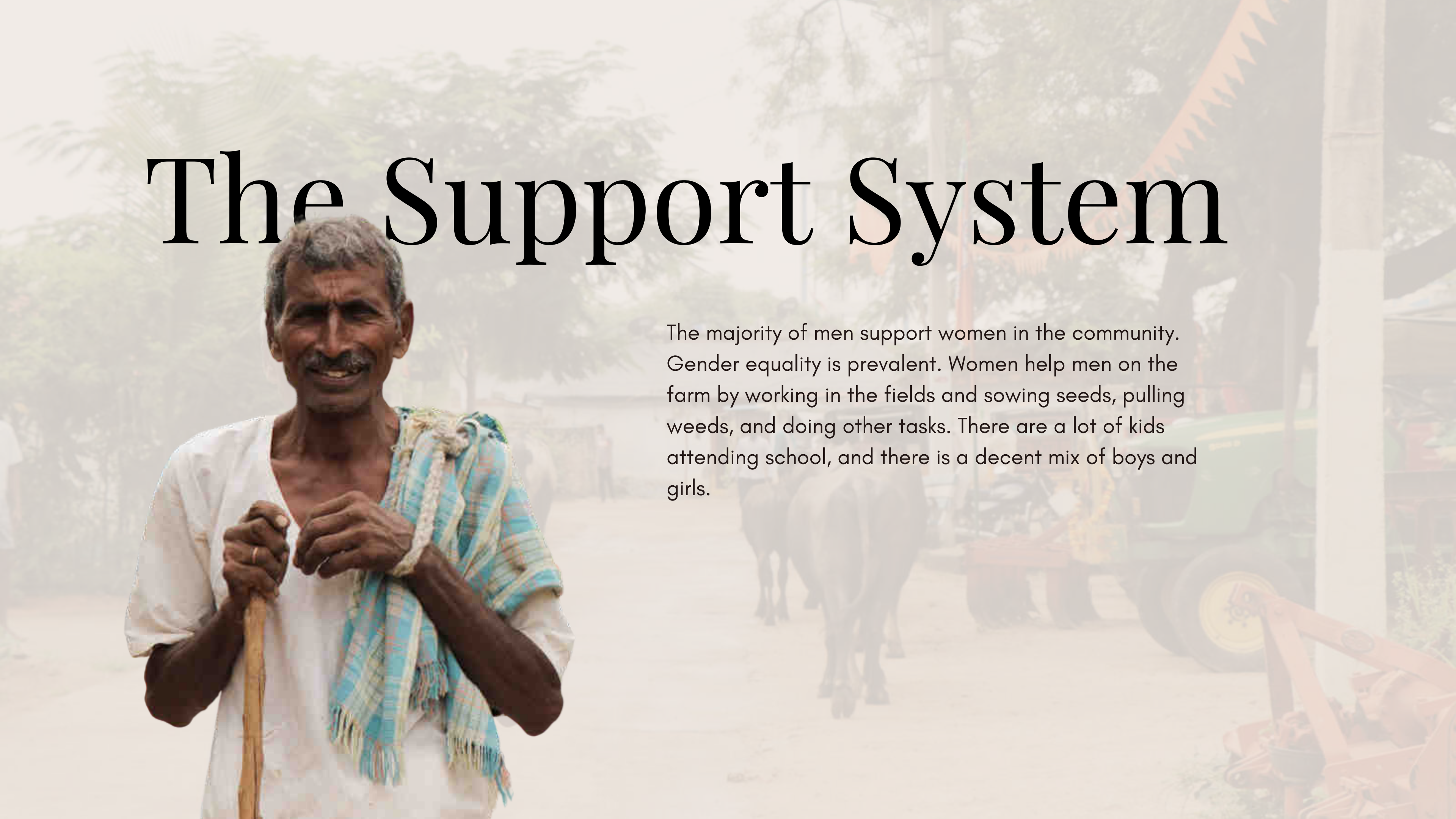

Sakhi



SGH (Self-help groups) are prominent in the village. Many women work together and support one another for various purposes. This enables people to interact and collaborate for the benefit of all their causes and the growth of the neighborhood. Lots of women collaborate and support each other for different help like finances, food, tools, and daily help. This allows them to come close and work together for all the causes and development of the community.



Swachh Bharat

Together, the group of women and men keep the village tidy. They remove all the weeds and leaves from the village. Garbage is managed in a dump yard using waste segregation as part of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan.





Unique Houses

Each home in a village has its own essence. A couple is built with rocks, a few with bricks, and a few with antique wood pillars and beams. Each house gains a lot of identity through the variety of houses.



Culture

In an ideal world, the village's unity in diversity could be seen as its most attractive feature. Some of the women were dressed in traditional Indian sarees while others wore cholis and ghagras with mirror work chunnis. The majority of them have nose rings. While belonging to various religions, these women all share a similar yet unique appearance.

Kanyavandanam

The excitement that takes place when a girl child is born adds to the uniqueness of the Haridaspur narrative. A village's attitude toward female childbirth has altered as a result of the account of converting a depressed dad who had three daughters into a celebration for all villagers.





Women Finance

SHG group members help each other to take care of the finances. They get interest of 14% from the bank for the money they have been collecting. This makes the women quite independent on a financial basis and ready for any kind of emergency situation. They are also supported by Gram Panchayat Funds.
