Imaging & Medical Records

Sharing Outside Records & Requesting Your Own

Having your prior imaging and records on hand helps us make the most of your visit. Here's how to bring what you already have, and how to request copies of your records with us later.

Bringing Outside Imaging to Your Visit

- If you've had an X-ray, MRI, or CT scan elsewhere, please bring a disc or online access link to the actual images, along with the written report — the report alone isn't enough for us to review the images ourselves.
- Most imaging centers and hospitals can provide a disc or a secure online link when you request it — ask for this at the time of your imaging, or call ahead of your appointment with us if you still need to request it.
- If you're not able to get a disc or link before your visit, bring the facility's name and the date of your imaging so we can help track it down.

In-Office X-Rays

- If X-rays are taken during your visit with us, you can request a copy of your images and the report for your own records.

Requesting a Copy of Your Medical Records

- To request a copy of your records from our office — visit summaries, imaging, or other documentation — call us at (503) 717-7060.
- By law, most records requests require a signed authorization form before we can release your information, even to you.
- Processing times can vary, so please allow some time for your request to be completed — we'll let you know once it's ready.

Sending Your Records to Another Provider

- If you're seeing another physician and need your records sent directly to them, let us know — we're happy to help coordinate a transfer of care or a second opinion.
